AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A COMMUNITY COST-SHARE AGREEMENT WITH THE NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT FOR THE 1601 BIG CREEK FLOOD REDUCTION NEAR SPRAGUE ROAD PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

- WHEREAS: Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) adopted Resolution 114-13 authorizing the Executive Director to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Community Cost-Share Program Agreements with member communities; and
- The purpose of the Community Cost-Share Account is to provide funding to assist the City WHEREAS: with District-approved projects through the Community Cost-Share Program; and
- The Community Cost-Share Program funds are used for construction, operation, and WHEREAS: maintenance of the Local Stormwater System or Regional Stormwater System, including administrative costs directly associated with such projects as well as costs related to repair or upgrade; and
- The District supports the Community Cost-Share 1601 Big Creek Flood Reduction near WHEREAS: Sprague Road project (the "Project") as a Community Cost-Share project proposed by the city; and
- It is therefore necessary to authorize the Mayor to enter into a Community Cost-Share WHEREAS: Agreement with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District in order to participate in this program; and
- Council desires to provide for this authorization. WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a Community Cost-Share Agreement with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District for the 1601 Big Creek Flood Reduction near Sprague Road project pursuant to terms and conditions approved by the Director of Law and substantially similar to a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. COMMUNITY COST-SHARE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT AND CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON

This Agreement is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2021, by and between the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (District) acting pursuant to Resolution No. 114-13, adopted by the Board of Trustees of the District on May 16, 2013 (Exhibit "A"), and City of North Royalton (City) acting pursuant to Ordinance/Resolution No. _____, adopted on _____, 2022 (Exhibit "B").

Recitals

WHEREAS, the District, as a component of implementing a regional stormwater management program, manages a financial account termed the "*Community Cost-Share Account*" that is for the aggregation and dissemination of funds derived from revenues collected from the Stormwater Fee; and

WHERAS, the purpose of the Community Cost-Share Account is to provide funding to assist the City with District-approved projects through the Community Cost Share Program; and

WHEREAS, the Community Cost-Share Program funds are used for construction, operation, and maintenance of the Local Stormwater System or Regional Stormwater System, including administrative costs directly associated with such projects as well as costs related to repair or upgrade; and

WHEREAS, the District supports the Community Cost-Share 1601 Big Creek Flood Reduction near Sprague Road project (the "Project") as a Community Cost-Share project; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the payment and the mutual promises contained in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

Article 1.0 City Obligations

1.1 The City agrees to perform as follows:

- 1.1.1 Meet with District staff when requested to review the Project status.
- 1.1.2 Continue to own and maintain the road crossing the infrastructure upon completion of the Project in partnership with the City of Parma along the community boundary.

1.1.3 Acknowledge the District on any public advertisement or outreach efforts including all publications and signage related to the Project which shall include the following disclaimer:

This project was funded in part or totally through the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) Community Cost-Share Program in coordination with City, under the provisions of the NEORSD Regional Stormwater Management Program. The contents and views, including any opinions, findings, or conclusions or recommendations, contained in this publication are those of the authors and have not been subject to NEORSD review and may not necessarily reflect the views of NEORSD, and no official endorsement should be inferred.

1.2 Failure to meet any of the requirements listed in Article 1.1 may result in termination of this Agreement and reimbursement of disbursed funds to the District.

Article 2.0 District's Obligations

- 2.1 The District agrees to perform as follows:
 - 2.1.1. Complete work as detailed in the District approved Community Cost-Share application (Exhibit "C").
 - 2.1.2. Obtain all necessary legal agreements with affected property owners to perform the Project and to bind any successor in title to maintain compliance as specified in this Agreement between the District and the City for the Project.
 - 2.1.3. Comply with all applicable local, state and federal requirements. This may include, but is not limited to, U.S. Army Corp of Engineers Section 404, Ohio EPA Section 401 water quality certification, and Ohio Department of Natural Resources Dam Safety Laws.
- 2.1.4. Allocate \$35,000.00 to the City for the Project from the City's Community Cost-Share Account. Following the completion of the Project, such funds will be payable to the District as compensation for the performance of the Project and will be transferred from the City's Community Cost-Share Account to the District's Stormwater General fund by the District
- 2.1.5. Timely review and approval or disapproval of requests to modify the budget, deadline, deliverables, or other components of the Project.

- 2.1.6. Permit the City to photograph the Project and to incorporate the Project into the City's overall public education and outreach efforts for stormwater management.
- 2.1.7. Acknowledge the City in presentations or publications related to the Project.

Article 3.0 Dispute Resolution

- 3.01 The Parties shall continue the performance of their obligations under this Agreement notwithstanding the existence of a dispute.
- 3.02 The Parties shall first try to resolve the dispute at the level of the designated representatives as follows:

District Representative	City Representative
Watershed Team Leader	City Engineer

If the Parties are unable to resolve the dispute at that level within ten (10) working days, the Parties shall escalate the dispute to the following level to resolve the dispute:

District Representative	City Representative
Director of Watershed Programs	Mayor

- 3.03 If the Parties remain unable to resolve the dispute within an additional ten (10) working days, the Parties shall proceed to mediation upon request by either party. The mediator shall review all documents and written statements, in order to accurately and effectively resolve the dispute. The mediator shall call a meeting between the Parties within ten (10) working days after mediator appointment, which meeting shall be attended by at least the respective representatives listed in paragraph 3.02 above. The Parties shall attempt in good faith to resolve the dispute. The Parties agree to follow the Uniform Mediation Act, Chapter 2710 of the Ohio Revised Code. The Parties shall share the cost of the mediator equally.
- 3.04 Such mediation shall be non-binding between the Parties and, to the extent permitted by law, shall be kept confidential. If the dispute is resolved and settled through the mediation process, the decision will be implemented by a written agreement signed by both Parties. If the dispute is unable to be resolved through mediation, the Parties agree to submit the dispute to the appropriate jurisdiction as per Article 4, <u>Remedies</u>, below.

