PATERSON MAN ARRESTED FOR SELF-INFLICTED GUNSHOT WOUND IN CONNECTION WITH APRIL 10, 2018 SHOOTING INVESTIGATION

PATERSON, NEW JERSEY:

April 11, 2018

Passaic County Prosecutor Camelia M. Valdes and Paterson Police Chief Troy Oswald announce that based upon an investigation by the Paterson Police Department, in conjunction with the Passaic County Prosecutor's Office, Arrie Moore, a 46-year-old Paterson resident, was arrested on April 11, 2018, in relation to a shooting incident that took place April 10, 2018, in the area of Summer Street Paterson, NJ.

Mr. Moore is charged with Unlawful Possession of a Handgun, Second Degree; Certain Persons Not to Have Weapons, Second Degree; and Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution, Third Degree.

On April 10, 2018 at approximately 8:14, p.m., members of the Paterson Police Department responded to the area of Summer Street Paterson, NJ on a report of a shooting victim lying on the sidewalk. Upon arrival the police located 46-year-old male Paterson resident who sustained a non-fatal gunshot wound. The male later identified as Arrie Moore was immediately transported to the Saint Joseph's Regional Medical Center in Paterson for treatment.

The investigation has revealed and it is alleged that Mr. Moore shot himself. More information will be released once it becomes available.

The sentencing exposure for Mr. Moore on Second Degree, Unlawful Possession of a Handgun is 5-10 years New Jersey State Prison with a minimum of 42 months before parole eligibility pursuant to the Graves Act; on Second Degree Certain Persons Not to Have Weapons it is 5-10 years New Jersey State Prison with a minimum of 5 years before parole eligibility; and on Third Degree Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution it is 3-5 years New Jersey State Prison.

Mr. Moore is scheduled to appear at Central Judicial Processing (CJP) Court located at 77 Hamilton Street in Paterson on Wednesday, April 11, 2018, at 1:30 p.m. The State intends to file a motion seeking the defendant's pretrial detention which will be heard by a Superior Court Judge.

A criminal complaint is merely an accusation. Despite an accusation, defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
