Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

September has arrived, and as I do every year I'm lamenting the end of tomato season, with the beginning of apple season as my only comfort.

Ward 6 Council Representative Silva Has Resigned

I am sad to report that due to circumstances beyond his control, Ward 6 Council Representative Silva has had to resign. I expect the Town Council to declare a vacancy at the September 10th legislative meeting, and we will move to appoint a qualified person from Ward 6, probably at the October 1 legislative meeting. Please contact me or town staff if you are interested in the position. Council Member Silva was a dedicated public servant, and I will miss his steady presence on the council, and in town.

Visit to Guatemala

I had the great pleasure of visiting our sister city – Ipala, Guatemala – in July in honor of the tenth anniversary of our partnership. As part of my visit I attended celebrations of recently completed civic projects, spoke to hundreds of residents of Ipala, and met with their council members. I also observed Ipala Mayor Esguin Javier as he went about his duties one day, meeting with a few dozen residents in his office in the morning, and traveling to places where there were issues requiring his attention for much of the rest of the day. While I could write a dozen pages about what I saw and learned, the most important outcomes were that I now better understand the cultural and economic background of the many Central American immigrants in our community, and I have developed a good relationship with Mayor Javier. I also learned that I need more practice with my Spanish!! A group of teachers from Ipala plan to visit Riverdale Park in November to teach students in local schools about the Mayan culture and language of Ipala. There will probably be an evening event in Riverdale Park;

I hope to write more about their visit in October's Town Crier.

Purple Line Construction

I typically only get a few weeks of advance notice on Purple Line activities, so it is best to sign up for announcements directly from <https://www.purplelinemd.com/construction/>. That being said, I do know that there will be a lot of construction where East-West highway crosses underneath the Baltimore Washington Parkway; the current bridge will be replaced as part of the project. In addition, eastbound Campus Drive from Library Lane to Regents Drive on the University of Maryland campus will be closed starting the end of August. Last – but not least! – there will be drilling for foundations along Riverdale Road from Kenilworth Avenue to where it merges with East-West Highway. William Wirt Middle School

In my July/August Town Crier article I mentioned that I was still researching the situation at William Wirt. Since then, there have been two meetings to discuss the situation, one for school staff members and one for families (with representatives from Prince George's County Police Department, Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) Security Services, school administrators, central office staff, and teachers). At both meetings staff and families stated that their experiences in the school did not match the reporting in the June 11 Washington Post article. While there is no question that there is gang activity at William Wirt, as there is in school systems throughout the region, both PGCPS and Prince George's County police have written letters to the Washington Post refuting many of the claims in the Washington Post article. The William Wirt community works hard to establish a positive school climate, create opportunities for students, and build partnerships for success, and they will continue to do so. We in the

Town will continue to monitor the situation and work with PGCPs and the county police to ensure the safety of students at the school.

Mosquitos

I try very hard to limit my discussion of mosquitos to once a year, but in July the State of Maryland program that monitors mosquitos in our community discovered that there were West-Nile-virus-infected mosquitos in town. West Nile fever is a potentially serious infection (approximately 1% of those infected develop serious symptoms, and there is a small but significant chance of death for those who have these serious symptoms) This means it is more important than ever that we control our mosquito population by eliminating standing water and using other techniques (including BTI “pucks”) to limit mosquito populations. Residents should also work to limit their chances of being bitten by mosquitos to avoid infection.

My Thanks to My Father

Most of you do not know this, but my father passed away in mid-July, shortly after I returned from Guatemala (I was able to get to Texas to be with him in his final hours). He was more important to me than I can describe – he helped me to develop my moral compass, my respect for others, my humility, my sense of wonder, and my commitment to making the world (including our town) a better place. Although the world is a darker place without him, I will carry the torch he gave me into the future, certain that his love – and expectations for me – survive his death.

FAIR SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE 2018-OR-11

This is to give notice that the Riverdale Park Town Council has introduced and intends to take action on Ordinance 2018-OR-11.

Ordinance 2018-OR-11 would eliminate one existing and add one new school zone within which automated school zone speed monitoring enforcement is authorized in the Town of Riverdale Park; provide for automated speed monitoring enforcement in the new school zone; and generally relate to school zones and automated speed monitoring enforcement in the Town.

Ordinance 2018-OR-11 is available for inspection by the public at Town Hall during normal business hours, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Ward 2 Report

I hope that all of you have had a fantastic summer. I've been able to spend mine visiting family, working on our house, and hiking around the area. It has been fantastic, but I look forward to returning to school and a normal work schedule.

