REPORTS

Recreation Department: Jason Swim – Mr. Swim discussed the updated recognized organization requirements – they are going to require cyber insurance and are eliminating the \$5 fee per participant. There was discussion about how long an organization should retain registration forms – Mr. Swim said he thought it was 5 years, but he would verify with legal. Mr. DiSiena asked for a clarification for the proper liability release language for registration forms. Mr. Swim is getting ready for spring.

In other District news the Financial department was once again awarded the Auditor of State Award of Distinction for a clean audit and financial reporting. The Dept. has earned this award every year it has been presented since 2010. We also received word that all five buildings in the District have received the Purple Star Designation from the Ohio Department of Education. Our five buildings are the only schools to receive the award in Cuyahoga County which recognizes our schools for our commitment to aiding military-connected families.

In construction news, the calm start to the winter has allowed Hammond Construction to get a real leg up on both the Elementary and High School sites. Additional steel has been erected and some progress has been made externally over and above the original goal of buttoning up the common areas at the ES. Work continues on infrastructure internally. At the High School both floors of the building now have poured concrete and work is moving along on internal room layouts and the placement of studs for individual rooms and installation of drywall.

We are finalizing the furniture and classroom equipment orders for the High School and expect to be approving those contracts in February. Initial base bids came in just under projection; so we are evaluating and perhaps choosing some alternates to finalize the purchase.
