FINANCE COMMITTEE MINUTES JUNE 15, 2021

The Finance Committee meeting was held on June 15, 2021, at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 7:04 p.m.

Approval of April 20, 2021 and May 18, 2021 Finance Committee minutes. Moved by Mr. Marnecheck, seconded by Mr. Wos. Vote: Yeas: 3 Nays: 0 **Motion carried**.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Monthly Finance report including tax collections status

Mr. Dean reported that we ended the month of May with \$25.4m, which was a slight increase from April. He brought up previous discussions about income tax collections. What we received this month was from the tax deadline. Last meeting, Mr. Dean predicted \$1.85m, which is what was received in collections for the month. This puts us ahead by over \$1m from last year. He is cautious right now because our deadline was July 15th. We are at 55% of our total collections for the year. We are where we were two years ago, a more typical year; in comparison, which is good. Mr. Dean felt that we are in good shape pertaining to income taxes and that we will meet our estimates. The estimate is below what was received in 2019. But that had been a concern, with regard to how Covid was going to affect our finances. He believed that we are free and clear from that.

2. **Overtime**

Mr. Dean advised that overtime looks good, in which we are at \$280,000 for the year. 24% of our budget has been utilized and we have had 46% of the year completed, which is good.

3. Jail Task Force Update

Ms. Barath mentioned that a meeting was held and they were provided with another jail assessment report, which is in need of review. Mayor Antoskiewicz provided an update on his ongoing discussions with neighboring cities about a cost sharing program. Matthew Stuczynski submitted a proposal to the company called Coral Gable, who prepared a study for the City of Middleton that we reviewed. We are making efforts to try and obtain a cost back from them to make some assessments in our situation; with what direction to go with concerning the jail.

4. The Buckeye Institute, et al. v. Megan Kilgore, et al Franklin County Court of Common Pleas Case # 20CV-4301

Mr. Kelly advised that the Buckeye case in Franklin County is over at the trial court level. Two are still pending in two other counties, including Cuyahoga County to his understanding. However, he has had discussions with Mr. Dean about these matters and is prepared to speak to Council.

Mr. Dean mentioned that he does get updates from RITA about this legislation and how it would affect things. Currently, the House of Representatives and the Senate are working on the state's two-year budget. The fiscal year for the state is June 30th, therefore they have to pass the budget before then. The House passed the budget, which included the ability to not tax residents in cities that they are not working in. Mr. Marnecheck asked for

clarification, whereas he has worked from home for 14 months due to Covid, if he would then only pay taxes for North Royalton in this proposal. Mr. Kelly clarified yes, and that it is retroactive. Mr. Dean indicated it is only retroactive since the beginning of 2021. He had heard that the Senate may look back into March 2020; however, it was uncertain. Mr. Dean felt that we would have to wait and see what comes out of that legislation. He felt there could be potential tax issues with going back that far. He would make sure that residents are aware that they can obtain the withholding money back eventually.

Mr. Marnecheck asked whether this legislation would end the lawsuit. Mr. Kelly noted that it was impossible to know at this time. From his observations, the Senate is going to have some input and it would likely go to a conference. He concurred with Mr. Dean noting that we would have to wait and see the outcome. They have until June 30th, which is soon. Mayor Antoskiewicz felt that this lawsuit could potentially go away, however, others may also be filed from cities that are being affected. Mr. Kelly concurred.

Mr. Marnecheck wanted to confirm that we do not need to be doing anything further, other than continuing to monitor this. Mr. Kelly indicated that nothing more needed to be done. He recalled what Mr. Dean had said, whereas for the City, it is generally a break-even proposition; what we may not gain on one side, we may gain on the other. Mr. Kelly believed that it would be in the positive. Mr. Kelly concurred with the Mayor that most likely, the other side may step forward with their lawyers and try to overturn it. Mr. Marnecheck mentioned changing this to local income tax collection for the next agenda.

5. **RITA: Non-Filing Delinquency Program**

Mr. Dean recapped the last meeting, whereas we discussed the subpoena program. The information that he provided Council was part of the program, in which a letter program is implemented; identifying accounts that did not file. Initially, they send out the letters. The subpoena program comes later, in which the City must pay for it. The statistics on the letter program identified roughly 5000 delinquent accounts. Of those accounts, they collected \$114,000; which 983 of those accounts were closed, and 711 of the accounts were corrected. This helps clean up the accounts in general. The next part of the program would entail a more enforced action on the accounts that appear to be unpaid.

