

UTILITIES COMMITTEE MINUTES
JUNE 7, 2022

The Utilities Committee meeting was held on June 7, 2022 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 7:20 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approval of May 4, 2022 Committee minutes. Moved by Mr. Dietrich, seconded by Ms. Krejci. Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Inflow/Infiltration of Storm Water (I & I)

Mr. Smith reported we are still in the Villa Grande area doing dye testing. This will be for the majority of the summer months; most likely. We are going to be in the Valley Vista area as well. We have some things we are doing there and wanted to make sure that we do not have a lot of inflow and infiltration in that area.

Ms. Barath asked to clarify the location for the summer, in which she thought Villa Grande was one street. Mr. Smith explained that they are in Villa Grande because there are several different things that they are trying to get data for. He continued that there were six septic conversations; on Edgerton and State Road. There was one I & I repair; which was on Jupiter Drive.

Ms. Krejci asked to clarify if it was going to require all summer to do Villa Grande. Mr. Smith reiterated that it would not, however, they are going to be in that area for several things; it is really C District. They are in that area for two projects; trying to split a force main.

2. WW Treatment Plant B conversion

Mr. Smith advised that the surveyors are currently doing core drilling. We will have a progress meeting for this month, which was moved back a week, because we will be having an EPA inspection on Thursday; which we have not had one in five years. We are getting prepared for that inspection. They are moving along as planned for the conversion.

3. Street Lights on York Road (replacing)

Mayor Antoskiewicz provided an update that everything has now been given to First Energy. We felt that we have identified all of them. They have been given and we are just waiting for them to get their crew out. Light fixtures are something we are waiting on. We are waiting on our ball diamond projects as well. There are three intersections; traffic lights that have been given to traffic control to replace with LED's as well. Those will hopefully be getting done, which he signed off on. It is a matter of First Energy finishing up. He has no anticipated time line; however, it should not be much longer.

Ms. Krejci noted that she received calls by a resident often about the ones in Ward 3; on York Road, which have been repaired. She believed the only ones left are those on York Road in Ward 1. Mayor Antoskiewicz concurred. He added that they even worked with the contractor to get those on Sprague Road; which was an issue.

4. York Road Special Assessments – sanitary sewers

Mr. Haselton gave an update on the survey field work right of way; control drawings are all complete. We are hoping to get the finished base mapping next week and at that point, we can start our design.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Barath asked about the power outage that occurred mostly in Ward 2. Mayor Antoskiewicz was not sure as to the cause of that. He can get in touch with our contact; usually he gives us an automatic update, but he did not this time. He stated that he will call them and ask.