Article 4 Remedies

4.01 The Parties agree that, after exhausting the dispute resolution process outlined above, all

claims, counter-claims, disputes and other matters in question between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement, or the breach thereof, will be decided at law. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted according to the laws of the State of Ohio.

Article 5 Counterpart Signatures

5.01 This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but which counterparts when taken together shall constitute one Agreement.

Article 6 Governing Law

6.01 The terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be construed under and governed by the laws of Ohio (to which all Parties hereto consent to venue and jurisdiction).

Article 7 Disclaimer of Joint Venture

7.01 This Agreement is not intended to create a joint venture, partnership or agency relationship between the Parties, and such joint venture, partnership, or agency relationship is specifically hereby disclaimed.

Article 8 Authority to Execute

8.01 Each person executing this Agreement represents and warrants that it is duly authorized to execute this Agreement by the party on whose behalf it is so executing.

Authorizing the Executive Director to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Community Cost-Share Program Agreements with Member Communities.

WHEREAS, the Code of Regulations of the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District, Title V – Stormwater Management Code Chapter 9 outlines the Community Cost-Share Program developed to provide funds to District Member Communities for construction, operation and maintenance activities of community-specific stormwater management projects; and

WHEREAS, under the Community Cost-Share Program, 25% of the annual collected stormwater revenue from each Member Community will be held by the District in a Community Cost-Share account, whereby Communities, with review and approval by the District, through specific applications outlining the community-specific stormwater work to be performed can access reimbursement of their funds; and

WHEREAS, the District is seeking authority to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Community Cost-Share Program Agreements with Member Communities for the purpose of detailing and memorializing responsibilities of the District and Member Communities under specific applications to the Community Cost-Share Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT:

Section 1. That this Board finds that for the reasons stated in the preamble hereof it is in the best interests of the District to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Cost-Share Program Agreements with Member Communities to memorialize responsibilities of the District and Member Communities under specific applications to the Community Cost-Share Program.

Section 2. That this Board hereby authorizes the Executive Director to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Cost-Share Agreements with Member Communities to memorialize responsibilities of the District and Member Communities under specific applications to the Community Cost-Share Program under such terms and conditions that are satisfactory to the Director of Law and in the best interests of the District. Section 3. AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH TMRD. LTD., AND LESSEE KENT CORPORATION FOR COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA TAX INCENTIVES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

- WHEREAS: Council adopted Ordinance 15-34 creating a Community Reinvestment Area and establishing boundaries for same; and
- WHEREAS: TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation (property owner) has submitted an application requesting participation in the Community Reinvestment Area tax incentives; and
- WHEREAS: Council desires to authorize the Mayor to enter into this agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO. THAT:

Section 1. COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA AGREEMENT

This agreement made and entered into by and between **the City of North Royalton**, Ohio, a municipal corporation, with its main office located at 14600 State Road, North Royalton, Ohio (hereinafter referred to as "City") and **TMRD**, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation with its main offices located at 9601 York Alpha Dr., North Royalton, Ohio, (hereinafter referred to as "property owner").

WITNESSETH;

WHEREAS, City of North Royalton has encouraged the development of real property and the acquisition of personal property located in the area designated as a Community Reinvestment Area; and

WHEREAS, **TMRD**, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation is desirous of constructing a new office facility to facilitate the expansion of services and products, see exhibit A, attached and incorporated herein, (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT") within the boundaries of the aforementioned Community Reinvestment Area, provided that the appropriate development incentives are available to support the economic viability of said PROJECT; and

WHEREAS, the Council of North Royalton, Ohio by Ordinance No. 15-34 adopted on March 3, 2015, designated the area as an "Community Reinvestment Area" pursuant to Chapter 3735 or the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, effective June 9, 2015, the Director of Development of the State of Ohio determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Ordinance 15-34 contained the characteristics set forth in Section 3735.66 of the Ohio Revised Code and confirmed said area as a Community Reinvestment Area under said Chapter 3735; and

WHEREAS, the City of North Royalton having the appropriate authority for the stated type of project, is desirous of providing TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation with incentives available for the development of the PROJECT in said Community Reinvestment Area under Chapter 3735 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation submitted a proposed agreement application (herein attached as Exhibit B) to the City of North Royalton said application (hereinafter referred to as "APPLICATION"); and

WHEREAS, **TMRD**, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation has remitted the required state application fee of \$750.00 made payable to the Ohio Department of Development with the application to be forwarded to said department with a copy of the final agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City of North Royalton has investigated the application of TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation and has recommended the same to the Council of City of North Royalton on the basis that that it is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in said Community Reinvestment Area and improve the economic climate of North_Royalton; and

WHEREAS, the project site as proposed by **TMRD**, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation is located in the North Royalton School District and the Cuyahoga Joint Vocational School District have been

notified in accordance with Section 5709.83 and been given a copy of the APPLICATION; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3735.67(A) and in conformance with the format required under Section 3735.671(B) of the Ohio Revised Code, the parties hereto desire to set forth their agreement with respect to matters hereinafter contained;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained and the benefit to be derived by the parties from the execution hereof, the parties herein agree as follows:

1. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** shall add/construct 15,000 square feet to the building. The addition will add 5,000 square feet of warehouse storage space and 10,000 square feet of additional space for rebuilding of machines and general assembly of new machines. This will enable Kent Corporation to offer more product timely and efficiently to our clients. Upon completion, new hires for the space include 2 production, 1 salesperson, and 1 maintenance service technician.

The PROJECT will involve a total investment of One Million Two Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$1,220,000.00) as follows:

Additions/New Construction:	\$900,000
Improvements to existing buildings:	\$35,000
Machinery & Equipment:	\$15,000
Furniture & Fixtures:	\$20,000
Inventory:	\$250,000

The PROJECT will begin February 15, 2022 and all acquisition, construction and will be completed by January 1, 2023.

2. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** shall create within a time period not exceeding 24 months after the conclusion of construction of the aforesaid facility, four (4) new full-time permanent job opportunities by Kent Corporation.