Mr. Marnecheck asked for clarification about the information that was sent out, whether the balance is what RITA felt could be collected. Mr. Dean clarified yes, that is probably based on prior years. Mr. Marnecheck asked about the \$281,000 of taxable revenue, which Mr. Dean verified was the correct number. Mr. Marnecheck reiterated that we are being charged \$1 per subpoena, versus \$8 in the past. Mr. Dean concurred and would keep everyone updated on the program.

Ms. Fenos raised question on the amount of \$114,000 in payments, whether the program considered the letters to be successful. Mr. Dean clarified that they did consider it successful. The letter itself, and collecting that amount of money has been pretty successful. He felt that we would collect that much with a normal subpoena program; which is normally between \$50,000-\$80,000. Mr. Marnecheck asked about the cost thus far for these programs. Mr. Dean indicated that with the \$1 dollar cost per subpoena, it was 5,000 accounts; we would get a bill. Mr. Marnecheck asked about the cost, in order to receive that \$114,000. Mr. Dean clarified that it was free, in which we are up \$114,000. The next step would be more of a challenge.

NEW BUSINESS

1. **Proposed Ordinance – ARPA grant acceptance**

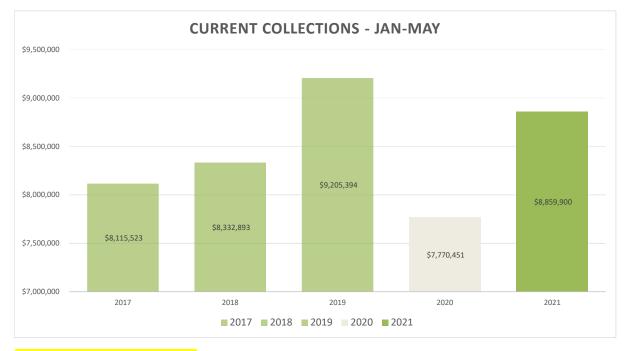
Mr. Kelly reported that there is some indication in the legislation, that the recipient of municipalities is being called upon to pass legislation, that they would receive it and plan to spend only in accord with the rules and regulations by the Federal Government. We are simply trying to cover the administrative concerns that the Federal Government has. Mayor Antoskiewicz commented that it was very similar to what we created for the CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act).

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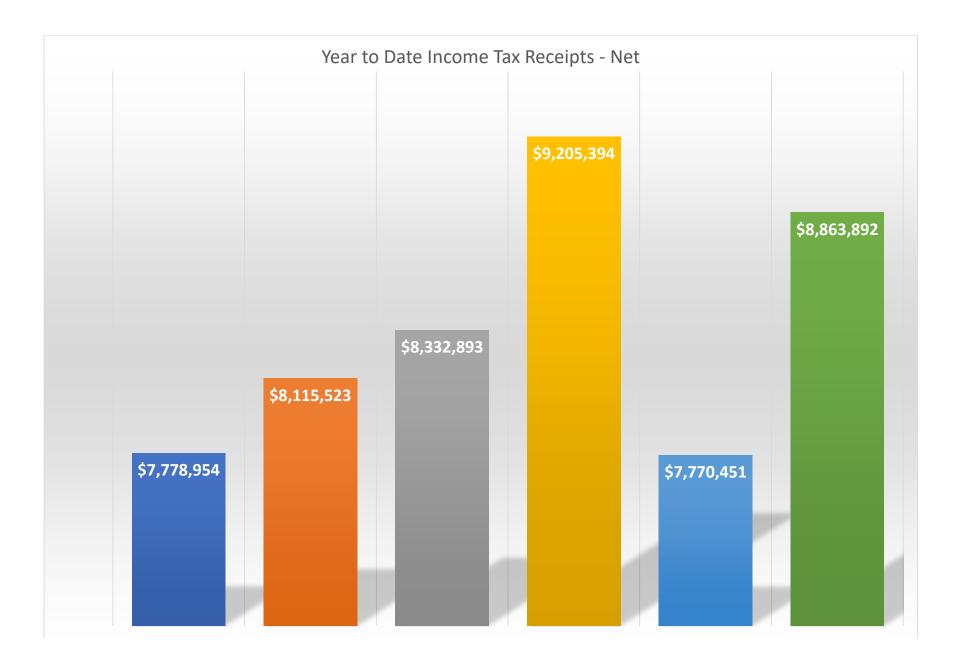
