

**STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES
OCTOBER 4, 2022**

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on October 4, 2022 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approval of the September 6, 2022 Committee meeting minutes. Moved by Ms. Barath, seconded by Mr. Nickell. Yeas: 3. Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Storm Water/Infrastructure Maintenance Monthly Report

Ms. Krejci expressed her appreciation to Mr. Smith for the report that included her ward.

2. Maintenance Projects

Mr. Haselton discussed the upcoming maintenance of the Dover Farms stormwater basins. He, along with the Stormwater Conservation District, have been pushing to get it maintained, as well as more storage volume achieved for the residents further downstream on Route 82. This is scheduled to be done this month. Ms. Barath asked if it has been started. Mr. Haselton indicated that it has not. He went on to say that the contractor met with Stormwater in the last couple of weeks, just to make sure they are aware of everything that needs to be done; now they are scheduling the work.

Mayor Antoskiewicz asked if they are doing all of theirs. Mr. Haselton agreed. Ms. Barath asked to clarify if that is making it larger. Mr. Haselton explained that yes, it has been filled in with some silt over time; therefore, by cleaning it out, they will get more volume. Mr. Marnecheck inquired if that is also referred to as dredging. Mr. Haselton concurred.

3. Turnpike Mitigation

Ms. Haselton reported that we are still working to do the design and access with the Turnpike. Everything is moving along smoothly.

4. York Road Property

Mr. Kelly advised that the efforts we have undertaken to secure service of the complaint and summons upon all of the defendants is nearly complete. He felt we may have completed it within the last week. Once we are satisfied that the legal requirements for service of summons have been completed, we can then proceed to ask the Clerk's office and the Court to order some additional service by publication for those individuals that cannot be served; because they are likely deceased. The requirements are the same; we will have to make an effort to serve those individuals. We have actually had some success in the last couple of weeks with two of the named defendants, one of which essentially asked us to file a document for her; which we did, recognizing that she is accepting service of summons. The other, involves a lawyer that we have been dealing with for months, whom finally filed on behalf of his client. We are making progress, but it is long and slow.

Ms. Barath inquired about the time line on this, which she thought it had already been a couple of years. Mr. Kelly believed it was around a year; perhaps a little longer.

5. Cleaning the Mains

Mr. Smith reported that we finished cleaning the mains in the York Delta Industrial Park. Currently, we are in the Patricia Drive and Garden side area, where we will work until completion.

Mr. Marnecheck questioned if they would be there for a while. Mr. Smith indicated that it depends on weather and equipment. Mr. Dietrich wanted to know what his next move is after Ward 1; being a five-year plan. Mr. Smith stated that at this time we are going to the spots that we believe need the most attention; we are not playing it down by Ward. He concluded that some of the spots that we are going to do have likely never been done.

NEW BUSINESS

There was none.
