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SCDOT requests public comment on the 2021-2027 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program to include bridge replacement projects in Orangeburg, Greenville, Lancaster, and Chester Counties

Columbia, S.C. (May 16, 2024) - The South Carolina Department of Transportation seeks public comment on the action to amend the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program to include the preliminary engineering, right of way, and construction phases of work for four bridge replacement projects in Orangeburg, Greenville, Lancaster, and Chester Counties. SCDOT will receive public comment for a 21-day period from May 16, 2024 through June 6, 2024.

The proposed project in Orangeburg County is the replacement of a 60-foot bridge on S-92 (Ebenezer Rd) over Cow Castle Creek. The project cost is \$4,725,000.00. The proposed project in Greenville County is the replacement of S-507 (Brooks Avenue) over Langston Creek. The project cost is \$4,645,000.00. The proposed project in Lancaster County is the replacement of a 150-foot bridge on S-29-20 over Camp Creek. The project cost is \$3,670,000.00. The proposed project in Chester County is the replacement of a 75-foot bridge on S-12-50 over Tributary to Fishing Creek. The project cost is \$2,740,000.00. The purpose of these projects is to address structural deficiencies to meet current standards.
