MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Antoskiewicz stated Chief Bilinovich retired April 2, 2021. We are going through the process of giving the exam; 7 people took it, all passed. We are at the end of the 10-day protest period. We did have a tie with the scores and the tie is based on seniority; 1st position was by itself; 2nd position was a tie and only able to interview two people. The person that would have received the seniority sent a letter to the Mayor stating he has to regretfully withdraw; this automatically elevated the other person that finished 2nd. Mayor stated he will not be revealing names at this time until the list is certified by the Civil Service Commission. There is a Civil Service Commission meeting on Monday. Mayor stated he will officially report to Council after Monday those individuals are that will be interviewed.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS: Mr. Kelly stated there are two matters he wished to advise Council and the Mayor on.

The 1st is the lawsuit we were successful in the Court of Claims brought by Mr. Viola is still back in play. Mr. Viola has filed a Notice of Appeal and the Court of Appeals in the 8th Appellate District has given him until April 14, 2021 to meet certain procedural requirements which he failed to meet. We are in a holding pattern, waiting to see if he is going to meet those requirements and if so, we will likely be responding with the briefs to the Court of Appeals.

In the 2nd matter, Dan Langshaw's lawsuit against the City in the Court of Claims went to mediation. That mediation was unsuccessful and the Magistrate in mediation has referred the matter back to the judge and special magistrate to whom the matter was assigned; so that litigation goes on.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Michael McDonald, 14599 Bennett Road

Mr. McDonald stated he wished to discuss Ordinance No. 21-67. He stated that most of Council have spent a decent amount of time discussing the food truck issue. There are some good things in the legislation. Things that should be looked at are as follows: a grammatical error in the 2nd Whereas clause; you are missing the word "over" before the word "regulate", because what this legislation is doing is overregulating the food truck issue in a couple of areas. Specifically, requiring food trucks to go and have an inspection once a year, when any food truck in Cuyahoga County is required to do that. Now you are duplicating an effort. Yes, there is a nominal fee that comes to the city that pays for our Fire Department to have to inspect something that is already inspected by the County. Secondly, if you would have done a simple Google search of food truck legislation in Cuyahoga County, you would have found some examples of nearby cities and what they did. One is North Olmsted in 2014, it comes right up; it's pretty basic, allows a lot of opportunity for businesses to be businesses. One of the problems we have in North Royalton is we can't attract businesses and maybe there's a lack of effort, maybe not. A lot of businesses come here and they stay for a couple of years. They then decide to go to another city because it may be more convenient, more flow of traffic. Whatever the reasons are; this is something we need to fix as a city. The other matter is the way the legislation is written by substantially restricting the truck to be at many business locations within the city; the 200 feet restriction that there are a number of strip malls up and down Rte. 82, up and down State Road, up and down Ridge Road that are near or next to a residence. 200 feet is a pretty large area, that's two thirds of a football field and you are now discriminating against certain businesses and maybe awarding other businesses that don't have those restrictions. When buildings are built within 50 feet of a residential line, that seems to be more of an appropriate distance that should be considered in this legislation. Those are the main points that I wanted to make. You guys can make North Royalton a desirable place for businesses or you can hamper businesses from wanting to come here. There's also a 3rd item that as quite frankly as I read it; it's a loophole and that's the 4-hour limit. If I were a food truck owner and I wanted to operate for 8 hours, I would take my food truck after 3 ½ - 4 hours, drive it off the site and back to the site. There is no restriction on doing that.

Dan Langshaw, 5970 Wallings Road

Mr. Langshaw stated Mr. President if it's okay I would like to take off my face covering. Council President Marnecheck stated no.

