APPROVAL OF MINUTES

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Police Dash & Body Cameras

Police Chief Bilinovich states the body and the dash cameras are still operational 24 hours a day on all patrol officers and so far, no problems with them.

Chief Chegan states unfortunately the numbers are going up. We are expecting more PPE in, I will be expecting the \$6,500.00 grant that we got from FEMA. We are still getting equipment for other departments through the County as well specifically wastewater. We cannot get it for certain areas like service. We are also working on the FEMA public assistance grant that takes care of all the other PPE that we are not putting towards the CARES Act to allow me to apply for the FEMA.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Police and Safety Report

Mr. Wos states just to give a little bit of background, I had some feedback over the past few weeks talking with members of the Safety Committee and some members of Council, where we would like to get an understanding of what goes on in North Royalton from a law enforcement perspective. I asked Chief Bilinovich if he had any type of ready-made reports, he can share with us.

See attached call volume, accident and 2020 Deer Hunting reports from Police Chief Bilinovich.

Police Chief Bilinovich states since the deer hunting started the 2020/2021 season, we issued 96 permits. Last year we issued 97.

2. Royal Valley Stop Signs

Ms. Barath states I have been approached by several residents and they have watched the speed increase on the main Royal Valley Drive, they have asked if there is any way we can consider making the Dublin Royal Valley area a four way stop or what process we would have to go through to do that.

Police Chief Bilinovich states I do not think so. The State of Ohio regulates when and how you can use stop signs. You cannot use them to regulate speed. A lot of communities like Parma used to have stop signs by Valley Forge High School and every side street. They were ordered to take them out because you cannot just put up a stop sign just to regulate speed. I will have the officers give it more special attention up there. I am pretty sure that the intersection that you are talking about is regulated the best we can regulate it.

Ms. Barath states we would have to submit with the State of Ohio to put in a four way stop if we wanted to?

Police Chief Bilinovich states there are different things you have to meet; a certain traffic level which that area is not going to meet, you have to meet a crash volume which that area is not going to meet also. We have very few traffic crashes in that development, we can look at it and we will check to see what other people have brought up. The State regulates how you can and why you can put up stop signs.

Mr. Weimer states is our speed sign trailer still not functional?

Police Chief Bilinovich states yes, it is still broken, and it will cost more to fix than to buy a new one.

Mr. Weimer states that would be my recommendation is to look into getting a new one or getting it repaired.

Police Chief Bilinovich states I will research the price of what one is.

1. Ready Notify

Chief Chegan states so everyone is aware, the 911 system, we are a part of the Southwest Emergency Dispatch Center, all landline 911 calls go directly to that center. We get the numbers from AT&T they have the database; those are directly put into the system at Southwest Dispatch. All cell phone 911 calls go to C Comps which is in Cleveland, if you are south, close to Medina County there is a possibility that cell phone 911 call will go to Medina County Sheriff. The technology exists for cell phone 911 calls to the local PSAP, Public Safety Answering Point, which is a dispatch center. Unfortunately, we have been trying to get that because if you look on your cell phone bill, there is a 911 fee, that goes to the main centers, that goes to the centers that answer those phone calls. Right now, all the money goes to C Comps. What we would like to do for public safety is to make sure that those calls go to the right center. If you 911 call from a home phone, that will go right to the center, there is no transfer.

