150th Anniversary Celebration • May 15, 2022

On March 7, 1872 Mount Laurel Township was officially incorporated by an act of the New Jersey State Assembly and Senate to create the borders residents know today. Mount Laurel has grown from a small, rural farming community to an area filled with small businesses, outstanding school districts, and plenty of amenities perfect for raising a family.

Mount Laurel is rich with history, with a spot along the Underground Railroad at Jacob's Chapel AME Church, antebellum African American settlements marked by the Colemantown Meeting House, as well as being the birthplace of women's rights activist Alice Paul. Mount Laurel has grown since then, increasing in population, diversity, and regional significance.

The Township's 150th Anniversary celebration on Sunday May 15 was a fun filled day for residents and visitors to enjoy the history of the town, meet Township departments, support local businesses and food trucks, and celebrate the accomplishments of outstanding Mount Laurel residents.




Tax Collector Updates

TAX BILLS COMING SOON!

Property Taxes are billed once a year. The 2022 Final / 2023 Preliminary bills are scheduled to be mailed around July/ August of 2022. However, bills cannot be mailed out until the new 2023 tax rate is struck. If bills are mailed late the new date will be printed on the 2022 3rd quarter stub, which will be 25 days from the date the bill was mailed.

If you receive an "Advice Only" tax bill, but do not have a mortgage company, please notify the tax office. You can use this bill to pay your taxes.



DIRECT DEBIT PROGRAM

The Township offers an ACH Direct Debit program for property taxes. If you are interested in participating, please check our Township website, www.mountlaurel.com, for more information including the application.

SENIOR FREEZE APPLICATIONS

For those residents who are currently enrolled in the "Senior Freeze" Property Tax Reimbursement program and have received your booklet in the mail, you may stop by our office during business hours to have your application completed. They are due to be returned to the State of New Jersey no later than October 31, 2022. Tax Assessor Updates

TOTALLY DISABLED VETERANS (100% PERMANENT AND TOTAL)

If you are a 100% permanently and totally disabled veteran (or their surviving spouse), and have a 100% rating issued by the office of Veteran's Affairs, you may be eligible for property tax exemption. The basic requirements are honorable discharge, a 100% permanent and total disability rating certification from the VA and primary residence in the property applied for. Along with the application form, applicants must supply a copy of the DDForm214 or discharge papers, a deed to the property showing applicant as owner, proof of residency in the home, and a copy of a current NJ Driver's License. The application is available on line at the Mount Laurel Township web site or contact Dennis DeKlerk, Assessor at ddeklerk@mountlaurel.com or 856-234-0001 x1256 or x1257.

VETERAN TAX DEDUCTION

Veterans can apply for a yearly tax deduction of \$250.00. To qualify you must be a NJ resident, be on the deed as an owner of the property, have an honorable discharge and be able to provide a DDForm214 or discharge papers. Applications are available on the Mount Laurel Township web site or you can contact the Assessor's Office at ddeklerk@ mountlaurel.com 856-234-0001 x1256 or x1257.

SENIOR CITIZEN OR DISABLED PERSON TAX DEDUCTION

Any resident property owner who qualifies can receive an annual deduction from their property taxes if you are a Senior Citizen (65 or over) or Disabled Person. For approved applicants a \$250.00 per year deduction is applied to the property tax bill. NJ State guidelines limit household income to qualify. Social Security or government pensions can be excluded, but any income outside of that is capped at \$10,000.00 per year. TAX ASSESSMENTS AND IMPROVEMENTS

If you have a construction permit for a new home, or improvement to your existing home, the Tax Assessor's Office is required to inspect the work to determine whether or not an added assessment is in order. Each new home, or completed improvement that is taxable is added to the township tax system by an added assessment. Added assessments are issued in October and are retroactive to the date of completion. Tax bills for that period are issued in October as well. Prior to billing, the Assessor's Office will send an Added Assessment notice informing you of the additional property value, description of work, number of months and estimated supplemental tax. Added assessment inspections commence February and continue through September. The inspector will speak to you at the time of inspection or leave a contact number to verify the work.

Public Works Department Updates

Prevent trip and falls by inspecting sidewalks on your property.

Become proactive instead of reactive in preventing trips and falls. Regular periodic inspections of sidewalks should be conducted, and any substandard conditions corrected as soon as possible. When doing an inspection, consider the following items.

- Large cracks
- Raised sidewalk block
- Deteriorated sidewalk blocks
- Sidewalks that accumulate dirt/mud/gravel
- Tree roots/overgrown landscaping

HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP-OFF:

The Township holds a hazardous material drop-off on the first and third Saturday of every month (unless a holiday weekend at which it will move to the following weekend).

Drop-off is at the Recycling Center on Midlantic Drive. Hours of operation for the drop-off are 8:00 am to 12:00 pm.

Residents are required to show proof of residency at the drop-off.

Allowable items: Paint(latex and oil based 10 cans per resident), solvents, driveway sealers, aerosols, antifreeze, oil, batteries, fluorescent tubes and ballasts, pesticides, pool chemicals and gasoline (which should be brought in a clearly marked container).

*Paint that is dried out can go out with your regular trash.

*Oil must be dropped off in standard oil containers only. It will not be taken in buckets or other chemical containers.

