Palm Beach Shores to Commemorate 20th Anniversary of September 11

The Town of Palm Beach Shores will commemorate the 20th anniversary of September 11, 2001, Mayor Alan Fiers has announced. The commemoration will take place on Saturday, September 11 at 11 o'clock at Palm Beach Shores Town Hall, 247 Edwards Lane. All are welcome. The commemoration is non-political.

Social distancing and covid protocols will be observed.

The commemoration will include representatives from the US Marine Corps Color Guard, the Mounted Troop from Palm Beach Sheriff's Office District 20 and the Palm Beach Shores Fire Department. Local faith leaders will share spiritual reflections.

The Marine Corps Color Guard will present and post colors, taps will be played and the flag will be lowered. Mayor Fiers will lead the gathering in a moment of silence. "Amazing Grace" will be performed by a bag piper. The flag will be raised at the conclusion of the ceremony.

"The commemoration gives us a chance to come together as a community and reflect in a solemn and thoughtful way on the 20th anniversary of a day that will live forever in our history," said Mayor Fiers. "Everyone remembers where they were the morning of September 11, 2001." The Mayor emphasized that the event is non-political.

Parking is limited in front of town hall. For this event, parking will be allowed on Edwards Lane. Light refreshments will be served by the Property Owners Association outside under a tent.
