AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT WITH FEMA, ADMINISTERED BY OHIO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY FOR THE SOIL STABILIZATION PROJECT EAST OF THE INTERSECTION OF ROYALTON ROAD AND NORTH AKINS ROAD; PHASE 1-SURVEY AND DESIGN, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The City of North Royalton has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$84,075.00 from FEMA, administered by Ohio Emergency Management Agency for the Soil Stabilization project east of the intersection of Royalton Road and North Akins Road; Phase 1-Survey and Design; and

WHEREAS: It is therefore necessary to enter into an agreement with FEMA, administered by Ohio Emergency Management Agency for this grant award; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to authorize the Mayor to enter into this agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant award agreement with FEMA, administered by Ohio Emergency Management Agency for the Soil Stabilization project east of the intersection of Royalton Road and North Akins Road; Phase 1-Survey and Design, pursuant to terms and conditions as approved by the Director of Law and substantially similar to a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Mayor to enter into a grant award agreement with FEMA, administered by Ohio Emergency Management Agency.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
