Mount Laurel From of Government Q&A

WHAT FORM OF GOVERNMENT OPERATES IN MOUNT LAUREL?

The Township of Mount Laurel operates under a Council/Manager Plan E of Chapter 210 of New Jersey Laws of 1950. The Township Council consists of 5 members elected at large with staggered terms.

WHY IS THERE A MAYOR CHANGE EVERY YEAR?

The Council appoints one of its members to serve as Mayor for a term of one year. They also appoint a Deputy Mayor to serve in the absence of the Mayor. The day-to-day operation of the Township is handled by a full time Township Manager, who is the chief executive and administrative officer appointed by the Township Council.

On Monday, January 2, 2023 Assemblywoman Carol Murphy administered the oath of office to Mount Laurel Mayor Stephen Steglik, who served as the Deputy Mayor in the 2022 calendar year.

Mayor of Prospect Park Mohamed T. Khairullah administered the oath of office to Mount Laurel Deputy Mayor Fozia Janjua.

Mount Laurel's 2nd Annual Tree Lighting

Mount Laurel Township and the Rancocas Woods Business Association partnered this past holiday season to throw the 2nd Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony. Residents and families gathered on December 2 to celebrate the holidays with rides, food, hot chocolate and music.

Tax Assessor Updates

TOTALLY DISABLED VETERANS (100% PERMANENT AND TOTAL)

If you are a 100% permanently and totally disabled veteran (or their surviving spouse), and have a 100% rating issued by the office of Veteran's Affairs, you may be eligible for property tax exemption. The basic requirements are honorable discharge, a 100% permanent and total disability rating certification from the VA and primary residence in the property applied for. Along with the application form, applicants must supply a copy of the DDForm214 or discharge papers, a deed to the property showing applicant as owner, proof of residency in the home, and a copy of a current NJ Driver's License. The application is available on line at the Mount Laurel Township web site or contact Dennis DeKlerk, Assessor at ddeklerk@mountlaurel.com or 856-234-0001 x1256 or x1257.

VETERAN TAX DEDUCTION

Veterans can apply for a yearly tax deduction of \$250.00. To qualify you must be a NJ resident, be on the deed as an owner of the property, have an honorable discharge and be able to provide a DDForm214 or discharge papers. Applications are available on the Mount Laurel Township web site or you can contact the Assessor's Office.

SENIOR CITIZEN OR DISABLED PERSON TAX DEDUCTION

Any resident property owner who qualifies can receive an annual deduction from their property taxes if you are a Senior Citizen (65 or over) or Disabled Person. For approved applicants a \$250.00 per year deduction is applied to the property tax bill. NJ State guidelines limit household income to qualify. Social Security or government pensions can be excluded, but any income outside of that is capped at \$10,000.00 per year. Applications are available on the Township website or the Township Assessor's Office.



Tax Collector Updates

Resident homeowners who are currently receiving a \$250 deduction for Senior Citizen, Disabled Person, or Surviving Spouse will be receiving the Annual Post-Tax Year Income Statement along with the Supplemental Income Form in the mail. These forms will reflect your 2022 income information. Please remember to return both forms completed and signed to the Tax Collectors' office no later than March 1, 2023. Please be advised that failure to return the completed forms by the deadline will result in you being disallowed the deduction of \$250 that you have already received for the 2022 tax year.

- Please note the 2023 1st Quarter property taxes are due on February 1, 2023. All tax payments received after Friday, February 10, 2023 will accrue interest back to February 1, 2023
- The Township offers an ACH Direct Debit program for property taxes. If you are interested in participating, please check the Township website at www.mountlaurel. com/department/tax_collector_s_office/index.php for more information and the application.



Snow Removal

Our Public Works Department and contractors work hard to make driving safer and easier in snowy weather. The type of snow storm we receive affects the type of snow clearing operation that takes place and with heavy amounts of snow fall, the Township and contractors may plow your street several times. As snow rolls off the plows, it sometimes accumulates in driveway aprons. Please understand that this is unavoidable and it is the homeowner's responsibility to clear it. Here are some helpful tips to make the snow removal process easier for residents and the Township:

Please remove the following items from the street in front of your home:

- Trash/recyclable containers. Place on the grassy planter strip between curb and sidewalk where possible.
- Portable basketball systems, hockey nets, or any other movable sporting equipment.
- Do not park cars on the street during the storm and at least for 12 hours after the storm. This speeds the removal process, prevents cars from being plowed in, and allows us to clear the entire street curb to curb.
- Please don't shovel or blow snow back on the street. If we already completed plowing this will create a hazard for residents

Reporting Street Outages

Public Works would like to remind residents how to report power outages and street lights.

To report an outage by phone call 1-800-436-PSEG (7734) or text "OUT" to 4PSEG (47734) - Register your phone first by texting "REG" to 4PSEG.

