ORDINANCE NO. 18-61

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FIRE FIGHTERS, AFL-CIO LOCAL 2156, REPEALING ORDINANCE 18-28, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: Council and the Administration have conducted negotiations with the International Association of Fire Fighters, AFL-CIO, Local 2156 as the bargaining representative for certain members of the Fire Department; and

WHEREAS: Such negotiations have provided a tentative agreement between the parties; and

WHEREAS: Council and the Administration have reviewed such proposal and do desire to ratify and adopt such Agreement, and repeal Ordinance 18-28.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with the Association of Fire Fighters, AFL-CIO, Local 2156 pursuant to terms and conditions approved by the Director of Law and substantially similar to a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. Ordinance 18-28 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 3. Any and all ordinances in conflict with the express provisions of this Agreement are superseded by this Agreement.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were passed in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such actions were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city and for the further reason that in order to facilitate payment of compensation to certain employees of the city, the foregoing Ordinance is required at the earliest possible time.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