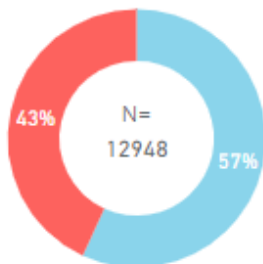

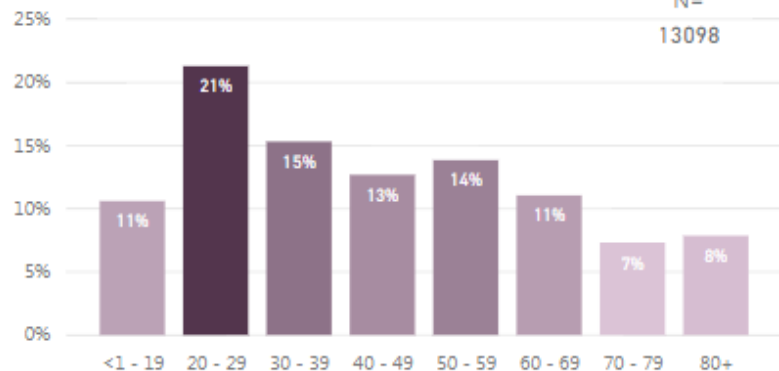

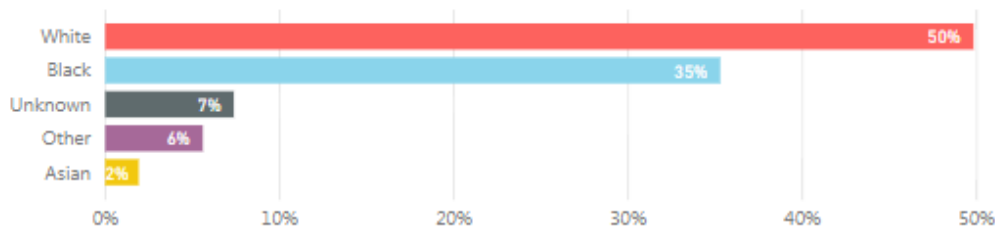

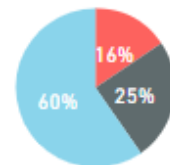

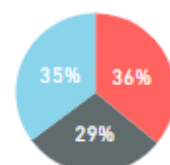

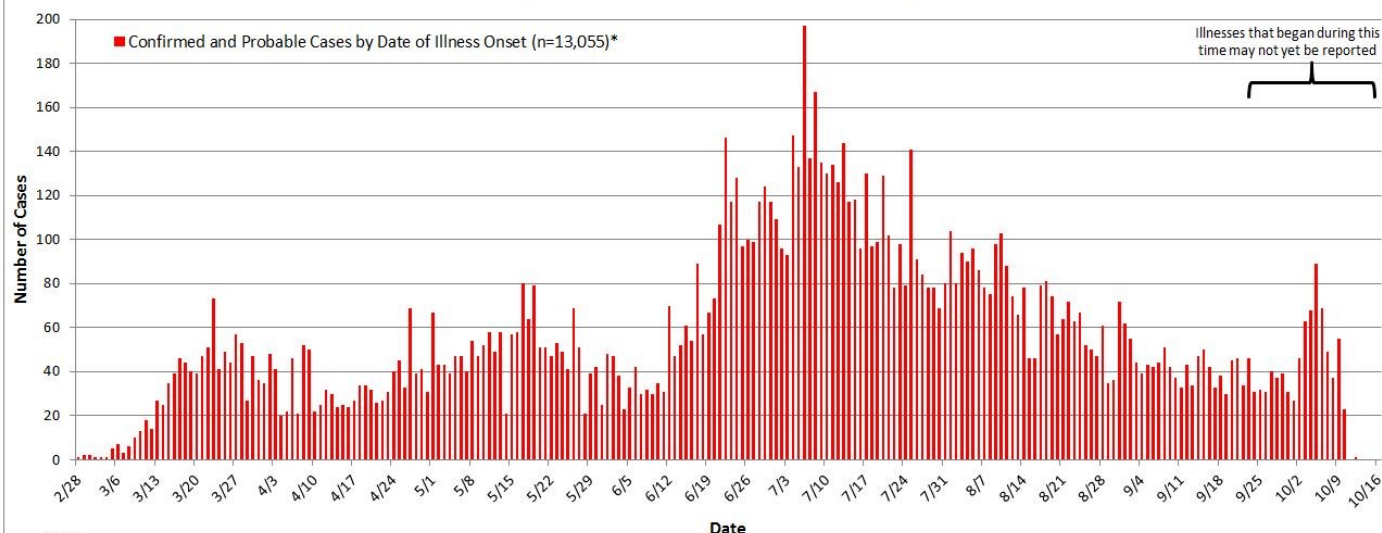

