0. <u>Legislative Update by Senator Jason Rarick</u>

State Senator Jason Rarick provided an overview of the 2022 legislative session. Senator Rarick reviewed that the Veterans bill and Agriculture bills passed enabling funding for some veteran services, and broadband and drought relief. Senator Rarick also provided an update on probation funding, PILT (payment in lieu of taxes) funding, SSIS paperwork reduction, and county program aid.

1. Transportation Committee Report

Commissioner Waldhalm provided an overview of the June 29, 2022 Transportation Committee meeting including Bruno Maintenance Shop Soil Remediation, State Aid Advance Funding, 2022 Project Schedules, the 2023-2027 Highway Improvement Plan, Master Partnership Agreement with MnDOT, and ATV traffic in Willow River.

County Engineer Mark LeBrun stated his department is implementing county state aid street projects in 2022 which will require funds in excess of those available in the State Aid Regular/Municipal Construction Account. LeBrun requested approval for an advance of funds to complete the projects this year.

Motion by Commissioner Lovgren to approve Resolution 2022-37, County State Aid Highway Funds Advance in the amount of \$2,538,122.26, and authorize Board Chair and County Administrator to sign. Second by Commissioner Waldhalm. Motion carried 5-0. County Engineer Mark LeBrun stated a master contract is necessary between Pine County and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) to allow MnDOT to pay Pine County or Pine County to pay MnDOT to perform certain projects.

Motion by Commissioner Lovgren to approve Resolution 2022-38 authorizing the county to enter into a Master Partnership Contract with the Minnesota Department of Transportation, and authorizing the County Engineer to negotiate work order contracts pursuant to the Master Contract. Authorize Board Chair and County Administrator to sign the resolution and contract. Second by Commissioner Mohr. Motion carried 5-0.

1.1 **Health Insurance Committee Report**

Commissioner Lovgren and Chair Hallan provided an overview of the June 30, 2022 Health Insurance Committee meeting. At that meeting Justin Kroeger, Insurance Representative from Gallagher, provided an update on county employee medical claims usage, together with the UHC renewal offer and proposals from Medica and Blue Cross Blue Shield. United Healthcare has proposed an 18% increase for 2023. BCBS has given a proposal with an 8.2% increase. If the county leaves UHC, \$6,700 in administrative fees and \$18,334 in wellness dollars would be required to be returned. Justin will continue with additional negotiations with carriers and request their best and final proposals by mid-July. A decision on providers will be made in August. Justin also reminded the committee of the transition of HSA/VEBA/FSA accounts from Further to Medsurety, effective September 1, 2022, and the unavailability of these accounts beginning August 18, 2022 through the September 1, 2022. The Medsurety accounts will become active approximately September 6, 2022.

3.2. MEnD Contract Cancellation

Motion by Commissioner Ludwig to terminate the contract with MeND Correctional Healthcare. Second by Commissioner Lovgren. Motion carried 5-0.

3.3. Advanced Correctional Healthcare, Inc. (ACH)

Jail Administrator Rod Williamson explained the Sheriff's Office currently contracts for inmate medical services in the jail with MeND Correctional Healthcare and is requesting to terminate services due to MeND facing legal issues, ethics concerns, and poor health care in other facilities. Jail Administrator Williamson then reviewed the services to be provided with Advanced Correctional Healthcare (ACH) and requested to enter into a contract with ACH, effective upon ending the contract with MeND. The cost of medical services will increase approximately \$35,000 annually, from \$334,280 with MeND to \$369,698 with ACH.

Motion by Commissioner Mohr to enter into a contract with Advanced Correctional Healthcare (ACH). Second by Commissioner Lovgren. Motion carried 5-0.

Dear Counties of Minnesota,

Each spring the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council (LSOHC) solicits habitat conservation project proposals to be considered for funding recommendation to the MN Legislature. This letter is to alert you to proposals that could have projects within your county if they are successful in receiving LSOHC recommendation for funding and ultimate legislative approval of funding during the upcoming 2022 legislative session.

