- **COVID Care Program:** The Prince George's County Health Department's COVID Care Program is for residents who have been exposed to COVID-19 or who are COVID-19 positive. The program assists residents with social service needs, including connecting to health insurance, medical care, and mental health care at a Federally Qualified Health Center, Food, Living situations, Utilities, Transportation, and other needs.

The County will also assist with isolation and quarantine: deliver COVID Care Kits to the homes of people who consent. COVID Care Kits include PPE, cleaning supplies, tissues, toilet paper, and educational materials. Food insecure residents will also receive a 2-week supply of food, including fresh produce, canned goods, and kitchen staples like bread, tortillas, and rice.

- Metro Update: Overview of Metro's FY23 Budget: Metro's annual budget process is underway, and they are preparing for the start of the public comment period for the Fiscal Year 2023 budget. Beginning January 22, a public education campaign on the budget will start and will seek public comment through survey responses, open ended comments and public hearing testimony.

FY23 Budget Overview

- Metro's budget focuses on providing safe, reliable and affordable transit service to the region.
- The launch of Metrorail service at Potomac Yard Station and to six new Silver Line stations, expanding Metro access to Dulles Airport and beyond.
- The budget proposals maintain improvements that started in 2021 and add more service and discounts throughout 2022. This includes changes related to the anticipated opening of the Silver Line Phase II and Potomac Yard Station.
- The budget also includes funding for capital projects that are foundational for safe and reliable service. With the support of dedicated funding from jurisdictional partners, Metro's Capital Improvement Program has grown to be one of the largest in the U.S. transit industry. The many construction and rehabilitation projects underway are a sign of a healthy system, ensuring a state of good repair for critical regional infrastructure.

Metro is still experiencing staffing and operational challenges affecting bus and rail service. Bus service is currently operating at 75% and rail service is operating at reduced levels. If approved, any service improvements would go into effect after the staffing and operational challenges have been addressed.

Public Outreach Timeline

Metro is looking to collect as much public feedback as possible to share with the Board of Directors and management. They will be conducting an extensive communications and outreach campaign, including in-person outreach at Metro stations, bus stops and community locations.

Dates to keep in mind:

- January 22: Public comment period opens. This will be the first day that Metro can accept feedback. All comments, including any official letters, must be uploaded through the survey tool which will go live this day.
- February 7, 8, 9: Public hearings (virtual and in-person participation)
- February 15: Public comment period closes
- March/April: Metro's Board of Directors reviews public feedback and adopts a final budget

In-person hearings may shift to virtual-only due to pandemic-related health restrictions and are subject to mask mandates and social distancing requirements. Residents are encouraged to participate virtually.

- Yard Waste Mondays: Yard waste collection is every Monday. Yard waste needs to be at the **curbside by 6:00 a.m.** Residents are responsible for the following items:
 - Yard waste must be placed in paper bags or reusable bins that are clearly marked "Yard Waste"
 - Branches and limbs need to be bundled with rope or string (do not use wire), additionally all branches, limbs, and bundles must be:
 - less than 4 feet long,
 - individual branches less than 3 inches in diameter
 - weigh less than 60 pounds.

- Recycling Collection – important note: The Recycling Collection Program is provided by Prince George’s County. Items will not be collected if the items to be recycled are placed in any type of plastic bag. Town staff continue to receive reports that recycling items placed for pick-up are in plastic bags. Prince George’s County requires that recycling be placed in a blue tote or in a reusable collection container that is clearly marked “RECYCLING” or with an “X.” **NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY KIND ARE TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RECYCLING CONTAINER** (i.e., plastic grocery bags, plastic wrappers on soda or water containers). 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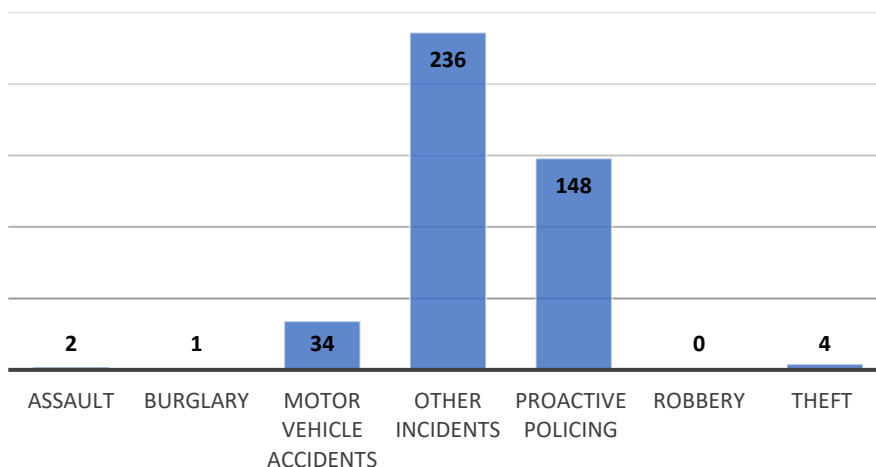
Note:

1. *“FYTD” means Fiscal Year to Date, starting from July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022.*
2. *“Accumulation of Garbage / Rubbish” includes violations pertaining to the storage of waste materials in interior or exterior property areas.*
3. *“Exterior Conditions” include, but not limited to chipping, flaking, and peeling paint, graffiti, storage of inoperable vehicles, damaged accessory structures, driveways, doors, overhangs, roofs, stairways, walls, windows, and other exterior components.*
4. *“Interior Conditions” include, but not limited to; cracks and holes in ceilings, floors, and walls, missing stair railings, water-damaged surfaces, and lack of proper ventilation.*
5. *“Overgrown Weeds” include grass or weeds more than 10 inches in height.*
6. *“Safety” includes, but not limited to; damaged/missing electrical outlets, covers, light fixtures, carbon monoxide and /or smoke detectors, lack of escape windows in bedrooms, missing address numbers, major structural damage, and unsafe buildings.*

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Public Safety

425 Calls for Police Service 01/06/2022 to 01/19/2022



Calls for Service defined: A call for service is any activity performed by a sworn police officer in the performance of their assigned duties. Calls for service covers both proactive activities such as area checks and traffic enforcement, as well as a portion of field investigative reports, traffic accidents, and response to various incidents. Calls received for dispatch are also included in the calls for service total.

Staff are working to enhance reporting capabilities to more accurately differentiate between proactive police actions and responding to dispatched incidents. The above chart illustrates that at a minimum, 148 or 35 percent of calls for service were proactive actions on the part of the Town's police officers.

Proactive Policing includes traffic safety, business and residential checks, field interviews, and quality of life issues.

Other Incident includes disorderly complaints, fights, suspicious subjects/vehicles, parking complaints, traffic complaints, and assisting individuals.

Highlighted reports:

- Officers responded to the 5400 block of Spring Lane for a motor vehicle theft. The victim reported leaving their 2016 Honda in the driveway warming up. Unknown suspect(s) stole the vehicle and fled towards Kenilworth Avenue. The vehicle was entered into NCIC as stolen.
- Officers responded to a business in the 5400 block of Kenilworth Avenue for a theft. An employee reported an unknown suspect entered the business and used a stolen credit card to purchase liquor. The investigation is ongoing.

- Officers responded to a business in the 5700 block of Riverdale Road for a burglary. The investigation revealed unknown suspect(s) entered the business through an unsecure rear door. Once inside the suspect(s) removed U.S. Currency and computers. The investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to the 5300 block of Kenilworth Avenue for a single vehicle collision. The driver of the vehicle failed field sobriety testing and was placed under arrest for driving while intoxicated.
- Officers responded to a business in the 5600 block of Riverdale Road for a check on the welfare. Responding officers encountered an individual who was making suicidal threats. Due to the individual's actions, the individual was transported to the hospital for an emergency psychological evaluation.
- Officers conducted a premise check of a vacant property in the 5900 block of Riverside Drive. A person was contacted, and a records check revealed the individual to have an active arrest warrant for a parole violation. The individual was placed under arrest and transported to the Department of Corrections.
- Officers responded to the 5700 block of Riverdale Road for an assault. The investigation revealed two individuals were involved in a dispute in the parking lot. The altercation escalated and the suspect produced a large knife and attacked the victim. During the attack the victim suffered a significant laceration to the hand. Responding officers located and arrested the suspect. The victim was transported to the hospital for treatment.
- Officers responded to the 5500 block of Kenilworth Avenue for an assault. The investigation revealed two individuals were involved in a fight. During the fight the suspect produced a knife and cut the victim in the abdomen. The victim was transported to the hospital for treatment. Through investigative means a suspect has been identified and arrested.