To report a gas leak, downed wires, or other hazardous condition, LEAVE the area and get to a safe location. Then call PSE&G at 1-800-436-PSEG (7734) or call the Emergency Line at 1-800-880-PSEG (7734).

Place with regular trash. Mattresses must be wrapped in plastic. 2 items per household





Chief of Police Judy Lynn Schiavone began her career in law enforcement at the Mount Laurel Police Department. She grew up in Lyndhurst, NJ and attended Montclair State University, where she graduated with a Bachelors in Sociology. She moved to Mount Laurel when she was hired by the Mount Laurel Police Department in 1999. Deputy Chief Schiavone was promoted to Deputy Chief of Police on September 11, 2017.



A Message From Chief of Police Schiavone

I am extremely proud to be appointed to the position of Chief of Police. I consider myself extremely fortunate to lead such a great police department. As a female leader, I feel this should be a moment for other women that are considering a career in law enforcement to recognize that anything is possible if you remain dedicated and committed to the profession.

It was not always easy. I had many moments over the years that I would find myself being challenged by a coworker about an issue based solely on the fact that I was female.

I did not let those moments distract me. I continued to focus on my goal of moving up through the ranks. I tried to be proactive in order to gain job knowledge and learned from other senior officers that I trusted. Once I identified those individuals, I did all I could to learn from them. Being sworn in as the first female chief of the department is humbling as well as exciting. I was hired in 1999 and at that time, there were almost no other female police officers. Now there are females working in almost every agency. I hope to see this trend continue.

It is important to me as I look back on my career to see these changes. I hope I can be a mentor to other female officers and leaders.

I look forward to working with all of the men and women of this agency to make our department one of the leading agencies in South Jersey.



Fall Hazards in the Home

- 4. Improve the lighting inside and outside your home
- 5. Use non-slip mats
- 6. Be aware of uneven surfaces
- 7. Stairways should be well lit
- 8. Wear sturdy, well-fitting shoes
- 9. Install grab bars in bathrooms
- 10. Have your medications reviewed
- 11. Have your eyes checked

Today's Fires Modern Fire Dynamics

UL Fire Safety Research Institute (FSRI) has studied today's fires and the dangers associated with rapid fire, heat, and smoke generation. "The fire service responds to a fire every 23 seconds in the U.S. and the number of home fire deaths is going up," said Steve Kerber, vice president and executive director of FSRI. "In just three minutes or less, a room could be more than 1,000 degrees Fahrenheit and filled with deadly levels of toxic gas from the smoke. Knowing your escape route and having multiple routes for escape can mean the difference between life and death."

Fire is getting faster. Because of synthetic materials, furniture, and construction, fire spreads faster than ever before. Having smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in your home is vitally important. Furthermore, closing bedroom doors while sleeping helps stop the spread of smoke and fire. Forty years ago, you had seventeen minutes to escape a fire whereas today you have only three minutes. For these reasons, we recommend that you sleep with your bedroom doors closed.

EMS Standard of Coverage

Mount Laurel Emergency Medical Services (MLEMS) is a licensed EMS provider through the New Jersey Office of Emergency Medical Services. State statutes determine Basic Life Support (BLS) Ambulance provider requirements and further defines the scope of practice for emergency medical technicians. Advance Life Support (ALS) in New Jersey is hospital based and in Mount Laurel Township is provided by Virtua Hospital. Out of the approximate 6,300 calls for service in 2021 with transports to area hospitals, roughly 36% were BLS treats and 17% ALS treats. The balance of incidents were treats only or events where MLEMS services were canceled. Most transports are to the closest hospital, which are either Virtua Mt. Holly and/or Virtua Marlton.

MLEMS staffs two primary ambulances 24/7, which are located out of Station 369, at 201 Masonville Road and Station 368, at 1051 South Church Street. Additionally, a third ambulance is staffed between the hours of 9 am and 7 pm, Monday through Friday, to assist in increases of call volume. This ambulance currently is located out of Station 367, at 3824 Church Road. This is the Church Road firehouse. It is our goal to provide quality EMS to our community.

To this end, we monitor call volume vs. resource requirements to maintain adequate EMS units to meet demands placed on our system. We continually assess those units' hour utilization compared to industry standards. While this is the most cost responsible model, there are times when a surge of calls prevents MLEMS resources from handling all calls. This happens when our units are on previous calls or the number of calls exceeds available units. In these instances, MLEMS has mutual aid agreements with surrounding communities which allows for sharing of EMS resources to assist when units may not be available to respond.



Lithium Ion Battery Safety (NFPA)



Lithium ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices, including smart phones, laptops, scooters, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. Take care when using them. In rare cases, they can cause a fire or explosion.

THE PROBLEM

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

SAFETY TIPS

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Keep batteries at room temperature.
- Do not place batteries in direct sunlight or keep them in hot vehicles.
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

SIGNS OF A PROBLEM

Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call 9-1-1.

BATTERY DISPOSAL

- Do not put lithium ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.
