



# ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE SATURDAY, MARCH 11 - KICKOFF



The Town of Palm Beach Shores will be celebrating St. Patrick's Day with its Annual Parade on **Saturday, March 11 - kick-off from the Community Center at 11 am sharp!**

Mayor Alan Fiers has announced that Chris and Von Mielke will be the 2023 Grand Marshals. Fire Chief Trevor Steedman is Parade Chairman.

The parade will be lead out by the Honor Guard from the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Department and the American Legion.

The parade line-up will include the Town of Palm Beach Shores civic groups - Property Owners Association, Seasideers, Volunteer Fire Department Ladies Auxiliary, and Singer Island Rotary. Past Grand Marshals will also be present.

Janet Kortenhaus, Tracy Larcher, Scott McCranels, and Brian Tyler will represent the Town Commission. The United States Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 51 will also be in the parade line-up.

Local citizen groups will also be participating, including Inlet Beach Club, 33 Ocean Ave., Ocean Pointe Marriott, Marching K-Zoo & Plungers, and Sugar Sands Sham Rockers.

The parade will exit left from the Community Center down Ocean Avenue, right onto Inlet Way, right onto Atlantic Avenue, right onto Bamboo Road, and returning to Ocean Avenue back to the Community Center. Following the parade will be a barbecue at the Community Center sponsored by the Sailfish Marina.
