

STREETS COMMITTEE MINUTES

APRIL 3, 2018

The Streets Committee meeting was held on April 3, 2018 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:10 p.m.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Issue 1 Funding

No update.

2. North Royalton Alternative Transportation Study

Mayor Stefanik said that we received another grant to fully fund the sidewalk on Bennett Road between North Akins and the Metroparks. He said that work on the sidewalk on State Road is now getting underway. He said that we will continue to apply for grants moving forward when we think they will score high enough to receive funding through NOACA.

3. Service Department Report

A copy of this report is attached to these minutes. Mr. Cinquepalmi said the joint repairs will be starting very soon so the Service Department is trying to stay ahead of them with the catch basin repairs so we don't tear up the roads. He said that they rebuilt 8 catch basins and completely tore out and rebuilt 4 basins for a total of 12 in St. Thomas Woods. He said that the contractor doing the joint repairs will start in St. Thomas Woods and then will move to the Planets. Mr. Cinquepalmi said that we have already started work on the catch basins in this area as well. He said that they will also stay ahead of the asphalt repairs and make sure they are all finished before the street striping begins.

4. 2016 Infrastructure Program

No update.

5. 2017 Infrastructure Program

Mr. Schmitzer said that he has been coordinating with Mr. Cinquepalmi on the street striping. He said that they noticed over the winter that the striping on Tilby Road has virtually vanished. The contractor has verified that they will be coming back in the next 1-2 weeks to restripe Tilby Road under the warranty. He said that they will also be looking at the berming. Specialized Construction was the contractor on this work and they also have a contract this year for South Akins so while they are out here working we will get them to address anything that needs to be repaired. Mrs. Hannan asked how long the warranty is for Tilby Road. Mr. Schmitzer said that every road program we do has a two year warranty from the day he accepts the final work.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Proposed Ordinance 18-38 – Simple Recycling

Handouts were provided for this item, copies of which are attached to these minutes. Mayor Stefanik said that several other communities are utilizing this program. There is no cost to the city and we will actually receive revenue of maybe \$15,000-\$20,000 per year based on receiving one penny per pound of what is

collected. He said that they are also going to place a receptacle inside our recycling and rubbish yard so that residents can drop off there as well. Pickups will be scheduled for the regular rubbish day. The company will be sending out information in May with orange bags. The bags can be filled up and placed on the tree lawn on the regular rubbish day and the company will drop off additional bags. Extra bags can be requested from the company directly as well. Bags will also be available at the Service Department and City Hall. The program will begin the first full week of June. Mayor Stefanik said that the recycling calendar will be sent out in mid-May and will include information on this program.

Mr. Antoskiewicz said that this is a great supplemental program to our recycling program and our effort to keep as much waste out of the landfills as possible. Mr. Kasaris also agreed with this being a great program but was concerned that Rumpke may pick them up in error. Mayor Stefanik said that this has already been discussed with Rumpke and the bags are bright orange and hard to mistake as regular rubbish. Mr. Petrusky asked what the company does with the items. Mayor Stefanik said that most of the items are distributed to local charities.

Moved by Mr. Antoskiewicz, seconded by Mrs. Hannan to **remove this item from committee and recommend approval to Council.** Roll Call: Yeas: 2. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**
