AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 22-60 WHICH AUTHORIZED THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) 5 TON TANDEM DUMP TRUCK FOR THE NORTH ROYALTON WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT THROUGH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PURCHASING CONTRACT FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$170,538.00 BY INCREASING THE NOT TO EXCEED COST BY AN ADDITIONAL \$6,700.00, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: Council has authorized the purchase of one (1) vehicle for the North Royalton Wastewater Department through the Ohio Department of Transportation Purchasing Contract for an amount not to exceed \$170,538.00; and

WHEREAS: Due to continued challenging global and domestic economic conditions, it is therefore necessary to implement an additional pricing surcharge; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to amend Ordinance 22-60 to reflect the increase in cost of \$6,700.00, and establish a new not to exceed cost of \$177,238.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Ordinance 22-60 is hereby amended to implement an additional pricing surcharge in the amount of \$6,700.00 and establish a new not to exceed cost of \$177,238.00, as further outlined in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. Ordinance 22-60 is hereby amended as provided for herein and all other provisions of Ordinance 22-60 shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to amend Ordinance 22-60 in order to implement an additional pricing surcharge.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