The building addition is to expand the workspace and storage of the facility for the production area of the manufacturer, Kent Corporation. This addition will allow space for Kent Corporation to hire 4 new full time permanent employees at the facility. The additional 4 employee's payroll costs will be approximately \$300,000/year. Kent Corporation currently stores a portion of their inventory in an offsite facility in Shelby, Ohio. The new building addition will allow this inventory to be stored onsite for accessibility without need for additional freight costs between the two facilities. The freight cost between facilities is approximately \$2,800/month (33,600/year) on average and the storage rent fees for the offsite facility is \$4,550/month (54,600/year) on average.

3. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation shall** provide to the proper Tax Incentive Review Council any information reasonably required by the council to evaluate the property owner's compliance with the agreement, including returns filed pursuant to section 5711.02 of the Ohio Revised Code if requested by the council.

4. The City of North Royalton hereby grants **TMRD**, Ltd. and Lessee Kent Corporation a tax exemption for real property improvements made to the PROJECT site pursuant to Section 3735.67 of the Ohio Revised Code in the following amounts:

Exemption Term-15 years

Each identified project improvement will receive a 15-year exemption period. The exemption commences the first year for which the Real Property exemption would first be taxable were that property not exempted from taxation. No exemption shall commence before January 1, 2023 nor extend beyond December 31, 2038.

5. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** shall pay an annual fee equal to the greater of one percent of the dollar value of incentives offered under the agreement or five hundred dollars: provided, however, that if the value of the incentives exceeds two hundred fifty thousand dollars, the fee shall not exceed two thousand five hundred dollars.

The fee shall be made payable to the City of North Royalton once per year for each year the agreement is effective by certified check. The fee is to be paid to finance director and made out to the City of North Royalton. This fee shall be deposited in a special fund created for such purpose and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of complying with section 3735.671(D) of the revised code and by the tax incentive review council created under section 3735.671(D) of the revised code exclusively for the purposes of performing the duties prescribed under that section.

- 6. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** shall pay such real and tangible personal property taxes as are not exempted under this agreement and are charged against such property and shall file all tax reports and returns as required by law. If **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation fails** to pay such taxes or file such returns and reports, all incentives granted under this agreement are rescinded beginning with the year for which such taxes are charged or such reports or returns are required to be filed and thereafter.
- 7. City of North Royalton shall perform such acts as are reasonably necessary or appropriate to effect, claim, reserve, and maintain exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement including, without limitation, joining in the execution of all documentation and providing any necessary certificates required in connection with such exemptions.
- 8. If for any reason the Community Reinvestment Area designation expires, the Director of the Ohio Department of Development revokes certification of the zone, or the City of North Royalton revokes the designation of the zone, entitlements granted under this agreement shall continue for the number of years specified under this agreement, unless **TMRD**, **Ltd.**, **and Lessee Kent Corporation** fails to fulfill its obligations under this agreement the City of North Royalton terminates or modifies the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement.
- 9. If North Royalton materially fails to fulfill its obligations under this agreement, or if the City of North Royalton determines that the certification as to delinquent taxes required by this agreement is fraudulent, the City of North Royalton may terminate or modify the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement.
- 10. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** hereby certifies that at the time this agreement is executed, **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation,** does not owe any delinquent real or tangible personal property taxes to any taxing authority of the State of Ohio, and does not owe delinquent taxes for which **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation are** liable under Chapter 5733., 5735., 5739., 5741., 5743., 5747., or 5753. of the Revised Code, or, if

such delinquent taxes are owed, **TMRD**, **Ltd.**, **and Lessee Kent Corporation** currently are paying the delinquent taxes pursuant to an undertaking enforceable by the State of Ohio or an agent or instrumentality thereof, has filed a petition in bankruptcy under 11 U.S.C.A. 101, et seq., or such a petition has been filed against **TMRD**, **Ltd.**, **and Lessee Kent Corporation** for the purposes of the certification, delinquent taxes are taxes that remain unpaid on the latest day prescribed for payment without penalty under the chapter of the Revised Code governing payment of those taxes.

- 11. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** covenants that it does not owe: (1) any delinquent taxes to the State of Ohio or a political subdivision of the State; (2) any moneys to the State or a state agency for the administration or enforcement of any environmental laws of the State; and (3) any other moneys to the State, a state agency or a political subdivision of the State that are past due, whether the amounts owed are being contested in a court of law or not.
- 12. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** and City of North Royalton acknowledge that this agreement must be approved by formal action of the legislative authority of the City of North Royalton as a condition for the agreement to take effect. This agreement takes effect upon such approval.
- 13. The City of North Royalton has developed a policy to ensure recipients of Community Reinvestment Area tax benefits practice non-discriminating hiring in its operations. By executing this agreement, **TMRD**, **Ltd.**, **and Lessee Kent Corporation** is committing to following non-discriminating hiring practices acknowledging that no individual may be denied employment solely on the basis of race, religion, sex, disability, color, national origin, or ancestry.
- 14. Exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement shall be revoked if it is determined that **TMRD**, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation any successor property owner, or any related member (as those terms are defined in Section 3735.671 of the Ohio Revised Code) has violated the prohibition against entering into this agreement under Division (E) of Section 3735.671 or Section 5709.62 or 5709.63 of the Ohio Revised Code prior to the time prescribed by that division or either of those sections.
- 15. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** affirmatively covenants that it has made no false statements to the State or local political subdivisions in the process of obtaining approval of the Community Reinvestment Area incentives. If any representative of **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** has knowingly made a false statement to the State or local political subdivision to obtain the Community Reinvestment Area incentives, **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** shall be required to immediately return all benefits received under the Community Reinvestment Area Agreement pursuant ORC Section 9.66(C)(2) and shall be ineligible for any future economic development assistance from the State, any state agency or a political subdivision pursuant to ORC Section 9.66(C)(1). Any person who provides a false statement to secure economic development assistance may be guilty of falsification, a misdemeanor of the first degree, pursuant to ORC Section 2921.13(D)(1), which is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 and/or a term of imprisonment of not more than six months.
- 16. This agreement is not transferable or assignable without the express, written approval of The City of North Royalton.

5. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** shall pay an annual fee equal to the greater of one percent of the dollar value of incentives offered under the agreement or five hundred dollars: provided, however, that if the value of the incentives exceeds two hundred fifty thousand dollars, the fee shall not exceed two thousand five hundred dollars.

The fee shall be made payable to the City of North Royalton once per year for each year the agreement is effective by certified check. The fee is to be paid to finance director and made out to the City of North Royalton. This fee shall be deposited in a special fund created for such purpose and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of complying with section 3735.671(D) of the revised code and by the tax incentive review council created under section 3735.671(D) of the revised code exclusively for the purposes of performing the duties prescribed under that section.

- 6. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** shall pay such real and tangible personal property taxes as are not exempted under this agreement and are charged against such property and shall file all tax reports and returns as required by law. If **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation fails** to pay such taxes or file such returns and reports, all incentives granted under this agreement are rescinded beginning with the year for which such taxes are charged or such reports or returns are required to be filed and thereafter.
- 7. City of North Royalton shall perform such acts as are reasonably necessary or appropriate to effect, claim, reserve, and maintain exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement including, without limitation, joining in the execution of all documentation and providing any necessary certificates required in connection with such exemptions.
- 8. If for any reason the Community Reinvestment Area designation expires, the Director of the Ohio Department of Development revokes certification of the zone, or the City of North Royalton revokes the designation of the zone, entitlements granted under this agreement shall continue for the number of years specified under this agreement, unless TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation fails to fulfill its obligations under this agreement the City of North Royalton terminates or modifies the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement.
- 9. If North Royalton materially fails to fulfill its obligations under this agreement, or if the City of North Royalton determines that the certification as to delinquent taxes required by this agreement is fraudulent, the City of North Royalton may terminate or modify the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement.
- 10. TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation hereby certifies that at the time this agreement is executed, TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation, does not owe any delinquent real or tangible personal property taxes to any taxing authority of the State of Ohio, and does not owe delinquent taxes for which TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation are liable under Chapter 5733., 5735., 5739., 5741., 5743., 5747., or 5753. of the Revised Code, or, if

such delinquent taxes are owed, **TMRD**, **Ltd.**, **and Lessee Kent Corporation** currently are paying the delinquent taxes pursuant to an undertaking enforceable by the State of Ohio or an agent or instrumentality thereof, has filed a petition in bankruptcy under 11 U.S.C.A. 101, et seq., or such a petition has been filed against **TMRD**, **Ltd.**, **and Lessee Kent Corporation** for the purposes of the certification, delinquent taxes are taxes that remain unpaid on the latest day prescribed for payment without penalty under the chapter of the Revised Code governing payment of those taxes.

- 11. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** covenants that it does not owe: (1) any delinquent taxes to the State of Ohio or a political subdivision of the State; (2) any moneys to the State or a state agency for the administration or enforcement of any environmental laws of the State; and (3) any other moneys to the State, a state agency or a political subdivision of the State that are past due, whether the amounts owed are being contested in a court of law or not.
- 12. **TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation** and City of North Royalton acknowledge that this agreement must be approved by formal action of the legislative authority of the City of North Royalton as a condition for the agreement to take effect. This agreement takes effect upon such approval.
- 13. The City of North Royalton has developed a policy to ensure recipients of Community Reinvestment Area tax benefits practice non-discriminating hiring in its operations. By executing this agreement, **TMRD**, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation is committing to following non-discriminating hiring practices acknowledging that no individual may be denied employment solely on the basis of race, religion, sex, disability, color, national origin, or ancestry.
- 14. Exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement shall be revoked if it is determined that **TMRD**, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation any successor property owner, or any related member (as those terms are defined in Section 3735.671 of the Ohio Revised Code) has violated the prohibition against entering into this agreement under Division (E) of Section 3735.671 or Section 5709.62 or 5709.63 of the Ohio Revised Code prior to the time prescribed by that division or either of those sections.
- 15. TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation affirmatively covenants that it has made no false statements to the State or local political subdivisions in the process of obtaining approval of the Community Reinvestment Area incentives. If any representative of TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation has knowingly made a false statement to the State or local political subdivision to obtain the Community Reinvestment Area incentives, TMRD, Ltd., and Lessee Kent Corporation shall be required to immediately return all benefits received under the Community Reinvestment Area Agreement pursuant ORC Section 9.66(C)(2) and shall be ineligible for any future economic development assistance from the State, any state agency or a political subdivision pursuant to ORC Section 9.66(C)(1). Any person who provides a false statement to secure economic development assistance may be guilty of falsification, a misdemeanor of the first degree, pursuant to ORC Section 2921.13(D)(1), which is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 and/or a term of imprisonment of not more than six months.
- 16. This agreement is not transferable or assignable without the express, written approval of The City of North Royalton.

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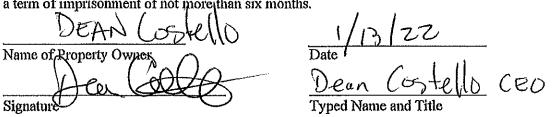

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT NORTHEAST OHIO PUBLIC ENERGY COUNCIL (NOPEC) ENERGIZED COMMUNITY GRANT(S), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

- The City of North Royalton, Ohio (the "MUNICIPALITY") is a member of the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council ("NOPEC") and is eligible for one or more NOPEC Energized WHEREAS: Community Grant(s) for 2022 ("NEC Grant(s)") as provided for in the NEC Grant Program guidelines; and
- The City of North Royalton has previously entered into a Grant Agreement with NOPEC, Inc. WHEREAS: to receive one or more NEC Grant(s) for 2022, and to authorize the Mayor to execute the Grant Agreement with NOPEC, Inc. in the form attached.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON. COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. This Council of the City of North Royalton (the "Council") finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the city to accept the NEC Grant(s) for 2022, and authorizes the Mayor to accept any such grant or grants.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to enter into this agreement with NOPEC in order to be eligible for Energized Community Grants for 2022.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

NOPEC 2022 ENERGIZED COMMUNITY

GRANT AGREEMENT

This Grant Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between NOPEC, Inc. ("Grantor"), and _______, _____ County, Ohio ("Grantee"; "Grantor" and "Grantee," the "Parties") regarding a grant by Grantor to Grantee to be used primarily for energy efficiency or energy infrastructure updates in accordance with NOPEC Energized Community Grant criteria, guidelines and requirements ("NOPEC Policy").

