ARREST MADE IN CONNECTION WITH AUGUST 10, 2021 SHOOTING INVESTIGATION

PASSAIC, NEW JERSEY:

August 11, 2021

Passaic County Prosecutor Camelia M. Valdes and Passaic Police Chief Luis A. Guzman announce that based upon an investigation by the Passaic Police Department, Jared Stack, 19-years-old, from Passaic, New Jersey, was arrested in relation to a shooting incident that took place August 10, 2021 in the area of Paulison Avenue and Broadway in Passaic, New Jersey. Jared Stack is charged with Aggravated Assault, Second Degree; Possession of a Weapon, Second Degree; Unlawful Possession of a Weapon, Second Degree; and Receiving Stolen Property, Third Degree.

On August 10, 2021, at approximately 2:46 p.m., members of the Passaic Police Department responded to the area of Paulison Avenue and Broadway after they were advised of a shooting. Upon arrival, police located a potential crime scene, but no victim was identified. Based upon the investigation, it was determined that Jared Stack had brandished a handgun and fired it at two unidentified individuals who were not struck.

Shortly following the incident, members of the Passaic Police Department arrested Jared Stack in the area of Lincoln Street in Passaic. Police recovered a stolen 9 millimeter handgun, which Jared Stack had discarded before his arrest.

The sentencing exposure for Jared Stack on Second Degree Aggravated Assault is 5-10 years New Jersey State Prison with 85% of that term to be served before parole eligibility pursuant to the No Early Release Act and three years parole supervision; on Second Degree Possession of a Weapon for an Unlawful Purpose it is 5-10 years New Jersey State Prison with 42 months of parole ineligibility pursuant to the Graves Act; on Second Degree Unlawful Possession of a Weapon it is 5-10 years New Jersey State Prison with 42 months of parole ineligibility pursuant to the Graves Act; and on Third Degree Receiving Stolen Property, it is 3-5 years New Jersey State Prison.

The State intends to file a motion for pretrial detention that will be heard by a Superior Court Judge.

A criminal complaint is merely an accusation. Despite this accusation, defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
