

**STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES
MAY 4, 2022**

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on May 4, 2022 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approval of the April 5, 2022 Committee meeting minutes. Moved by Ms. Barath, seconded by Mr. Nickell. Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Storm Water/Infrastructure Maintenance Monthly Report

Mr. Smith indicated that everyone should have received an e-mail with a rec form attachment, which he agreed to send again for those who conveyed they had not received it.

2. Maintenance Projects

Mr. Haselton reported that the Pinestream Storm Sewer Improvement Project was completed last week; ahead of schedule. He noted that residents have been very pleased with the contractor.

3. Turnpike Mitigation

Mr. Haselton advised that the Stage 3 plans were submitted to ODOT (Ohio Department of Transportation) last month and we received comments yesterday, in which he will be working through.

4. York Road Property

Mr. Kelly explained that Ms. Vozar had informed him that she was able to speak with an attorney for the one remaining Ohio resident heir. He went on to say that the lawyer has filed a notice of appearance in the lawsuit and we are anticipating that he will be filing an answer. Once he files an answer on behalf of his client, we will have served all of the Ohio heirs. We can then proceed with the assistance of the Clerk of Courts to serve all of the out of state heirs by publication; that will assist us in meeting our minimum requirement for having a jurisdiction and venue here in Cuyahoga County.

Mr. Marnecheck inquired about how long the Ohio heir has to file an answer. Mr. Kelly indicated he is likely, outside "the rule" however, in terms of this experience by virtue of his having filed a notice of appearance, he will be given at least thirty days to file an answer. It was communicated to Ms. Vozar that the lawyer had not received a copy of the complaint from his client, therefore we had our staff provide him with a copy of the complaint directly. In short, he has the complaint, he has filed a notice of appearance, and now we await his answer.

5. Cleaning the Mains

Mr. Smith advised that work would begin in the Oak Ridge area this weekend, and also cleaning of some of the bigger mains. They would be moving along to Spyglass Hill and cleaning and repairing some of the catch basins in that area. It is getting ready to be in-season.

Ms. Krejci spoke about awaiting some equipment from last year, whether it has been received. Mr. Smith commented that everything had been received.

Ms. Carbone-McDonald inquired about whether this type of work is only done on the weekends. Mr. Smith clarified that the big mains are cleaned on the weekends; which is less hassle. It does not take away from daily work. Ms. Krejci asked if that is over time on the weekends, in which Mr. Smith concurred.

Mayor Antoskiewicz reminded everyone that we had discussed this in the past, in hiring a contractor; which would have been extremely expensive. He felt that if we could obtain the equipment and pay some over time, we are still far ahead.

Mr. Nickell asked what was being cleaned, in which Mr. Smith explained that it entails the bigger mains; the storms. Ms. Barath mentioned a resident on Oak Ridge paying compliment about seeing the truck and the work being done.

Mr. Dietrich raised question about the size of calcium deposits and what they are made of; to help explain more to the residents in conversations, when discussing the bigger mains. Mr. Smith explained how large and solid such calcium deposits can be. They go in with a cutter and cut those out. Mr. Nickell spoke about pipes. Mr. Smith indicated that eventually they will get to everything.

NEW BUSINESS

There was none.

ADJOURNMENT