In accordance with MN Statute 97A.056, Subd. 3(j), this letter and the attached spreadsheet document are to comply with statutory direction that the LSOHC "provide counties with a list of project proposals that include potential fee title land acquisitions in the county that is based on that year's funding requests received by the council from nongovernmental organizations."

The attached spreadsheet document lists project proposals with potential fee-title activity within each county. The spreadsheet also provides the following link,

https://www.lsohc.mn.gov/FY2024/Requests/index_list.html, that will bring you to a page on the LSOHC website where the respective detailed project proposals are all listed and hyperlinked. From there you can access the individual project proposal accomplishment plans containing each project's individual information.

In our effort to provide each county board with additional information beyond fee title acquisition activities, the spreadsheet document also lists project proposals with potential easement acquisition activities as well as restoration and enhancement activities within each county.

With this information in mind, it is important to remember that these project proposals have not yet received a recommendation for funding by the LSOHC, nor recommendation to the Legislature. They are simply "proposals" currently, and this is the beginning of the process through which they are requesting funding. Consequently, I urge you to consider reaching out to the program managers of project proposals that propose activity in your county. The program managers will be able to provide you with detailed information including why, where, and how they hope to accomplish habitat work. Hopefully, increasing communication between county boards and nongovernmental organizations who propose working in your county will provide greater knowledge, transparency, and overall collaboration.

Additionally, the LSOHC invites your County Board's feedback regarding the program proposals seeking Outdoor Heritage Fund (OHF) funding for work in your county. The LSOHC will conduct proposal hearings on September 12-14, 2022. To be of greatest impact we suggest any feedback be submitted

prior to the hearings. It is our hope that this opportunity will increase communication and lead to stronger and more widely supported project proposals in the future.

Ultimately, the Council's statutory charge is to provide recommendations to the Legislature for the use of OHF monies to protect, restore, and enhance Minnesota's wildlife habitat resources to the benefit of future generations. With that responsibility in mind, the Council continuously strives to increase communication and promote inclusion of diverse partnerships. Your involvement and feedback can help the Council come to the best decisions.

Additionally, if your county agencies are interested in the potential of seeking OHF funding for a future project proposal, LSOHC members and staff are always available to discuss your ideas, offer suggestions, and offer our guidance. Annual funding recommendations exceed \$100 million. The opportunity for funding habitat related projects for your county is here, but we won't know your needs without a proposal.

1. Call to Order

The meeting commenced by Reese Frederickson at 4:01 pm.

2. Addition/Changes to the Agenda, Approval

Karen proposed to add the 2nd Quarter Financial Report to the agenda. Motion to approve revised agenda by Terry Lovgren, seconded by Tim Burkhardt. Motion carried.

3. Review Minutes of May 9, 2022

Becky Foss moved to accept the 5/9/22 meeting minutes. Stef Youngberg seconded the motion, and the minutes were accepted.

4. Financial Report - Coalition

2nd Quarter fund bottom line balance is \$13,800.90. The coalition received \$188.54 in statutory fees collected from felony and gross misdemeanor drug convictions. \$1,116 was spent for the HF Positive Jags' youth group to purchase prom t-shirts.

5. Reese Frederickson - Coalition Direction for the Future

Deferred to Jenae Hicks to present and discuss the Opioid Settlement, that being a key driver of future projects.

6. Jenae Hicks - Opioid Settlement

- **a.** \$300 million will be distributed in MN over 18 years. 75% of funds will go to local communities and 25% to the state, being overseen by OERAC (Opioid Epidemic Response Advisory Council). A little less than \$70,000/year will be given to Pine County. Local public health departments will lead community efforts.
- **b.** The coalition and Pine County Public Health will discuss how to use funds. Guiding principles were given to ensure recipients use the funds most effectively. Prevention will be one abatement strategy in this community. It was noted that it is not to be used for things we are already doing but could supplement.
- **c.** Comments from the group:
 - Becky The core abatement strategies fit nicely into what the coalition is trying to achieve.
 - Matt At one time EMS started collecting data that included mapping and trends. It's possible they would start again. As of today, Pine Co. has had 29 opioid overdoses and 2 deaths in 2022.
 - Reese We may get ideas from other jurisdictions to help us choose projects to focus our efforts on.

