

What is Micro-Trash?

Micro-trash is anything from cigarette butts and gum wrappers to single-use plastic water/soda bottles and caps, the edges of candy wrappers, tiny fruit labels, chunks of styrofoam, broken glass, and/or various other discarded pieces of packaging and related plastic.

TRASH THE TRASH

When picking up Micro-Trash, be sure to wear proper PPE. Use trash pickers, gloves and dispose of it in the proper disposal container. Be sure to wash your hands thoroughly afterwards.



CIGARETTE BUTTS HAMPER PLANT GROWTH

The researchers found that the presence of cigarette butts in the soil reduces the germination success and shoot length (the length of the stem) of clover by 27% and 28% respectively, while root biomass (root weight) reduced by 57%. For grass, germination success reduced by 10% and shoot length by 13%. Cigarettes are the #1 most polluted item on earth.

PLASTICS

It is estimated that there is more than 5.25 TRILLION pieces of plastic trash floating in the ocean, and that number has only grown since then. Over 100-million marine mammals die every year due to plastic debris in the ocean.

BALLOONS/CONFETTI

Balloons & confetti may look Insta-worthy for the moment, but what goes up must come down, and that micro-trash ends up in our lakes, other major waterways, and eventually the ocean where it's ingested by sea-life, birds, and all manner of wildlife.

WRAPPERS

Wrappers and labels are often discarded unintentionally. However, they can still do a lot of damage if they aren't promptly removed and properly discarded.

This tree is the most abundant in the eastern deciduous forest.




Fortune Teller


Instructions


1  With pictures face down, fold on both diagonal lines. Unfold.


4  Once again, fold all corners to the center.

2  Fold all four corners to the center.


5  Fold paper in half and unfold.