Mr. Langshaw stated as a tax payer, supporter of small businesses and a community leader; I would like to share some concerns regarding Ordinance No. 21-67; the proposed mobile food unit Ordinance on the agenda for a possible vote tonight or next month. The issue of food trucks began in August 2019 with the Blue Monkey Brewing Company, bringing it to the attention of the Planning Commission that they would be having food trucks on the weekend. However, the Code didn't have anything at the time. Something I have done since then is surveyed residents, listen to business owners on this issue. The majority of this community do not view food trucks as a real problem or as a take away from our businesses; if anything, it helps draw more attention to our local businesses and maybe even bring in future new businesses as well. Especially given these times we are facing with COVID-19, outdoor eating is even more essential for businesses as well as a preference to customers. The way this Ordinance is currently written, it leans more towards anti-business approach which does not create a welcoming business environment that you claim with this legislation. Council should consider making the following amendments to avoid this (inaudible) Mr. McDonald has already said so. For example; having the Fire Department inspect these food trucks. Cuyahoga County Board of Health already inspects these. It costs these units \$240-\$306 (inaudible) per unit for these businesses. So, my suggestion is, the Fire Department already has enough on their hands to do, just have businesses provide proof of their license from the Board of Health which is valid anywhere in Ohio. Second, changes Mr. Mc Donald had indicated; the 200 feet limit of a residential property line; my thought is 75 feet. Because if you don't do that, Council will be effectively preventing businesses like Mr. Mc Donald had mentioned, such as the Blue Monkey Brewing Company. If you measure it, it is at least 97 feet from the residential property line, which is the rear property line. So, they would not be able to do this. Third, remove the operational requirement that food trucks cannot operate longer than 4 hours. The concern Mr. Mc Donald had mentioned, what about Home Days, what about the Greek Festival, St. Albert's and other events. That is something that needs to be clarified. Fourth add an exemption for 5013c non profit organizations; churches, schools from this Ordinance because many of these good groups do this; charitable events throughout our community. Finally remove the criminal penalties in this Ordinance and replace it simply with civil penalties; so, like a \$100 fine per offense. No one should have to go to jail over this Ordinance, especially small businesses.

In closing, please consider these concerns before you take a vote.

Mike Cikraji, 4883 Princeton Drive

Mr. Cikraji stated he has lived in North Royalton for 7 years and has never been to a City Council meeting. It isn't because I don't love what you guys do, I really appreciate it. The thing is that I trust you, that's why I have never come. What I wanted to bring up; let's start off with Officer Lexi if you remember that story recently. I saw the video downtown and it made me very upset, not about you guys because I love you guys greatly; I think you do a wonderful job. But to me, it was kind of the last straw about what I think is a terrible thing about the County. I can go into depth about how there is corruption, how we have had a lot of scandals from Dimora and Russo to the jail corruption to the IT Administration. Something I just want to put out there as an idea, and you guys should laugh at me, it's ridiculous in a sense, but if you think about it rationally....

Mr. Marnecheck stated you want us to secede from Cuyahoga County.

Mr. Cikraji stated there are 2 things; we have been with Cuyahoga County for over 200 years and there's Thomas Payne who said time makes for converse than reason. We are so used to doing it, we want to do it forever. But what I really think you should look at, if we were to ever had to make a choice between something like Medina County and Cuyahoga County tomorrow, how would you vote? You guys are here talking about business interest and helping out business, how do the taxes go in Medina County, compared to Cuyahoga? How are the sales taxes compared to those two? If we were to go independent, without Medina County involved, how would that go? All I am saying is it would be an administrative nightmare; we have been tied up in their tentacles for over 200 years. But think about it, what would it be for us? Not to mention what we would have in property taxes too. Property taxes also pay for our schools, but really how much goes to the county that we don't use. I looked at the county web page and I called them (their departments) and asked them what do they do in our community for these things. They stated they don't have the resources to help out your community; it has to go somewhere else in the county. I'm sick of that and that makes me mad. You guys do a great job; there's a little drama sometimes but in general I love what you guys do. We are a small fish in a big pond, if we were to go over to Medina County, if they were to take us; we would be a big fish in a small pond. Where the resources go are where the people are.

Mr. Marnecheck asked Mr. Kelly how the 2 Ordinances regarding food trucks would be handled. Mr. Kelly stated I don't know, might be an implementation problem; you have adopted the legislation and the Mayor has yet to sign it. I presume he will sign it, although I do not know, I

don't presume anything. But in terms of the application of the fees, and while the fees are in the Ordinance, the fact that we don't have the approval of them to be in the fee schedule; I don't know if that necessarily blocks us from imposing those fees or collecting those fees. The fee schedule Ordinance is designed more or less to be represented depository or a place anyone looking at what the fees are, may look and find them.
