History

The City Pool was constructed in the 1960's. The pool, through many upgrades, remained a "z" shaped pool, which served the citizens of North Vernon and surrounding areas for more than 50 years. In the mid-2000's, the concrete flooring started deteriorating and a liner was installed to add life to the pool. In 2016, as the liner neared the end of its life, discussions of a new pool facility started.

NEW

In 2017, a pool committee was formed and asked to bring a plan forth to City Council concerning the future of the pool. At that time, a feasibility study was completed through public meetings, surveys and cost analysis of upgrades versus new construction. At the completion of the study, the determination was made to move forward with new construction. After many meetings, surveys and visits to other communities, a proposed aquatic center was developed, which will include both a pool with many amenities and an adjacent splash pad.