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises and covenants hereinafter set forth, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Grant of Funds. Grantor hereby grants a NOPEC Energized Community Grant ("NEC Grant") to Grantee in the amount calculated by Grantor based on the number of natural gas and/or electric accounts served by Grantor in Grantee in accordance with NOPEC Policy in the amount determined by Grantor ("Funds"), for the purposes set forth in Grantee's Grant Disbursement Request, as amended, and incorporated by reference into this Agreement.

2. Use of Funds. Grantee shall use the Funds granted by Grantor for qualified use as outlined in the program policies. Funds shall be paid in accordance with NOPEC Policy. NEC Grant disbursements shall be accompanied by a completed Disbursement Request Form with the expenditures supported by contracts, invoices, vouchers, and other data as appropriate as supporting documents. All disbursements for qualified use in accordance to the program policies must be submitted by November 30, 2024. If Grantee does not request disbursements by Grantor on or before such date, Grantee shall forfeit any unused Funds for the NOPEC 2022 Grant year.

3. Accounting of Funds. Grantee shall keep all Funds and make all disbursements and expenditures consistent with the manner in which all public funds are kept by Grantee in accordance with applicable law.

4. **Term.** The Parties agree that this Agreement shall begin on January 1, 2022, and shall expire on December 31, 2022, and shall be automatically renewed annually unless Grantor discontinues the NEC Grant program for any subsequent year or Grantee is no longer a NOPEC member in good standing, as defined herein.

5. Renewable Energy Credits. Grantee shall be entitled to claim Renewable Energy Credits, carbon credits, or NOx allowances and/or allowances arising under other trading programs that may be established in the future for the work completed using grant funding. Grantor reserves the right to claim/apply for such allowances if Grantee does not claim such allowances or this Agreement terminates. Grantee must notify Grantor if Grantee does not wish to trade or sell any such credits or assets.

6. Records, Access and Maintenance. Grantee shall establish and maintain all records associated with the Funds in accordance with the Ohio Public Records Act and shall promptly make available to Grantor all of its records with respect to matters covered by this ... Agreement, and for Grantor to audit, examine and make copies from such records. Grantee agrees to share and release all of its utility and other data with NOPEC, Inc. and Grantor and its

consultant(s) in order to measure, verify and otherwise track savings from energy efficiency and for such other related uses as Grantor shall require.

7. **Property and Equipment Purchases.** All items purchased by Grantee from the Funds granted herein are and shall remain the property of Grantee.

8. Inability to Perform. In the event that Grantee does not or cannot complete or perform its obligations under this Agreement, Grantee shall immediately notify Grantor in writing. Grantor, with the approval of the Committee formed to award NEC Grants (the "Committee"), and Grantee shall jointly identify amendments or suitable uses that meet NOPEC Policy.

9. **Dispute Resolution.** In the event Grantee desires clarification or explanation of, or disagrees with, any matter concerning the Agreement, or the interpretation or application of any and all federal or state statutes, rules, regulations, laws or ordinances, the matter must be submitted in writing to Grantor, which shall convene the Committee to review and decide the matter. All decisions of the Committee shall be final and binding upon Grantee, and non-appealable.

10. Termination.

(a) If Grantor determines that Grantee has failed to perform any requirements of this Agreement, or if Grantee is in default under any provision of this Agreement, or upon just cause, as shall be determined by the Committee, Grantor, upon approval by the Committee, may terminate the Agreement at any time after providing Grantee with written notice and a period of at least thirty (30) days to cure any and all defaults under this Agreement. During such thirty day cure period, Grantee shall incur only those obligations or expenditures which are necessary to enable Grantee to continue to achieve compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

(b) This Agreement shall automatically terminate if Grantee is not a NOPEC member in good standing. A NOPEC member in good standing means a Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council ("NOPEC" or "Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council") member whose residents are receiving service from Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council's natural gas or electric aggregation program and which has not provided written notice to withdraw from such Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council's natural gas or electric aggregation program.

11. Effects of Termination.

(a) Within sixty (60) days after termination of this Agreement, Grantee shall surrender all reports, data, documents, and other materials assembled and prepared pursuant to this Agreement which shall become the property of Grantor.

(b) The Committee also may withhold final installment payment of the Funds or require Grantee to return all or any part of the Funds awarded if Grantee is found to have violated the provisions of this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Agreement, if Grantee either withdraws from membership in the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council or from its electric or natural gas aggregation program(s), Grantee shall no longer be eligible for any NEC Grants. The provisions of this paragraph are in addition to the termination provisions of this Agreement and to any payments required under the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council Bylaws and the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council of Governments Agreement with its member communities in connection with any such withdrawal. 12. Liability. Grantee shall maintain, or cause any vendors or subcontractors to maintain, all required liability and property insurance to cover actionable legal claims for liability or loss which are the result of injury to or death of any person, damage to property caused by the negligent acts or omissions, or negligent conduct of the Grantee. To the extent permitted by law, in connection with activities conducted in connection with this Agreement, Grantee agrees to defend Grantor and pay any judgments and costs arising out of such negligent acts or omissions, and nothing in this Agreement shall impute or transfer any liability of any nature whatsoever from Grantee to NOPEC, Inc. or the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council.

13. Compliance with Laws. Grantee agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws in the performance of the funding. Grantee is solely responsible for payments of all unemployment compensation, insurance premiums, workers' compensation premiums, all income tax deductions, social security deductions, and any and all other taxes or payroll deductions required for all employees engaged by Grantee on the performance of the work authorized by this Agreement.