Back to School

As we begin the 2018-2019 school year, I'd like to remind residents that our students at Riverdale Elementary, William Wirt Middle School, and Parkdale High School may need some assistance in obtaining school supplies in order to have a strong start to the school year. Please consider dropping off some supplies for our students at the front office over the next couple of weeks. The students and teachers will greatly appreciate your efforts. The schools are also always in need of volunteers, specifically ones that are bilingual. If you are interested in volunteering for school events, please reach out to me or the schools directly and we will advise you on next steps in getting cleared by the county for such activities. If we are serious in our commitment to our community's schools then we need to take a more active role in engaging with them. Engaged communities create better schools.

Field of Dreams Park

We are finally starting to see some movement on the park that will be built on the site of the former Field of Dreams. The Department of Public Works removed much of the old chain link fencing around the area and the Town Manager is currently looking into placing a sidewalk along Tuckerman Street that will tie into the new sidewalks in the traffic circle. We will be looking to host a charrette to gather community input on the public space in late October. Numerous residents have already reached out to us about ideas for the space. We are looking to engage as many residents as possible in order to build a space that can become a landmark for our shared community.

In closing, the government that we want is the one that we engage and participate in. We are only as good as the ideas that we can generate. I look forward to your ideas and motivation as we move forward and collaborate together in building the Riverdale Park that we all envision.

Ward 3 Report

Council Member David Lingua

The Central Kenilworth Avenue Revitalization CDC (CKAR-CDC) along with the University of Maryland Global Leadership and Civic Engagement Program conducted a Corridor Business Outreach Project during late July and early August. With the help of six interns and two team leaders, the three week project yielded a door-to-door outreach to two hundred twenty businesses. CKAR will be working with our town's Development Services office on cross referencing this information for further outreach efforts. The CDC's Fall 2018 Go Green Plant Trees campaign is projected to plant one hundred ten trees and shrubberies in the coming months. For more information on this, go to ckarcdc.org. As well the CDC welcomes Americorp VISTA member Shanelle Ramos-Lopez who will be working for the next year as an Impact Evaluation Specialist for the CDC. Ms. Ramos-Lopez is recruiting volunteers for social media managing, grant writing, and a bilingual receptionist. Information on these positions can be found at ckarcdc.org or the town website.

Of late, the correspondence received from Ward 3 neighbors has one common entity; the Shoemaker business property. Neighbors have brought forward the issues of parking, litter, speeding, and disregarding Stop signs. Having worked for the better part of two decades at a facility in Georgetown, DC with town homes across the street and around the corner, I have a clear expectation of how a commercial enterprise is to conduct itself. With this in mind, I have been working with staff to address these issues with the businesses located along 47th Avenue. Your continued input is appreciated.

With the retirement of Director Leonard Addison from the Public Works Department, Town Manager John Lestitian has begun the process of hiring a new department head. One of my concerns is making sure department related projects remain on track towards completion. Most notably for Ward 3 are two items, both relating to stormwater management: the stormwater inlet redesign at Longfellow and 48th Avenue and, more recently, the streetscape correction along 47th Avenue and Chris Kyle Court. The former project is one which the Town has been working with Prince George's County's Department of Public Works and Transportation and the later will most likely involve the developer of the new homes on the court.

A final note, as it is September and schools are welcoming new and returning students, please be aware of their presence and do what you are able to ensure your travels are safe.

Public Works

Community Improvements

The Department of Public Works team is performing various tasks to further improve the aesthetics of the community, including, but not limited to, removing/replacing damaged and faded street signs, repainting yellow curbs, and straightening damaged poles.

Saturday Bulk Trash Drop-Off

The fall schedule for drop-off of bulk trash is: September 15, October 20, November 17 and December 15. Town residents may deliver residential bulk trash items to the Department of Public Works from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

Trash Tote Repair/Replacement

To coordinate the replacement of damaged trash totes, residents should call the Department of Public Works at 301-864-1803. The Town's contracted trash service provider will replace the damaged totes. Please note that a replacement tote will not be delivered if

the damaged one is not there for pick-up. Replacements will take place on Thursdays.

Mosquito Control Program

The Maryland Department of Agriculture's Mosquito Control Program will run until September 18th.

Spraying will take place after dark on Tuesdays and may continue until midnight or later. The spray schedule rotates every 3 weeks meaning that Riverdale Park may not be sprayed each week. The frequency of spraying will be determined by surveillance data collected and complaints received. In order to determine if your community will be sprayed on its scheduled spray night, please contact MDA at 301-422-5080 between 2-4 p.m. that day. Any unscheduled sprayings will be announced on the Maryland Department of Agriculture's webpage www.mda.maryland.gov or on Twitter @MdAgMosquito and @MdAgDept.

As a reminder, to reduce the presence of mosquitos, residents must keep their property free of mosquitos breeding containers, stagnant water, bird baths, wading pools, pet watering dishes, tin cans, old tires, clogged gutters or flower pots. Other water holding containers should be stored upside down.
