1. Call Meeting to Order: Chairwoman Nordman called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. Present: Fox, Gillis, Kenney, Miller, Oltmanns, Reising, Williams, Youman and Nordman. Others Present: Finfrock, Sheriff Brian VanVickle and Coroner Lou Finch. Absent: None.
2. Approval of Minutes – August 8, 2023: Motion by Kenney to approve, 2nd by Gillis. Motion carried.
3. Public Comment: None.
4. County Board Claims:
 - Buildings and Grounds: \$32,210.01 - Motion by Youman to approve, 2nd by Kenney. Motion carried.
 - Utilities: Electric - \$22,614.70. Motion by Fox to approve, 2nd by Youman. Motion carried. NICOR - \$3,019.90. Motion by Kenney to approve, 2nd by Youman. Motion carried. Water - \$2,326.70. Motion by Fox to approve, 2nd by Gillis. Motion carried.

5. Department Claims:

Nordman stated the department claims have been reviewed.

- Coroner: \$7,355.21: Motion by Fox to approve, 2nd by Youman. Motion carried. Coroner Finch reported 52 deaths since the last committee meeting.
 - IT: \$3,235.50. Motion by Youman to approve, 2nd by Williams. Motion carried.
6. County Security: Sheriff Brian VanVickle stated the City of Oregon building was more than what he wanted to spend. He stated he is looking at other options. VanVickle touched on the monthly stats presented. Youman questioned the gas bill being down. VanVickle stated it is a reflection of miles patrolled. Fox asked about the status of the new drug unit. VanVickle stated one just finished the academy but does not see it up and running until the first of the year. Nordman asked about Boss using drones for the various county facilities. VanVickle is not aware. Nordman stated she will follow-up with maintenance. VanVickle updated the committee on the status of the new vehicles and the cost of equipping the vehicles. VanVickle stated he is going to replace a 2011 truck being use by the maintenance department. He is working with local dealers to see if they can match or beat the State bid. Kenney asked with the SAFE-T Act beginning this month will there be any moving around of correction staff. VanVickle stated there will not. The facility is 44,000 square feet and there is a need to have 3 correctional officers to run the facility. VanVickle stated he has talked to the State’s Attorney and they are not sure of how big the population

reduction will be. There is a meeting scheduled with the U.S. Marshalls in about two weeks, stated VanVickle.

7. IT Department: None.
8. County Facilities: Nordman discussed the construction needed in the Public Defender's Office to divide the former Law Library into two office spaces. This would allow for the public defenders to have their own space for the clients. There was only one bid of \$50,000 received. There was discussion about the cost of the remodeling and using ARPA funds if they are available. Nordman will need to see if the ARPA money is available for this project. There was discussion about the ventilation system, HVAC, and sprinklers that are not in this bid. Griffin asked if this should be run by the architect and see if it is in the ballpark. Nordman asked Griffin to have LRP look into this further.

11. New Business:
 - Safety Committee: Williams stated they are working on an emergency plan to cover various safety issues. Information was distributed and there will be surveys sent to gather more information. Gillis asked if OEMA has been asked. Williams stated he has not been contacted.
 - Storm Damage: Reising asked if the roofs on the various county buildings have been inspected by BOSS. Nordman stated yes, BOSS has inspected the roofs but they are waiting for information from them.
12. Adjournment: With no further business, Chairwoman Nordman adjourned the meeting.