• Terry – Will be attending NACo conference in Colorado as a member of the telecommunications and technology committee. It's also an opportunity to visit the FRC sites.

7. Becky Foss - 2021 DAANES Report

- **a.** DAANES is the Drug and Alcohol Abuse Normative Evaluation System reported as a comparison of county to state numbers and percentages. Information is collected when people are formally assessed for substance abuse and is gathered into a report. Pine County residents are counted regardless of where they receive treatment.
- **b.** Noted overdose deaths in Pine County:
 - 2019 4
 - 2020 15
 - 2021 12
- **c.** 399 residents entered treatment, 1.4% of the population. Within the state, 1% of the population.
 - Majority treated in a non-residential setting
 - Pine County is higher for long-term residential than the state
 - 42% were aged 25-34, the highest age group in the county and higher than the state percentage
 - 50% meth
 - 22% alcohol
 - 19% heroin, 9% marijuana
 - Of concern In Pine County, 49.7% is meth treatment compared to 28.5% in the state
 - Child Protection involvement was 13.8% in the county, 8.8 % in the state. Encouraged that the county is acting when needed.
 - Criminal Justice involvement was 73.4% in the county, 50.6% in the state.
 - Comment from Kevin Lots of choosing outpatient treatment lately and it's not working. Having trouble getting insurance to cover long-term treatment. Need more sober housing, would have a huge impact.

a. Stef reported that it is now quiet at EC after three busy weeks of summer school with many students attending.

1. Call to order

Commissioner Hallan called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

2. Review Agenda

3. Claims Update

A. Budgeted Claims:

We ended 2021 with a 100.2% loss ratio which was close to our prediction. Justin reviewed claims experience through May 2022. Utilization is higher than expected for the past three months.

B. High Claims:

To date, we do not have any claims that have exceeded the \$200,00 stop-loss threshold meaning that we are not receiving relief on high claims. We received \$104,500 in relief for 2021. We discussed lowering the threshold. Doing so could be cost-prohibitive. We could consider raising the threshold to \$250,000. Raising it any higher would create additional exposure for the county.

4. United Health Care Renewal Offer

United Healthcare has proposed an overall increase of 18% for 2023. In the renewal, Fixed costs increased 17% or \$83,000. Claims costs were increased by over \$500,000. Justin feels it is a poor offer with UHC taking little risk. He hopes to negotiate a more favorable offer. Several issues with customer service and claim payments were discussed.

5. Market Alternatives (Request for Proposal Results)

Both Medica and BlueCross BlueShield submitted competitive bids. Medica's proposal is 15% higher than our current plan and BCBS's proposal is 8.2% higher.

6. Additional Considerations and Next Steps

A. Run Out Costs if we leave UHC

• We must pay UHC to process claims that are incurred but not yet received. The charge would be equal to two months of administrative fees – approximately \$7000.

We will have six months to get unresolved claims paid or the county becomes responsible for payment. David wants to be certain we understand the legal obligations as to who pays these claims. David also inquired about the possibility of insurance pooling with other counties. Justin reached an agreement with BCBS last year to allow Gallagher to market a pooled product. There would be no co-mingling of funds for claim payments – just for stop-loss. There are counties that are interested in pooling but no firm commitments.

B. Current Wellness Dollars returned to UHC

• UHC gave \$55,000 in wellness credits for 3 years. We would be required to return one-third - \$18,334.

C. Rate Caps

- UHC has no rate caps
- BCBS has a 16.4% stop-loss rate cap for 2024, administration fee is guaranteed for 2023 and 2024 with a 3% cap for 2025.
- Medica has a 10.2% stop-loss rate cap for 2024, administrative fee is guaranteed for 2023-2025.

