Those Pipes

► City Storm Drainage  
Undergoing Assessment

An assessment project involving the mapping, inspection, and cleaning of the city's storm drainage pipes is underway, and you may notice workers in your neighborhood.

City Council approved a \$1.026 million contract with IMEG Consultants Corp. last November, with the project expected to be completed in the fourth quarter of this year.

Given that 80% of the city's nearly 23 miles of storm drainage piping and

associated structures are around 50 years old, this condition assessment is essential for developing a prioritization schedule for replacement, repair, and maintenance.

The contractor uses robotic cameras to inspect the drainage system, enabling them to identify cracks and damages in the infrastructure.

They are also utilizing cleaning trucks to address minor issues and remove debris from the system.

## DOWN THE HOME STRETCH



Each day brings more anticipation for the opening of the new City Hall.

With the installation of the HVAC system, the main architectural piece left is the solar array on the southern canopy. Crews are busy installing doors, glass, carpeting, tile, and the exterior zinc panels on the outside of the building.

Also, by the time you read this, the new main lobby sculpture by artist Jody Bliss should be in place.

Construction crews will work on a final list of punch items this month. The facility is set to open in late summer/early fall.

This 32,600-square-foot facility will be Net Zero, meaning it will generate as

much energy as it uses. It will also have a CORE Green Building Rating – the first municipal building in Colorado with that certification. This signifies its high level of sustainability. The \$33.8M facility is being funded completely through reserves.

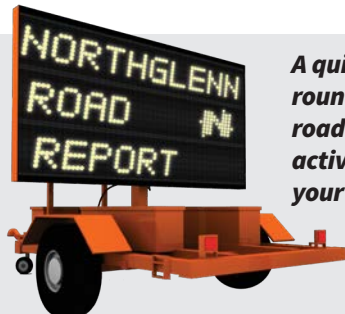
## NORTH METRO FIRE, ADAMS COUNTY FIRE NO LONGER PURSUING MERGER

After months of discussion and analysis, the boards of directors for North Metro Fire Rescue District and Adams County Fire Protection District decided to end the evaluation process and forego a merger of the two fire districts.

As part of the announcement, Board Presidents Richard Miller (*North Metro Fire*) and Ken Lombardi (*Adams County Fire Rescue*) stated, "It's important to note that

Adams County Fire Rescue and North Metro Fire have a strong history of working together, and this evaluation process further strengthened our relationship and mutual respect for one another. Looking ahead, we will continue to operate and train together with a shared mission to deliver the best in emergency care to the community."

**A quick roundup of roadwork activities in your city.**

- **East 120th Avenue west of Sylvia Drive:** About one mile of road will be repaved in both directions. Work will occur at night to

minimize traffic impacts, but expect delays and lane closures. Construction is scheduled to start in mid-July and be finished by early August.

- **Northwest Open Space Parking Lot:** Once the work on East 120th Avenue is complete (see above), work will begin on this project. The road connecting the parking lots south of the softball fields will be paved, along with some concrete work. This should be done by the end of August.

The weather may be warming up, but don't get burned by fireworks! Setting off fireworks is illegal in the city, and if caught, comes with a mandatory minimum fine of \$1,000 for private firework use.
