A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT THE DONATION OF A HISTORICAL  
MARKER IDENTIFYING THE CITY GREEN AS A LOCATION WORTHY OF IDENTIFICATION AS A  
HISTORICAL SITE

WHEREAS: North Royalton became a township in 1818 and soon thereafter established the “City Green” at the intersection of Ridge Road and Bennett Road as a public space used over two centuries for many different public purposes including for a town hall, a cemetery, gathering space; and

WHEREAS: The North Royalton Historical Society has applied for and successfully secured the approval of The Ohio History Connection to designate the City Green as worthy of identification as a historical site and a special marker to allow future generations to understand the value of the City Green as a historical site; and

WHEREAS: The North Royalton Historical Society desires to donate the marker to the city for placement on the green at a location determined by the Mayor to best display it to all visitors; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to accept with gratitude the donation of the Historical Society.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON,  
COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Council of the City of North Royalton hereby authorizes the Mayor to accept the donation of the Historical Marker for placement upon the City Green.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

THEREFORE, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of a majority of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