D. Implementation Credits

- UHC Not applicable
- BCBS Not offered
- Medica \$28,800 for the first year

E. Performance Guarantees

- UHC has \$10,500 performance guarantee
- BCBS not offered
- Medica not offered

F. Wellness Credits

- UHC has a \$10,000 first year wellness credit
- BCBS not offered
- Medica not offered

G. Medical and RX disruption

• To be reviewed when carrier is chosen. Expected to be minimal.

7. Next Steps

- Additional negotiations with carriers
- Best and final proposals due by mid-July
- Medical and RX disruption reviewed
- Finalize carrier bid
- Select carrier in August and plan transition

8. Vision Insurance Survey Sample

We have reviewed competitive bids from Vision Services Plan (VSP) and EyeMed. Both insurers have broader network access than our current network but in different locations. The costs and benefits are different between the two plans. Both insurers are offering a 4-year rate guarantee.

We will conduct a survey of vision plan members to find out where they are receiving services and if they are satisfied with the current plan's price and benefits. The data will be used to help select a carrier for 2023.

9. Medical Spending Account Transition

We are in the process of transitioning our HSA/FSA Medical and Dependent Care/VEBA accounts from Further to MedSurety, effective September 1, 2022. We have informed our employees of the transition and of the blackout period that will occur from August 18-September 6th to allow for fund transition.

Background information on Item:

Beginning in 2016, Pine County has been extending loans to homeowners to upgrade their non-compliant septic systems through a Cleanwater Partnership Loan from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. A new loan cycle began August 1st with \$900,000 available at 1% interest. The loans are paid by as a special assessment on the property taxes of the benefiting property over a term that is determined by the amount of the loan (1 year per \$1,000, for example \$12,000 loan is paid by over 12 years.)

Beginning in 2013, Pine County has been assisting low and moderate income homeowners to upgrade their non-compliant septic systems through funds received from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. This program is facilitated through a partnership with Lakes & Pines. Low income homeowners receive a no-interest, no payment loan which if they live in the home for 10 is forgiven, and moderate income homeowners receive a no-interest, 10-year special assessment.

On May 3rd, the county board approved the county broadband grant program and allocated \$250,000 of the \$750,000 for the first round. The grant program was developed using information from the assessment conducted by Hometown Fiber and requires at least 100 Mbps symmetrical service. The grant program is intended to leverage other funding and encourage local providers to allow the construction and expansion of broadband to serve county residents, businesses, and institutions.

The grant period was May 3 to June 17, 2022. Eleven grant requests were submitted by five providers totaling \$2,724,000 in requests and representing a total project cost of \$90,434,616. The broadband subcommittee consisting of Commissioners Hallan and Lovgren, Economic Development Coordinator Lezlie Sauter, and County Administrator David Minke, reviewed the proposals.

Based on the grant requests, the consensus of the committee is that an additional \$350,000 should be made avaliable this round making a total of \$600,000 available for distribution this round. The applications represent the projects that are most viable and needed, and there is no advantage to delaying funding to future rounds. The remaining \$150,000 can be used in the future to pay county costs associated with the implementation of the various broadband projects as well as other unforeseen future costs.

The grants were reviewed for cost effectiveness, area of service, existing service area, and ability to leverage other funds.

Action Requested:

Approve the following grant awards pending project design clarification and adjustment per the technical review conducted by Hometown Fiber. Authorize the County Administrator to enter grant agreement awards with the selected firms subject to legal review by the County Attorney.

- 1. \$300,000 to East Central Energy (East Central Energy Regional Broadband Project total project cost \$67M)
- 2. \$200,000 to Starwire Technologies (City of Rock Creek total project cost \$4.3M)
- 3. \$75,000 to Savage Communications (Partridge Township Broadband Expansion total project cost \$1.5M)
- 4. \$25,000 to Midcontinent Communications (Midco Cross Lake Trail total project cost \$67k)

d. Request made to reduce a 1.0 FTE to .5 FTE (20 hours per week), effective on or before October 1, 2022. Pine County is ending our contract with UCare resulting in a reduction of work and revenue. The position was 50% U-Care services and 50% foster care.