by Illness Onset Date as of October 15, 2020

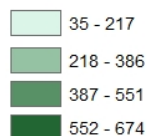

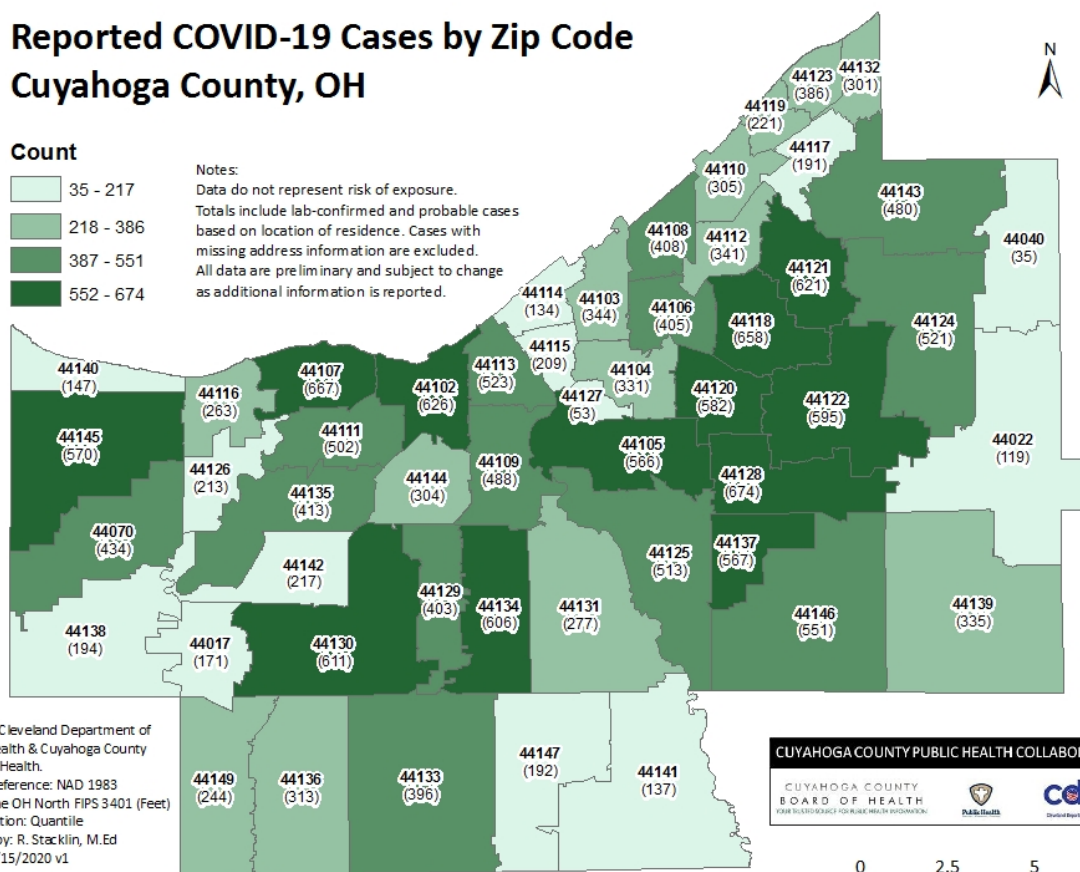
Map of COVID-19 cases in Cuyahoga County (including City of Cleveland) by ZIP Code

