PASSAIC COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ADMINISTER NALOXONE IN PATERSON ON JANUARY 22, 2017

PATERSON, NEW JERSEY:

January 25, 2017

Passaic County Prosecutor Camelia M. Valdes and Paterson Police Deputy Chief Troy Oswald announce that law enforcement officers in Passaic County administered Naloxone to one subject on January 22, 2017. Naloxone is a medicine administered by way of a spray into the subject's nostrils to counteract an opioid overdose.

Paterson police officers deployed Naloxone at 12:42 a.m. to a 34 year old female who resides in Little Falls, New Jersey. When officers arrived at the location, the subject was observed to be unresponsive and not breathing. Officers administered one dose of Naloxone and the subject became responsive but remained sedated. Care of the subject was transferred to local emergency medical services.

Responding officers reported observing five (5) glassine bags stamped "DOGG FOOD" containing alleged heroin at the scene.

Since 2014, members of law enforcement in Passaic County have received training in the administration of Naloxone to respond to suspected opiate overdoses. This incident is the ninth (9th) Naloxone deployment in Passaic County in 2017.
