RESOLUTION NO. 20-75

A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS AND THE OHIO  
LEGISLATURE TO ENACT LEGISLATION THAT WILL PROHIBIT BOND RATING COMPANIES  
FROM DOWNGRADING THEIR RATINGS OF MUNICIPALITIES DUE TO CONDITIONS CAUSED BY  
COVID-19, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: COVID-19 is a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death and is caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which is a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily spread from person to person. The virus is spread between individuals who are in close contact with each other (within about six feet) through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes. It may be possible that individuals can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or eyes; and

WHEREAS: On January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of COVID-19 a public health emergency of international concern; and

WHEREAS: On January 31, 2020, Alex M. Azar II, Secretary of Health and Human Services, determined and declared that a public health emergency exists in the United States in relation to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS: On February 1, 2020, the Ohio Department of Health issued a statewide Health Alert Network to provide local health departments with updated guidance for COVID-19; and

WHEREAS: On March 9, 2020, Governor Mike DeWine signed an Executive Order declaring a State of Emergency for the entire State of Ohio in relation to COVID-19 pursuant to the Governor's authority vested in him by the Constitution, the laws of the State of Ohio and in accordance with Revised Code Section 5502.22; and

WHEREAS: On March 13, 2020, President Donald J. Trump declared a National Emergency, invoking the Stafford Act and allowing the Federal Emergency Management Agency to coordinate disaster response and aid state and local governments in addressing the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS: In the City of North Royalton and across Cuyahoga County there is a current threat of an acutely hazardous disease, illness, or health condition, specifically, COVID-19, that is believed to be caused by the appearance of a novel infectious agent; and

WHEREAS: In the City of North Royalton, this threat has already impacted the daily lives of the citizens of the City of North Royalton and the need for citizens and City of North Royalton employees to stay home from work and other public places should they be exposed to the virus substantially impairs the functioning of city government and its ability to protect the lives and property of the citizens of the City of North Royalton; and

WHEREAS: On March 23, 2020, Governor Mike DeWine and Ohio Department of Health Director Amy Acton, M.D. MPH, announced a "Stay at Home" order which was to be in effect from March 23, 2020 at 11:59p.m. until April 6, 2020 at 11:59p.m., but which has since been modified to extend until May 1, 2020 at 11:59p.m., unless the order is rescinded or modified once again; and

WHEREAS: Political subdivisions rely on the sale of bonds to finance important public capital projects, including those associated with roads, sewers, buildings and equipment; and

WHEREAS: Any bond-rating change dramatically impacts a local governments' ability to provide basic services to its residents; and

WHEREAS: Local governments should not be financially penalized for the negative economic impact that will occur as a result of the unforeseen coronavirus.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON,  
COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The City of North Royalton and other Ohio municipalities will be unnecessarily burdened by any downgrades to its bond rating due to the unforeseen circumstances surrounding COVID-19.



ORDINANCE NO. 20-76

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT A GRANT FROM THE NORTHEAST OHIO AREAWIDE COORDINATING AGENCY’S TRANSPORTATION FOR LIVABLE COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE (TLCI) IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000.00, WHICH APPROVED FUNDING FOR STATE ROAD SIDEWALKS (FROM MEMORIAL PARK TO AKINS RD.), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The City of North Royalton has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$100,000.00 from the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency’s Transportation for Livable Communities Initiative (TLCI) Implementation Program; and

WHEREAS: This grant award has been approved by the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency’s Transportation for Livable Communities Initiative (TLCI) Implementation Program to be applied towards the construction of State Road sidewalks (from Memorial Park to Akins Road); and

WHEREAS: Council desires to authorize the Mayor to accept the grant from the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency’s Transportation for Livable Communities Initiative (TLCI) Implementation Program for the construction of the sidewalks described.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to accept the grant award from the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency’s Transportation for Livable Communities Initiative (TLCI) Implementation Program in the amount of \$100,000.00 to construct sidewalks on State Road (Memorial Park to Akins Road) in accord with the terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein and subject to approval by the Director of Law.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to confirm and accept the grant from the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency in the amount of \$100,000.00 for the construction of sidewalks on State Road (Memorial Park to Akins Road) and to set in motion the process necessary to secure the actual construction thereof at the earliest date.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
