

**STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES
MARCH 1, 2022**

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on March 1, 2022 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:28 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approval of the February 1, 2022 Committee meeting minutes. Moved by Ms. Barath, seconded by Mr. Vos. Minutes were accepted.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Storm Water/Infrastructure Maintenance Monthly Report

Mr. Smith advised that everyone should have received the February report. There were no concerns at this time.

2. Maintenance Projects

Mr. Haselton provided an update on the Pinestream Storm Sewer project. Construction began last week. The first thing the contractor completed was to try to locate the waterline, to ensure that there was no conflict with the storm sewers. They found one location that was lower than we expected, in which we may have to modify the design and raise the waterline. Ms. Barath inquired about the time frame. Mr. Haselton believed it would be finished late Spring.

3. Turnpike Mitigation

Mr. Haselton reported that we are continuing to work on that project. There is a submittal next month to ODOT (Ohio Department of Transportation). Final engineering is not due until the end of the year; however, we will have incremental submittals between now and then.

4. York Road Property

Mr. Kelly advised that the lawsuits were filed, whereas we are trying to secure service upon all defendants. It is very likely that we will have to serve by publication, because some of them cannot be identified in terms of where they are. We expected many of them to be deceased. Since no probate estates were filed, we do not have a personal representative to serve. We are working on trying to secure service on all of the named defendants. He commented that it will take a long time. People will be coming out of this with very little; with so many owners.

6. Cleaning the Mains

Mr. Smith recapped that once the weather breaks, we will get back to doing the larger mains. We have acquired some equipment to help us.

Mr. Nickell raised question if we could look at the creek that goes between Hawley and Lynn Drive. Mr. Smith indicated that we can do that. Mayor Antoskiewicz noted that some of it was cleaned; what could be taken care of without a machine.

NEW BUSINESS

There was none.
