Ms. Carbone McDonald stated she wanted to make clear that she definitely supports safety as well as the safety for our residents. The one thing she is reluctant about, is that things were placed on social media saying that people's taxes were not going to be raised on this issue, which is a lie; because their taxes are going to be raised. She feels that we need to make that clear to the residents. She is for voting yes on this and letting the residents take over from there; in voting on it. She is all for the safety however, she thinks that we should be clear to the residents and let them know it will raise their taxes.

Mayor Antoskiewicz stated that he does not believe there has ever been an issue from his end or his Administration; that we would put anything out other than the true facts. He cannot control social media, nor can he control Facebook. He cannot control what people may or may not say however, he can tell you that from where he sits, as well as the Chief, that we will put out exactly what the issue is and what it does cost, which is what we have always done and will continue to do.

Ms. Carbone-McDonald stated that per her conversation with the Mayor yesterday, her main concern is the person that is a part of the City, and the problem she has is that residents are calling her talking about this; they want information when they are being told it will not raise their taxes, however, in actuality, it is, and she felt she has to be the bad guy. She stated that we need more clarification, but she is all for passing this and letting the residents vote on it; because in the long run, that is who it is about, the residents.

Mayor Antoskiewicz stated that if this passes tonight, we will be coming out with the literature and everything, and would be all based on the facts.

Chief Chegan stated that we did come out with the information last meeting, and he believes it was misdirected. He is not sure what social media information Ms. Carbone-McDonald is speaking of, because it was not the City and it was not the Fire Department.

Ms. Carbone-McDonald stated it was not.

Chief Chegan stated that is his point and he believes that is the Mayor's point as well. He presented for quite a long time, he believes all of that information was factual, and between the Finance Director and the Mayor, we put out all of the information that was needed. Unfortunately, two media sources had the information wrong; besides the social media. The Mayor and he will say, if you want the correct information, listen to what we spoke of at the meeting (Safety) and what we are going to put out; which is factual information. We already did 2 weeks ago, therefore, if we are listening to social media instead of what we put out, that is the 1st problem. He has been through many of these levies, and it is his part that he puts out precise information to give direction of where his department needs to go. We understand that certain people say that they do not want to raise taxes, and we never said this was not going to increase. If you look at the amount, it is very minimal to where we need to be. With that being said, there has to be factual sources; 2 weeks ago, we provided you all of the facts, thanks to the Finance Director and the Mayor. Unfortunately, people are looking to put their own word out on social media. We will continue to put out the correct information, as we did. You have the one page that the Finance Director provided, and all of the questions that Ms. Carbone-McDonald had; all of those were answered as well. He cautions in regard to where you obtain your information.

Ms. Carbone-McDonald expressed thanks to the Chief for that.

Mayor Antoskiewicz stated that once we get everybody that information and you see that on social media, please take the initiative to correct those individuals.

Ms. Carbone-McDonald stated she definitely will.

Mr. Nickell asked the Finance Director to clarify the 1.7m tax levy, because this is an actual replacement/renewal.

Ms. Esarey stated it is not a renewal, it is a replacement. 1.7m replacement levy, and there is a very slight tax increase that it true to the paperwork that was given. If you have a \$100k home, it would be an additional \$11.90 per year; not per month.

Chief Chegan stated that is the most difficult part for people to understand, what a renewal and a replacement is; what increases and what does not. We are very cognoscente of that. He and the Mayor have talked about this since last year when we did this, and the short time Ms. Esarey has been here, that you have the information and what a mill is verses the amount of money that is. We are willing to sit down with anyone in moving forward to clarify that, and we will also in all of the media outlet posts.

Mr. Nickell stated to Ms. Esarey that he understood there would be a small increase, and one reason for resubmitting it this way was to update the millage, because otherwise is it like the school levies where the House Bill holds everything at the same value so it cannot go up.

Ms. Esarey stated correct. 1.7m is a different value and that is what this Ordinance is doing; it is setting it at what the county says what 1.7m is valued at now; which is a different value than what it was when the City replaced it in 2017. Therefore, that is correct.

Mr. Nickell stated although unrelated, he does not want his taxes to increase more because with the new assessments, his has gone up almost \$500 a half, and even the public library charges him \$160 a year for taxes. He is glad they finally reopened.

Mr. Marnecheck stated he agrees, and he is glad we are putting this before the residents. He is confident that North Royalton residents will do their homework and have an educated vote.