The Future of Paws Farm

Volunteers for Paws Farm, Inc., a not-for-profit organization founded by Dr. Charles and Kate Tweedy, the original founders of Paws Farm, and an enthusiastic Board of Directors, which includes the next generation of other original founders, have worked tirelessly over the last year preparing Paws Farm for a re-opening to the public.

When Discovery Museum defaulted on its operating agreement with the Township, PAWS closed in January 2020. Two months later Covid-19 began to spread across the United States creating shutdowns and making it difficult for any organization to step in and become the new operator of the Township's hidden gem.

After several unsuccessful proposal rounds, Volunteers came to the Township and asked for a lease to gain access to the property for maintenance and repairs of the site and to prep the facility for a new operator. The Township granted that request and the Volunteers did not disappoint. The organization poured more than a quarter million dollars into the facility cleaning, repairing and restoring the property. The site is ready for a new era of operation thanks to these volunteer efforts. The historic Darnell homestead and out buildings and the dairy barn are cleaned and prepared for visitors. The fields, stalls, pens and cages are ready to reintroduce animals.

In May, with the facility physically ready, the Township entered into a new lease with Volunteers. This Second Phase of re-opening will allow the Volunteers to open on a limited basis for special events and fundraisers to generate the needed financial capital to operate the facility. The new lease will also allow the Volunteers and the Township time to attract and retain a corporate partner committed to the long-term operation of the facility.

Take advantage of the special event days at Paws. If you cannot make the special event days, consider helping the future of Paws through a financial donation to the not-for-profit organization. Donate at www.pawsfarm. org. When Paws Farm closed in 2020, there was a public support to save Paws Farm. The Volunteers, working in conjunction with Township officials, have returned the property to a condition that will allow for the re-opening of Paws. They now need the help of individuals and business to financially support Paws to reach Phase 3 to allow for full reopening. Please consider supporting this organization to bring Paws back to life.




The Mount Laurel Police Department and Mount Laurel Township are excited to hold National Night Out!


NEW AMBULANCE

Town Council continues to invest in emergency services with the recent acquisition of a new ambulance in April of 2022. The median age of our fleet of ambulances is 6 years old, which provides reliable equipment to better serve our community.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Did you know that Mount Laurel EMS responds to over 6,000 calls annually and that the top three types of responses are medical emergencies, falls, & accidents. Falls are the second highest call type and account for over 800 incidents in 2021. There are a number of things that you can do to safeguard your home to prevent falls. We have developed a fall prevention program that we will be rolling out to residential communities where we see the highest concentration of falls. EMS EDUCATION

The Mount Laurel EMS Training Division had 8 people graduate from their initial EMT course. These individuals attended over 200 hours of in-person lectures and skills to prepare them to take the National Registry EMT Exam to become NJ State certified EMTs. Mount Laurel EMS conducts an initial EMT course annually and is one of the top-rated EMS Training Centers in the state.



Mount Laurel Fire Department Update:

PROMOTIONS

In June 2022, Christopher Burnett was officially sworn in as the fourth career fire chief in the department's history. Chief Burnett has been the acting chief since May 2021 and has been serving the department since 1991. C. Mark Vanselous was also promoted from lieutenant to captain and has been assigned to the department's training division. Captain Vanselous has been serving the department since 1998. We wish both members well in their new positions.



NEW EVS

The department acquired three new electric vehicles to serve in a non-emergency support services role used by our fire prevention bureau while conducting life safety inspections. We were able to apply for grants that will result in a lower cost of operation. The electric vehicles operate at zero emissions. Our fire prevention bureau conducts over 6,000 inspection tasks annually. We are always searching for innovative ways and opportunities to better serve our community.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Both the Mount Laurel Fire Department and Mount Laurel EMS were honored to take part in 'Operation Prom' at Lenape High School on June 2nd. The Medford Police Department, Medford Fire and EMS, and Lenape High School organized a demonstration showing some of the consequences of driving under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol for the seniors as they enter prom weekend. The message stressed was: Do Not Drink and Drive Under the Influence of Drugs and/or Alcohol! Call a Ride to Arrive Alive!



FIRE SAFETY - OUTDOOR FIRES

With summer upon us, many residents choose to have different types of outdoor fires for warmth, cooking, or other uses. Please see the rules governing outdoor fires from the township's fire prevention ordinance below. For further information on outdoor fires, you can reference Chapter 81 Fire Prevention of the Township Code [https://ecode360. com/10362507] or call our fire prevention bureau.

- 1. Fuel for outdoor fires shall be limited to seasoned firewood, natural gas or propane.
- 2. Fire pits shall not exceed three feet in diameter and two feet in height total fuel area.
 - (a) Fire pits shall not be located within 25 feet of a structure, combustible materials, combustible vegetation and/or property lines.
- 3. Fire in approved containers are defined as chimineas and/or other commercially manufactured containers designed and built for its specific use for seasoned firewood, natural gas, or propane.
 - (a) Approved containers shall not be located within 15 feet of a structure, combustible materials, combustible vegetation and property lines.
 - (b) Approved containers shall not be located in or on any residential/apartment unit; porch, balcony, covered patio area or any other private area of an apartment or multifamily dwelling unit.


