Tax Collector Updates

4TH QUARTER PROPERTY TAXES DUE

Please note that all 4th quarter property tax payments are due Tuesday, November 1, 2022. The statutory grace period is Thursday, November 10, 2022. All payments received after November 10 will accrue interest back to November 1.

SENIOR FREEZE BLUE BOOKLETS- PTR FORMS

If you are currently enrolled in the New Jersey Senior Freeze (Property Tax Reimbursement) Program, the last day to file your application is October 31, 2022. We will be completing the booklets in the Mount Laurel Community Center on Wednesday, October 19 from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. Tax Assessor Updates

TOTALLY DISABLED VETERANS (100% PERMANENT AND TOTAL)

If you are a 100% permanently and totally disabled veteran (or their surviving spouse), and have a 100% rating issued by the office of Veteran's Affairs, you may be eligible for property tax exemption. The basic requirements are honorable discharge, a 100% permanent and total disability rating certification from the VA and primary residence in the property applied for. Along with the application form, applicants must supply a copy of the DDForm214 or discharge papers, a deed to the property showing applicant as owner, proof of residency in the home, and a copy of a current NJ Driver's License. The application is available on line at the Mount Laurel Township web site or contact Dennis DeKlerk, Assessor at ddeklerk@mountlaurel.com or 856-234-0001 x1256 or x1257.

VETERAN TAX DEDUCTION

Veterans can apply for a yearly tax deduction of \$250.00. To qualify you must be a NJ resident, be on the deed as an owner of the property, have an honorable discharge and be able to provide a DDForm214 or discharge papers. Applications are available on the Mount Laurel Township web site or you can contact the Assessor's Office.

SENIOR CITIZEN OR DISABLED PERSON TAX DEDUCTION

Any resident property owner who qualifies can receive an annual deduction from their property taxes if you are a Senior Citizen (65 or over) or Disabled Person. For approved applicants a \$250.00 per year deduction is applied to the property tax bill. NJ State guidelines limit household income to qualify. Social Security or government pensions can be excluded, but any income outside of that is capped at \$10,000.00 per year. Applications are available on the Township website or the Township Assessor's Office.

Early, in-person voting is coming to New Jersey for the November 8 General Election. In-person, early voting will begin October 29, 2022 – November 6, 2022. Early voting polls will be open from 10AM – 8PM on weekdays and Saturdays and from 10AM – 6PM on Sundays.

Burlington County Voters will be able to cast their ballot in person on a voting machine at Rowan College at Burlington County Student Success Center, 1500 College Circle.

Vote by Mail: Vote-by-mail ballots sent through the mail must be postmarked by Election Day, and received by the county Board of Elections on or before the sixth day after the close of the polls.





Back 40

In a continuing effort to ensure open space is available for future generations, Mount Laurel Township council authorized the acquisition of the 46.9 acres known as the Back 40 at the April 4 Council meeting. This piece of land was picked for preservation because it completes an unbroken chain of open space properties that comprise roughly 385 acres. With development becoming an increasingly prevalent concern in New Jersey, Mayor Pritchett, Deputy Mayor Steglik, the Council and the Township were thrilled to have the opportunity to purchase this property for Mount Laurel residents.

"As a strong supporter of green space, I knew that we had to jump on the chance to purchase this property when the opportunity presented itself. With hard work from the Township Manager and Solicitor, Council was able to solidify an agreement to preserve this land for Mount Laurel residents. This property was the missing puzzle piece to connecting all this land the Township had been buying over the years, and to have this now settled is incredible for all of us."

Mount Laurel Emergency Medical Services (MLEMS) is a professional career and volunteer community service organization committed to providing high quality emergency pre-hospital, basic life support ambulance services, and related public educational programs to the residents and visitors of Mount Laurel Township. We continually re-evaluate the needs and expectations of our community and meet the challenges and demands of our ever-changing environment. We build trusting relationships with those we serve and serve with by consistently meeting and exceeding our patients' and community's needs and expectations.

This year is no different from previous years as demand continues to increase. MLEMS stands on the frontline ready to serve its community and residents. Regionally, EMS systems have become taxed, as calls for service continue to rise. This is not unique to Mount Laurel, but has become a trend nationwide. MLEMS is a combination EMS agency that utilizes career and volunteer personnel to fulfill our mission. We are continually looking to recruit new volunteer members and per diem personnel to establish an adequate workforce to staff the services upon which our community has come to expect and rely. Recruitment of personnel has become a continual challenge. Furthermore, we are undergoing a re-assessment to determine community needs and realistic goals towards quality improvement.

The Story Behind Charlie's Kitchen

Charlie's Kitchen is a tribute to the legacy of Charles and Marie Kritz's son Charlie Jr., a Mount Laurel Township volunteer firefighter who died in 1998 after a brave fight with cancer. Charlie Jr. was known for his work preparing holiday meals in his own kitchen for families in need.

After the 37-year-old's death, his parents, Charlie and Marie Kritz, both members of the Mount Laurel Fire Department/Fellowship Fire Company #2 and Mount Laurel EMS, continued this annual tradition, supported by Mount Laurel EMS, Burlington County Professional Fire Fighters IAFF Local 3091, and Mount Laurel Professional Fire Fighters IAFF Local 4408.

To carry on this tradition and in memory of Charlie, Marie, and Charlie, Jr., we continue to join efforts to provide assistance by collecting and donating non-perishable food and personal items, to families in Burlington County. Our Local has proudly supported this cause for the past

18 years and has collected over \$45,000 worth of food. We hope you will continue to assist us in this charitable endeavor.

Mount Laurel Fire Department Update:

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, OCTOBER 9-15, 2022

According to NFPA data, home — the place people feel safest from fire — is actually where they are at greatest risk, with three-quarters (74 percent) of all US fire deaths occurring in homes. When a home fire does occur, it's more likely to be serious; people are more likely to die in a home fire today than they were in 1980.

A contributing factor is that today's homes burn faster and hotter than they used to, minimizing the amount of time they have to escape safely. In a typical home fire, people may have as little as two minutes (or even less) to get out from the time the smoke alarms sounds.

Following are key messages behind this year's "Fire Won't Wait. Plan Your Escape" theme:

- Make sure your home escape plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily.
- Have an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.


