

STORM WATER COMMITTEE MINUTES
MAY 2, 2023

The Storm Water Committee meeting was held on May 2, 2023 at North Royalton City Hall, 14600 State Road. The meeting was called to order at 6:14 p.m.

4. York Road Property

Mr. Kelly reported that we are awaiting one last signature on the final agreed entry. Once received, we will be able to file it with the court. We expect that the court will make the appropriate order and give us the title to the property. Mr. Nickell inquired about why they have not signed. Mr. Kelly mentioned that it was logistics; the lawyer is moving slow in this instance as well.

Mr. Marnecheck asked about the next step, whether there are other plans in place once we finally have the land. Mayor Antoskiewicz indicated the ultimate plan would be for us to look at the property, which expands the amount that we own there. The next step would be to have someone come in and look at the area, perhaps to see if we could do some type of retention to slow down the process coming down into that end of the City, where we have always had issues; such as, on Vivian Drive. He went on to say that the resident there actually gets the pre-existing coming in from two different areas. The initial thought was that it was a nice little piece of property and it should not be too complex to obtain it; however, it is taking a while. The ultimate plan would have been to look at Elmwood. Eventually, we want to look at that and see what we can do to help the situation there. The Mayor felt that it would help the people across the street on York Road as well.

As discussion ensued, Mr. Marnecheck wanted to know if this would be something that we could use community cost share for; with the Regional Sewer. Mayor Antoskiewicz mentioned perhaps; we are uncertain as to the way we would go yet. The first step was to see if we could get the property. He concluded that we can look and see what the next best course would be to deal with it and bring it to Council.

5. Cleaning the Mains

Mr. Smith reported that we have completed Hunter's Creek and Vista. We are currently on Prince Charles Drive and will be there for a little while. He would keep everyone updated as to where they will be.

6. NEORSD projects update

Ms. Barath moved to have NEORSD projects update removed from the Storm Water Committee Agenda, seconded by Mr. Nickell. Vote: Yeas: 3 Nays: 0. **Motion carried.**

7. NEORSD projects update

Ms. Haselton reported on the Sprague Road culvert replacement. The contactor, Tri Mor, has had roughly 4 ½ days of actual work; due to the rain. He continued that 75% of the existing structure has been removed and the water line has been lowered. They hope to begin setting the new structure next week, then the project directly downstream; the property that the district owns. That stream restoration would occur in July. Ms. Barath suggested that any additional signage would be greatly appreciated; she had received a couple of calls from residents.