Motion by Commissioner Mohr to reduce a 1.0 FTE to .5 FTE effective on or before October 1, 2022. Second by Commissioner Ludwig. Motion carried 2-0.

5. Sheriff's Office - Corrections

Jail Administrator Rodney Williamson announced the following staffing changes:

- a. resignation of Corrections Officer Troy Parker effective July 14, 2022
- b. resignation of part-time probationary Corrections Officer Kay Wimmer, effective June 30, 2022

Request made to backfill the positions and subsequent vacancies that may occur due to internal promotion or lateral transfer. The positions are Grade 7 with a minimum starting wage of \$21.77/hour and are contained in the 2022 Jail budget.

Motion by Commissioner Mohr to acknowledge the resignation of Corrections Officer Troy Parker, effective July 14, 2022, and part-time, probationary Corrections Officer Kay Wimmer effective June 30, 2022, and approve backfill of the positions and any subsequent vacancies that may occur due to internal promotion or lateral transfer. The positions are Grade 7 with a minimum starting wage of \$21.77/hour and are contained in the 2022 Jail budget. Second by Commissioner Ludwig. Motion carried 2-0.

Jail Administrator Williamson provided a staffing update. We have several part-time Corrections Officers that are interested in applying for our full-time openings. There is a job offer pending to fill a part-time slot and we have new candidates to interview. Discussion was held regarding the state-wide shortage of Corrections Officers and Dispatchers. Rodney asked that we consider condensing the wage grid to fewer steps to make the starting wage more competitive. Data will be compiled for future discussion.

6. Auditor – Treasurer

a. Auditor-Treasurer Kelly Schroeder requested to reduce the vacant full-time Auditor Clerk III position from a 1.0 FTE to .6 FTE (22.5 hours per week). Redistribution of workload allows the backfill to be hired as part-time. The position is a Grade 4 with a

minimum starting wage of \$18.24/hour and is contained in the 2022 Auditor-Treasurer budget.

Motion by Commissioner Ludwig to reduce the vacant full-time Auditor Clerk III position from a 1.0 FTE to .6 FTE (22.5 hours per week). The position is a Grade 4 with a minimum starting wage of \$18.24/hour and is contained in the 2022 Auditor-Treasurer budget. Second by Commissioner Mohr. Motion carried 2-0.

b. Auditor-Treasurer Kelly Schroeder requested authorization to hire an additional Property Appraiser in the Assessor's office. The county approved the hiring of an appraiser this Spring to cover the four additional township contracts. Since that time, six additional townships have contracted with the county for assessments with the possibility of four more to follow. Local Assessors are being phased out due to a change in licensing requirements. The position is a Grade 8 with a minimum starting wage of \$23.03/hour. 2022 funding will be offset by additional revenue in the interest income and available cost savings throughout the general fund. The net cost for this year is approximately \$8,000.

Motion by Commissioner Ludwig to hire an additional Property Appraiser in the Assessor's office to cover additional workload. The position is a Grade 8 with a minimum starting wage of \$23.03/hour. 2022 funding will be offset by additional revenue in the interest income and available cost savings throughout the general fund. Second by Commissioner Mohr. Motion carried 2-0.

7. <u>Insurance Update</u>

The insurance committee met on June 30th. United Healthcare has proposed an 18% increase for 2023. BCBS has given us a proposal with an 8.2% increase. Our consultant will work with UHC to see if they will improve their renewal offer. A decision on carriers will be made in August.

8. Employee Engagement and Recognition

The first employee referral bonus will be awarded to Adrianne Wimmer in HHS. Adrianne will receive an initial payment of \$500 in July and the remaining \$500 after six months of employment.

