A RESOLUTION URGING THE OHIO LEGISLATURE TO ADOPT HOUSE BILL 321,
REQUIRING THE STATEWIDE 911 STEERING COMMITTEE
TO ESTABLISH A STATEWIDE SPECIAL NEEDS DATABASE,
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: The 135th General Assembly of the State of Ohio is presently considering House Bill 321; and

WHEREAS: If enacted, House Bill 321 will require the Statewide Steering Committee to establish a special needs database that can be accessed for emergency responders who respond to an emergency prior to arriving at the location to allow them to have a better understanding of how to communicate with those involved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. That the Council of the City of North Royalton, the Mayor and the Officers of the Administration, do hereby urge the Ohio General Assembly to promptly enact House Bill 321 in order to establish a special needs database that can be accessed for emergency responders who respond to an emergency prior to arriving at the location to allow them to have a better understanding of how to communicate with those involved.

Section 2. That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and instructed to forward copies of the Resolution to Governor Mike DeWine, District 24 State Senator Matt Dolan, District 23 State Senator Nickie Antonio, District 15 State Representative Richard Dell'Aquila, District 14 State Representative Sean Brennan, and sponsors of HB321 Representative Gary Click and Representative Brian Lorenz and the Clerks of Council in communities surrounding North Royalton.


Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the city, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for emergency service providers to respond to an emergency to have a better understanding on how to communicate with those involved if they have special needs and are listed in the database.

THEREFORE, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
