

STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES
APRIL 5, 2022

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on April 5, 2022 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approval of the March 1, 2022 Committee meeting minutes. Moved by Ms. Barath, seconded by Mr. Nickell. Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Storm Water/Infrastructure Maintenance Monthly Report

Mr. Smith summarized that all should have gotten an email of the jobs completed for the month of March, as well as the two action requests that were completed.

2. Maintenance Projects

Mr. Haselton advised that the Pinestream Development Storm Sewer Project is approximately 90% complete. They will potentially finish up this week on the storm sewers. Some restoration would be left later in the month, or the first part of May. He indicated it was going well.

3. Turnpike Mitigation

Mr. Haselton did submit stage 3 plans to ODOT (Ohio Department of Transportation) last week, which is progressing along. Construction is scheduled for 2024. The design should be completed this year, in which we may see if we can move that up; we could try to discuss that as we complete it.

4. York Road Property

Mr. Kelly had nothing new to report at this time. We are still waiting for the clerk's office to finish trying to make service on the defendants. We do have some contact from the lawyer in Cincinnati that is going to represent three more of the errs.

Ms. Barath inquired about the number of owners. Mr. Kelly recapped that it was between 12-15; not as many as we initially thought. He went on to say there are still a few that may not have been identified. Mr. Nickell asked if that eventually entails advertising in the paper. Mr. Kelly agreed that would be the plan in the future.

5. Cleaning the Mains

Mr. Smith reported that we will start at the beginning of this week or next week; on a Saturday to start cleaning some of the bigger mains. Saturdays work well when working with the crew, as Ms. Krejci inquired. Ms. Barath questioned the location that they would be working in. Mr. Smith was not fully certain. Once we get it established, he would let everyone know. Mr. Marnecheck inquired about whether the residents would be impacted at all. Mr. Smith clarified that they would not be. He noted that we have had less calls, therefore it is working.

Mayor Antoskiewicz added that we just finished the project on Gregory Lane and Hawley Drive. He pointed out that there were many tree roots in those lines. We were trying to soften the 90-degree angle; then they found all of the big tree roots sitting in there.

Mayor Antoskiewicz conveyed that we did file for a grant for the project, which would include Route 82 and North Akins; behind the houses that have had some big issues. Mr. Haselton clarified it is a Hazard Litigation Assistance Grant/pre-application that we submitted to the Ohio Emergency Management Agency on March 23rd. We should hear back in April. If the pre-application is a go, or not, we would submit a formal application; we estimate six months from that point until a grant is awarded. We used the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District, put together a report, and there was a project cost estimate; therefore, we used that. With this program, the City would pay 12.5% of the project. We should hear something this month, or within thirty days of submission. Mayor Antoskiewicz was hoping that we get past the pre-application process and get a regular application. He concluded that we are still out there looking for opportunities for that area, as we said we would do.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Barath noticed the work being starting on Sprague Road, which she inquired about. Mr. Haselton clarified that yes, they are getting closer to actually starting that project. Ms. Barath asked if they settled on closing Sprague. Mr. Haselton explained it will be one lane with a closure, in which the Mayor concurred it would stay one lane until the project is done.

ADJOURNMENT

Moved by Ms. Barath, seconded by Mr. Nickell **to adjourn the April 5, 2022 meeting.** Yeas: 3; Nays: 0.
Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:08 p.m.
