Dear Council:

The attached resident-petitioners strongly, respectfully, request that you heed our wishes that your body vote against marijuana facilities in Oxford Village. Please opt out.

We appreciate the work you have put into this issue over two years and hope that you see fit to appreciate the people's stance after our own research and deliberation, and, in some cases, quick study after just hearing about the proposed I-1 use areas.

While each of us has his or her own personal opinion on marijuana, medical and recreational—and yours and our opinions may often converge, surprisingly—we hope you will decide this issue based on sound public policy which includes factual benefit to the community and representation of Village voters. We 242 signers, after just four days of canvassing a cross-section of the community you represent, strongly encourage and expect Council to listen to and respect our wishes.

In summary, we appreciate your deliberation on matters other than this marijuana issue, a tiring and expensive encumbrance of your time—with knowledge that 85% of voters canvassed in this study are against adult-recreational-use marijuana businesses in our Village for reasons stated on each of the 32 pages of the attached petition—so, please, do not cater to the minority, and vote to opt out.