14. Miscellaneous.

(a) Governing Law. The laws of the State of Ohio shall govern this Agreement. All actions regarding this Agreement shall be venued in a court of competent subject matter jurisdiction in Cuyahoga County, Ohio.

(b) Entire Agreement. This Agreement and any documents referred to herein constitute the complete understanding of the Parties and merge and supersede any and all other discussions, agreements and understandings, either oral or written, between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

(c) Severability. Whenever possible, each provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted in such manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law, but if any provision of this Agreement is held to be prohibited by or invalid under applicable law, such provision shall be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or invalidity, without invalidating the remainder of such provisions of this Agreement.

(d) Notices. All notices, consents, demands, requests and other communications which may, or are required to be, given hereunder shall be in writing and delivered to the addresses set forth hereunder or to such other address as the other party hereto may designate from time to time:

(e) Amendments or Modifications. Either party may at any time during the term of this Agreement request amendments or modifications. Requests for amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall specify the requested changes and justification therefor. Should the Parties consent to modification of the Agreement, then an amendment shall be drawn, approved, and executed in the same manner as the original Agreement.

(f) Headings. Section headings contained in this Agreement are inserted for convenience only and shall not be deemed to be a part of this Agreement.

(g) Assignment. Neither this Agreement nor any rights, duties or obligations described herein, shall be assigned or subcontracted by Grantee without the prior express written consent of Grantor.

(h) Authority. The undersigned represents and warrants to the other that each has all the necessary legal power and authority to enter into this Agreement.

(i) Determinations by Grantor Final. All determinations as to eligibility of any uses of an award of any NEC Grant, and the amount and payment schedule of a NEC Grant, will be made by Grantor and its Committee, which shall be final, conclusive and binding upon Grantee.

(j) Designation of Grantee Representative. - <u>WHEREAS</u>: This Council, on January 18, 2022, adopted a resolution declaring it to be necessary to provide for the replacement in its entirety of the existing additional tax of 1.7 mills in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the purpose of providing emergency medical service which such authority to levy such additional tax expiring with the levy made on the 2021 tax list and duplicate, to be collected in 2022 (the "Existing Levy"), in order to receive sufficient revenues and to continue to receive revenues therefrom without interruption (the "Resolution of Necessity") and requested the County Fiscal Officer to provide the necessary certifications under 5705.03 of the Revised Code; and
- <u>WHEREAS</u>: the County Fiscal Officer has certified that the amount that would be produced by a levy of 1.7 mills would be \$1,821,994, and the total tax valuation of the subdivision used in calculating the estimated property tax revenue is \$1,071,761,400 (the "Fiscal Officer's Certification"); and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: this Council has determined to proceed with the levy described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, OHIO, THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. This Council hereby determines to proceed with the submission of the question of the replacement in its entirety of the Existing Levy of 1.7 mills for the purpose of providing emergency medical service for a period of five years at the same rate as the Existing Levy (being 1.7 mills for each one dollar in tax valuation), beginning with the tax list and duplicate for the year 2022, the proceeds of which levy first would be distributed to this City in the calendar year 2023, and such question shall be submitted pursuant to the Resolution of Necessity and this Resolution adopted under Article XIV of the City Charter and Sections 5705.192, 5705.19(U) and 5705.191 of the Ohio Revised Code to the electors of the City of North Royalton at the election to be held therein on May 3, 2022, as authorized by law. That election shall be held at the regular places of voting in the City as established by the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, Ohio, or otherwise, within the times provided by law and shall be conducted, canvassed and certified in the manner provided by law.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Director of Legislative Services, in her capacity as Clerk of Council, is hereby authorized and directed to give or cause to be given notice of said election as provided by law.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Director of Legislative Services, in her capacity as Clerk of Council, is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution, the Resolution of Necessity and the Fiscal Officer's Certification to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, Ohio, no later than February 2, 2022.

<u>Section 4</u>. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

<u>Section 5</u>. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that this Resolution is required to be immediately effective so that it can be timely filed with the Board of Elections in order to submit the tax levy to the electors at the election stated in Section 1.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF FOUR (4) 2022 FORD INTERCEPTORS FOR THE NORTH ROYALTON POLICE DEPARTMENT THROUGH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES, OHIO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM, VENDOR MONTROSE FORD, FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$132,221.64, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

- Council has authorized the purchase of four (4) motor vehicles for the North Royalton Police WHEREAS: Department; and
- The city is purchasing these vehicles through the Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program of the WHEREAS: Department of Administrative Services; and
- It is necessary to provide for the funding of said purchase. WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON. COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Council hereby authorizes the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$132,221.64 (cost of vehicle, options, delivery, and warranty) for the purchase of four (4) 2022 Ford Interceptors for the North Royalton Police Department pursuant to Contract No. RS1006716, through the Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program of the Department of Administrative Services, Vendor: Montrose Ford, 960 Medina Road, Akron, Ohio 44333, Vendor #GDC050 and as further described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Ohio Department of Administrative Services, Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for the purchase of these vehicles for the North Royalton Police Department for the proper and immediate performance of departmental duties.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

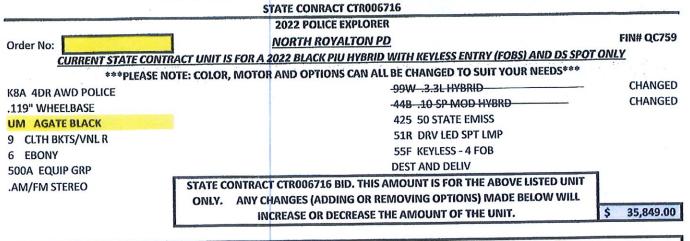

1 - SPECIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

1.4 - REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the Model Year 2022 or Manufacturer's most current Model Year State of Ohio Law Enforcement Vehicles minimum specification sheets, the following items of factory-installed equipment shall be required as Standard Equipment on each vehicle listed in this bid, unless otherwise noted. Optional Equipment required to be furnished on the unit is noted on the State's Specifications. Options listed herein, are to be factory installed except for items(s) not available from the factory.