9. With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:05 a.m.

Request Sandstone Township be included on July 19, 2022 County Board agenda

July 12, 2022

Pine County Board of Commissioners,

Sandstone Township Supervisors discovered erosion occurring around two culverts on Dupuis Road, in Sandstone Township, west of I-35 and south of Highway 61 about 1.5 miles.

The point where the erosion is taking place is above two large, approximately 4-foot by 30+ foot culverts which divert water under the road. Replacing those culverts and the work involved in that task is not something the township has the equipment to repair or monetary resources to replace.

Further research showed the water flowing under Dupuis Road is a section of the county owned ditch – Friesland Ditch. It is one of three Sandstone Township roads which the ditch crosses.

Supervisor Gary Hinsch has been monitoring the erosion and has determined it is imperative to get the culverts replaced this year. He has noticed the erosion advancing into the drive area with each rain event.

Sandstone Town Board advised Gary Hinsch to bring the request to the Pine County Board of Commissioners as soon as possible so the county can take action to get the work completed this year.

Gary Hinsch went to Mark LeBrun, county engineer, and Commissioner Matt Ludwig and asked that the county attend to the failing ditch culverts. He was told it was not the county's responsibility.

Based on the Matter of Red Lake Watershed Project #119, "That project, a ditch, crossed a township road, necessitating the replacement of existing culverts." The watershed district was required to pay damages for constructing new culverts and the decision was upheld by the Court of Appeals.

With this case law as a guide, Sandstone Town Board concludes the watershed district (Pine County) is responsible for the cost of constructing new culverts.

We would like to get this matter settled as soon as possible to avoid further damage to Dupuis Road.

SUBJECT: Second Quarter 2022 Budget Report

At the end of June, the county's budget is sound for six months, or 50% into the year.

Chart 1 shows revenue and expenditure as a percentage of the budget for the county by the three major funds (General, Health & Human Services, and Road & Bridge) and the total of all funds. As of June 30, all funds are at or below 50% spent. Total county spending through the end of June was \$23,691,229 or 47% of the budget.

Revenues are below expenditures in the General and HHS funds and above expenditures in Highway and overall. This situation is expected at this point of the year in the General and HHS funds as most county revenues and expenditures are out of sync. These revenues include contracts or reimbursements for services which typically lag 30-60 days or are only made once or twice per year such as the property tax settlement. Revenues are above expenditures in Highway due to state aid reimbursements and the timing of expenditures. Overall revenue is at 58% through the end of June due to receipt of unbudgeted ARPA funds.

Chart 2 compares the 2020, 2021, and 2022 revenue in the General Fund by budget department. Only the departments that receive significant program revenue are included. As is evident by the three-year history, revenue at a point in time varies from year to year. Planning and Zoning is at 106% due to the 1W1P grants. Assessor revenue is at 0% due to the timing of the assessor contract payments.

Chart 3A & 3B

Chart 3A shows the expenditures of the larger departments in the General Fund through the end of June. All budget departments are below 50% except for Recorder and Sheriff (operations). Recorder is at 93% due to planned spending of compliance and technology fund money on computer servers and the Tax and CAMA upgrade. Sheriff spending is at 52% due primarily to higher than budgeted vehicle insurance costs. Court Security is well underspent because the limited court activity has decreased the need for bailiff support.

Chart 3B uses the same column format to show first quarter 2022 expenditures and adds a line showing the three-year average. As the graph shows, current year spending is generally in line with the three-year average. `

Chart 4 shows the Health and Human Services revenues and expenditures by major division and the fund total. All divisions are below 50% on expenditures, and revenues are where expected at the end of the second quarter.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding

Pine County was authorized \$5,745,374 in the American Rescue Plan Act. The county received the first half in May 2021 and the second half in June 2022. Nearly all of the ARPA funds have been allocated by the county board with a total of \$703,833 actually spent by the end of June. Total spending for 2021 was \$358,938 and total spending for the first half of 2022 is \$344,896.

Local Option Sales Tax for Transportation

Sales tax collections for the year through April 30 are \$496,425. This amount is \$2,283 less than the amount collected during the same period in 2021.
