WHEREAS, wrestling has a long and rich history in sports, first appearing as an organized event in Ancient Greece during the 18th Olympiad in 708BCE.

WHEREAS, Isabella Prem has amassed 35 overall wins in her high school career so far, including a 15 – 4 record for the 2022-2023 season; and

WHEREAS, Isabella has qualified for States two times, placed at Regionals two times, and was the South Jersey Regional Champ this year. Isabella also was the Cherokee Tournament Champion, was the runner-up at the Gloucester City Invitational this year, and was named to the All-South Jersey Girls' Wrestling team in 2022 and 2023; and

WHEREAS, Isabella has shown leadership and drive, having been the captain of the girls wrestling team at Lenape for 2 years, and is striving to be a role model for all girls that are interested in wrestling by proving that excellence in wrestling is not just for boys; and

WHEREAS, Isabella exemplified her drive and excellence by winning all three of her matches at Regionals on February 19th, 2023 by pin, taking 1st place in the 145 pound weight bracket, and becoming the first female to become a Regional Champion in Lenape School District history;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor, Township Council and Township Manager of the Township of Mount Laurel, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey do hereby recognize and congratulate Isabella Prem on making Lenape High School history and becoming the first female wrestler to win a regional championship.

WHEREAS, some of the service projects included putting together candy bags, lunch bags, and utensil bags; making sandwiches, no-sew pillows, and paper tulips; and writing cards and valentines. Along with this, numerous other projects were completed at Martin Luther King Day of Tikkun Olam, allowing the Sisterhood to donate over 2,000 items to various charities.

PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING APRIL HOLIDAYS

WHEREAS, Mount Laurel's diverse community celebrates a number of different holidays in the month of April; and

WHEREAS, Passover commemorates the story of the Israelites' escape from slavery and departure from ancient Egypt, and how the power of faith can serve as a guiding force to overcome times of great hardship. A feast held on the first night of Passover, called the Seder, marks the beginning of the holiday. At the Seder, foods of symbolic significance are eaten, prayers and traditional recitations are performed; and

WHEREAS, Easter is a Christian holiday that celebrates the belief in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The week leading up to Easter is called The Holy Week and includes Palm Sunday (the day Jesus entered Jerusalem and was celebrated), Maundy Thursday (the "Last Supper" where Jesus met with his disciples to observe Passover), and Good Friday (commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus and his death at Calvary.) Many Christians worldwide celebrate Easter with special church services, spending time with family and enjoying large feasts together; and

WHEREAS, Vaisakhi is an ancient Sikh harvest festival marking the beginning of a New Year and new harvest season. It is one of the most significant holidays in the Sikh calendar, as it marks the birth of the Sikh faith. The festival is also celebrated in Hinduism, as it commemorates the start of the Solar New Year. Vaisakhi is fundamentally about celebration, remembrance, community, and progress. On Vaisakhi, many Sikhs go to the temple (Gurdwara) to pray and religious services are held. Sikhs wear colorful traditional Indian clothes and take part in parades through the streets. There is singing, dancing and chanting of hymns; and

WHEREAS, Mount Laurel Township joins with our diverse communities in celebrating Passover, Easter, and Vaisakhi this year;