1.4.1 - REQUIRED STANDARD EQUIPMENT

1.5 - DELIVERY

1.5.1 - ORDER CONFIRMATION

Upon receipt of an order from an ordering agency, contractors are expected to enter orders with the factory within two (2) days after of receipt of purchase order. The contractor will confirm receipt of the agency's order and projected shipping date to the ordering agency within two (2) working days, by either fax or electronic means. The confirmation document shall confirm the contractor's order number, specific item(s), order quantities, unit price, a copy of the order notification and vehicle order number. The confirmation document may be a copy of the agency's order with the contractor's order number entered thereon. Delivery to the ordering agency is to be accomplished within seven (7) days after the contractor receives and services ordered items (for Delayed Delivery refer to section 1.5.3).

1.5.2 - ORDERING ENTITY CONTACT

Any State of Ohio ordering entity and/or political subdivision ordering from this contract needs to be sure that they have included a contact, phone/fax numbers on the purchase order to the dealership. State's Cooperative Purchasing members need to be sure to include their current membership certificate number and / or a copy of their current membership certificate when placing an order to the dealership.

1.5.3 - DELAYED DELIVERY

- A. Certain agencies may require delayed delivery on various items within this Contract. For any vehicle order that requests delayed delivery, the storage charges per day shall commence seven (7) calendar days after agency contact person notification that vehicle(s) so ordered are serviced and ready for delivery. The rate of such charges be indicated on the catalog item as Delayed Delivery Daily Storage Charge. Failure to include a dollar amount at bid submission for the Delayed Delivery Daily Storage Charge will be interpreted as \$0.00.
- B. If ordering entities elect to take delivery at the Contractor's place of business, pickup must be within seven (7) calendar days after notification that the vehicle is serviced and ready for pickup. If the vehicle is not picked up within the seven (7) calendar days after notification, the ordering entity is subject to a storage charge. The rate of such charges shall be indicated on the catalog item as Delayed Delivery Daily Storage Charge. 1.5.4 - DELIVERY INSTRUCTIONS

The transporting and delivery of automobiles shall be accomplished by surface transport, or by being driven individually. Tow bar delivery is not acceptable. All deliveries shall be effected per bid commitment. Failure to meet delivery requirements may be cause for cancellation, only with the approval of the Office of Procurement Services.

1.5.5 - MANUFACTURERS PRODUCTION TERMINATION NOTICE (BUILD-OUT)

- A. The contractor is required to notify the Office of Procurement Services when build out dates are released by the manufacturer. - B. 1.6.2 - SPECIFICATION CONFORMATION & EXTRA ACCESSORIES

Any delivered vehicle not conforming to these specifications shall be rejected and it will be the responsibility of the dealer or manufacturer to comply with State of Ohio requirements. Any extra accessories delivered on vehicles cannot and will not be paid for.

1.6.3 - ORDERING REQUIREMENTS/LIMITATIONS

State of Ohio Standard Terms and Conditions (revised 9/8/21) will apply to this Contract.

3 - SPECIAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

3.1 - AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following Amendments to the Contract Terms and Conditions do hereby become a part hereof. In the event that an amendment conflicts with the Contract Terms and Conditions, the Amendment will prevail.

3.2 - FIRM FIXED-PRICE CONTRACT

The Contract is a Firm Fixed-Price Contract. The Contractor(s) is required to provide to the using agency supplies or services at the listed price(s) for the duration of the contract, and any extensions thereto.

3.3 - OPTIONS PRICING NOTE

Options prices bid are to be less than the manufacturer's suggested retail price(s) (MSRP). Bidder signifies by the completion of "Bid Certification" in their response that the option prices bid are less than MSRP. Bidders found to be over charging for options during bid evaluation may have those options deleted from any award. Bidders found to be over charging for options at the time of invoicing will be required to submit corrected invoices reflecting proper pricing.

Bidders must indicate whether an option item is included with the base unit, no additional charge, not available, or a price for the option. On the Item Grid, the following must be used to indicate one of those choices:

- Included with base unit or available at no additional charge: On the Item Grid, enter \$0.00
- Not available: On the Item Grid, mark "Yes' in the Decline column
- Price: On the Item Grid, enter the dollar value

3.3.1 - REQUIRED OPTIONS

Line items with a value greater than 0 in the "Units to Evaluate" are Required Options. Failure to offer a Required Option may deem your bid response not responsive and ineligible for award. Bidders must either, indicate the Required Option is included with the base unit or available at no additional charge by entering \$0.00, or providing a price. Bidders that decline a Required Option or respond with no cost but cannot provide this item may be deemed not responsive and ineligible for award.

3.3.2 - ADDITIONAL OPTION PACKAGES

3.3.3 - UNSPECIFIED OPTION PRICE

Any option not specified on the Item Grid will be made available to the ordering entities, following Contract award and DAS approval, at the Unspecified Option Price. If no Unspecified Option Price is provided by the Bidder, the State will assume that the price will be equal to the manufacture invoice. The Unspecified Option Price specified by the Bidder will not be used in the vehicle evaluation.



3.4 - TRANSPORTATION CHARGES

Any items(s) ordered from this Contract shall be delivered F.O.B. destination to any state agency or any political subdivision located within the State of Ohio as stated on the purchase order, at the rate per mile, per vehicle delivery charge as listed on the item page. When generating orders, contact the contractor and establish the total round trip miles for one (1) vehicle from dealers location, using the State of Ohio Official Highway Map, unless some other mutually agreed upon method is acceptable.

3.5 - MINIMUM DELIVERY CHARGE

This charge is to be used when the rate per mile per vehicle, as listed on the catalog, times the number of round-trip miles is less than the minimum delivery charge. The contractor may not bill for both the rate per mile, per vehicle and the minimum delivery charge.

