

# THE CITY COUNCIL OF NORTH ROYALTON, OHIO

ORDINANCE NO. 22-175

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 22-167 TO CONFIRM THE SALE OF 55 PIECES OF GOLD/JEWELRY FORFEIT TO THE CITY BY COURT ORDER TO SHEIBAN JEWELERS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7,200.00, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: By court order, 55 pieces of gold jewelry have been forfeited to the City of North Royalton; and

WHEREAS: The pieces are of random size and weight and not readily saleable by auction or by individual item; and

WHEREAS: In Ordinance 22-167, Council authorized the sale of the gold to Sheiban Jewelers for \$8500.00; and

WHEREAS: On October 24, 2022, the representative of the Police Department delivered the gold to the jewelry company and was paid and accepted \$7,200 as the price of gold had diminished on the market; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to confirm and accept the sale at the reduced price.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Council hereby amends Ordinance 22-167 by confirming and accepting the sale of the forfeited gold to Sheiban Jewelers in the sum of \$7,200.00.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to confirm the sale at the market price and avoid any further diminishment of the value thereof.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
