ORDINANCE NO. 24-36

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CHIEF OF POLICE TO ACCEPT A GRANT FROM THE OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE FOR THE 2022-2023 OHIO LAW ENFORCEMENT BODY ARMOR PROGRAM, TO SUPPORT LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$11,407.50, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The City of North Royalton has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$11,407.50 from the Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program; and

WHEREAS: This grant award is to be applied towards the reimbursement of purchased Bullet Proof Vests to Support Law enforcement Agencies; and

WHEREAS: Council desires to authorize the Mayor and Chief of Police to accept the grant from the Ohio Attorney General's Office for the 2022-2023 Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program to Support Law enforcement Agencies described.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Council hereby ratifies and authorizes the Mayor and Chief of Police to accept the grant award from the Ohio Attorney General's Office through the Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program for Bullet Proof Vests to Support Law Enforcement Agencies in accord with the terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein and subject to approval by the Director of Law.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to confirm and accept the grant from the Ohio Attorney General's Office through the Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program in the amount of \$11,407.50 in order to comply with the conditions of the award.

THEREFORE, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