3.6 - PLACEMENT OF ORDERS

Ordering entities are strongly encouraged to place orders as early as possible in the model year. 3.7 - PURCHASE ORDERS

The Purchase Orders for item(s) listed in this Contract will be placed directly with the contractor by the ordering agency. All purchases, made by state agencies only, will be placed using either the official State of Ohio Purchase Order or, by a purchase order issued by the State's third-party financing administrator. The State will not be obligated to pay for purchases of any supplies or services, made by any other method. No order shall specify delivery to exceed thirty (30) days beyond the expiration, termination, or cancellation date of the Contract. A Purchase Order will authorize the contractor to provide the required supplies or services and, upon delivery, acceptance and submission of a proper invoice, will obligate the ordering agency to pay for the supplies or services furnished by the contractor.

When applicable, purchase orders may be placed for delivery to the agency on a quarterly basis. Any orders issued prior to the expiration, termination, or cancellation date of the Contract, which require delivery up to ninety (90) days beyond the approved expiration, termination, or cancellation date are to be fulfilled by the contractor.

3.8 - SUBMISSION OF INVOICES

Refer to the Standard Contract Terms and Conditions; IV, Order and Payment Provisions. Invoices will not be issued prior to receipt of a purchase order.



3.9 - PAYMENT

During the term of this Contract, a third-party financing option will be made available to State agencies only; not to political subdivisions. The contractors (dealers) will be notified by the State to review the order to pay process utilized by the third-party administrator. Contractors will continue to receive payment in full; either from the State or the third-party administrator. If payment is received from the third-party administrator, the title to the vehicle is to (may) be forwarded to the third-party administrator. If a third-party administrator is used for payment, there could be a delay in receipt of payment.

It is unknown which agencies may purchase through a third-party administrator or quantity of vehicles being purchased. This payment method may increase the number of vehicles purchased. 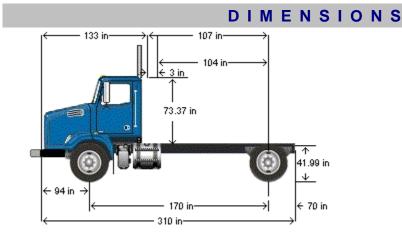

The Total Amount bid for each line item (as written or typed) was used to evaluate the bids to determine the "lowest bidder". The bid was above the Engineer's opinion of cost, however, given the bidding environment, supply chain issues and inflation, it is unlikely a rebid would result in a more favorable outcome.

We would like to get this on the next Council agenda for Council's consideration.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON PART 2 ADMINISTRATION CODE CHAPTER 232 DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE, AMENDING ORDINANCE 10-103 STAFFING AND CLASSIFICATION PLAN FOR THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON SECTION 4 FINANCE DEPARTMENT, AND AMENDING ORDINANCE 21-182 ESTABLISHING RATES OF COMPENSATION FOR NON UNION EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

- <u>WHEREAS</u>: Council and the Administration have determined that the position of Assistant Director of Finance should be created in the City of North Royalton; and
- <u>WHEREAS</u>: It is therefore necessary to amend the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Royalton, Part 2 Administration Code, Chapter 232 Finance Department; and
- <u>WHEREAS</u>: It is also necessary to amend Ordinance 10-103 Staffing and Classification Plan for the City of North Royalton to provide for the staffing of this position; and
- <u>WHEREAS</u>: It is further necessary to amend Ordinance 21-182 in order to establish the salary for the position of Assistant Director of Finance; and
- <u>WHEREAS</u>: Council desires to provide for these amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. Part 2 Administration Code, Chapter 232 Department of Finance of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Royalton is hereby amended to hereinafter read as follows:

232.10 ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF FINANCE

(a) Establishment. There is hereby established the position of *part time* Assistant Director of Finance. The Assistant Director of Finance shall work at the direction of, and under the supervision of, the Director of Finance. The Assistant Director of Finance shall be hired upon the recommendation of the Finance Director and approval by the Mayor.

(b) Responsibilities.

(1) Assist and Coordinate with the Independent Public Accountants with the A annual conversion of City's cash basis accounting records to GAAP basis records in accordance with GAGAS and Ohio Revised Code Compliance Guide requirements. This includes the creation and maintenance of individual fund working trial balances.

(2) Preparation review of all workpapers required to perform the GAAP conversion.

(3) Supervision and review of Finance Department staff with regards to preparation of GAAP workpapers.

(4) Preparation for the City's annual audit. This includes completion of audit preparation work and coordination of annual audit process with independent audit team.

(5) Assists the Director of Finance in compilation and periodic review of the City's annual fiscal budget.

(6) Assists the Director of Finance with annual preparation, filings and appropriate revisions of County reports such as Certificate of Estimated Resources, Annual Tax Budget, Annual Tax Rate Ordinance, etc.

(7) Completion of all other schedules, reports, etc. deemed necessary by the Director of Finance.

(8) All other duties as directed by the Director of Finance *or as set forth in the City's job description.*

(c) Qualifications.

(1) Bachelors Degree in accounting or related field.

(2) Valid State of Ohio Certified Public Accountant certificate, *preferred but not required*. This certificate must be kept current during employment by compliance with continuing professional education requirements.

(3) A minimum of 5 years previous experience in governmental/fund accounting. This includes preparation of GPFS and/or CAFR reports, and *assistance with* completion of GAAP conversions.

(4) Working knowledge of Ohio Revised Code compliance requirements, Yellow Book standards, GAAP procedures and GAGAS requirements.

(5) Proficiency with Excel/*Muni and ADP preferred* Lotus computer software.

Ability to work effectively with Finance Department staff, Director of (6) Finance and other City officials.

(7) Other requirements as set forth in the City's job description.

Section 2. Council hereby amends Ordinance No. 10-103, Staffing and Classification Plan, Section 4 Finance Department, which shall hereinafter read as follows:

The Finance Department may employ and be staffed by employees classified in the Section 4. following classifications providing that there shall be no greater number of employees employed in any one classification than specified herein.