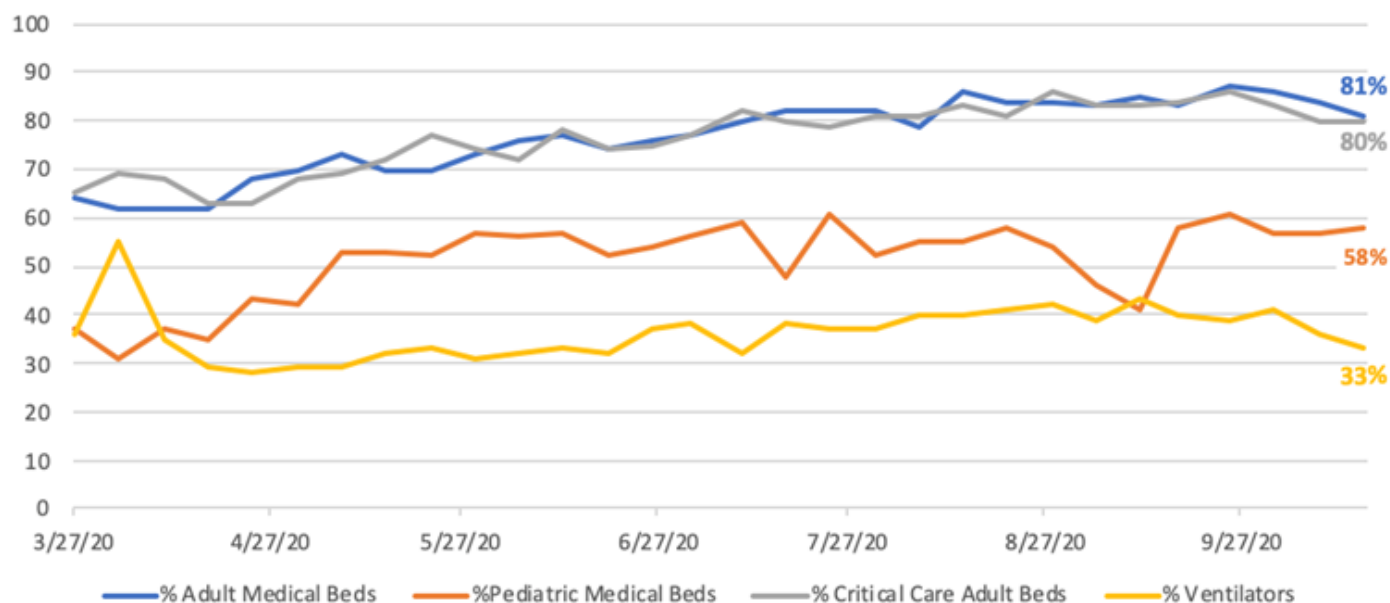

COVID-19 RT-PCR Testing in Cuyahoga County nursing homes via Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services

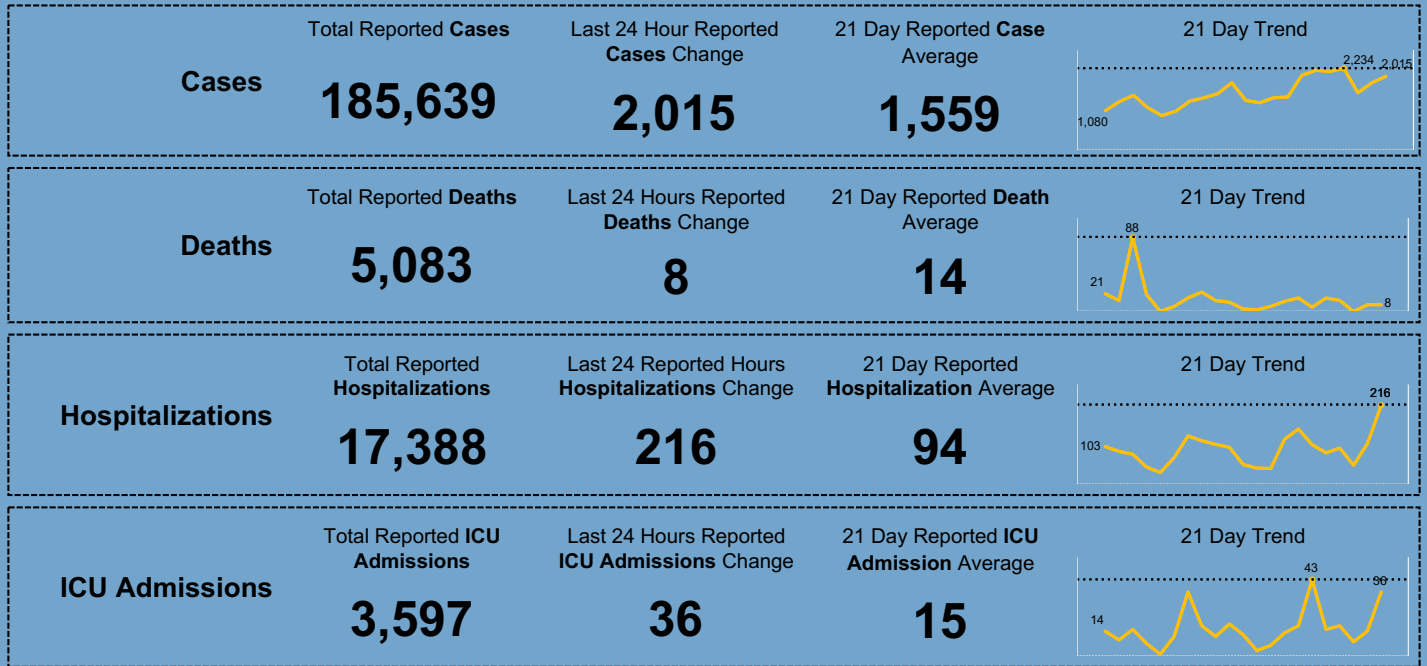

At-A-Glance

ReadyNotify

ReadyNotify is a mass notification system used to notify citizens, residents and businesses of emergency situations, non-emergency events and provide information about necessary actions.

What is ReadyNotify?

ReadyNotify is Cuyahoga County's mass notification system powered by CodeRED. It's used by the County and participating municipalities to issue emergency notifications to the public.

ReadyNotify is primarily used for emergency notifications when rapid and accurate information is essential for your immediate safety; however you may choose to be notified of general Cuyahoga County Government News as well.

What Type of Information is Required to Register?

Participation in the ReadyNotify Program is **voluntary**. A valid email and phone number will be needed to sign-up. During the registration process we will ask you to give us information about yourself such as your address, your primary language, and if you require any special assistance during an emergency event.
