- COVID Care Program: The Prince George's County Health Department's COVID Care Program is for residents who have been exposed to COVID-19 or who are COVID-19 positive. The program assists residents with social service needs, including connecting to health insurance, medical care, and mental health care at a Federally Qualified Health Center, Food, Living situations, Utilities, Transportation, and other needs.

The County will also assist with isolation and quarantine: deliver COVID Care Kits to the homes of people who consent. COVID Care Kits include PPE, cleaning supplies, tissues, toilet paper, and educational materials. Food insecure residents will also receive a 2-week supply of food, including fresh produce, canned goods, and kitchen staples like bread, tortillas, and rice.

- Prince George's County Homeownership Preservation Program (HOPP): A partnership has been established between Prince George's County and Habitat for Humanity Metro Maryland to use American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to launch the new Prince George's County Homeownership Preservation Program (HOPP). The program prioritizes homeowners who live within one mile of the Purple Line to provide resources to address the home's critical health, safety, and accessibility related needs to help promote and enable the transfer of generational wealth by preserving homeownership for families in need. ### **Environment**

- MDA Mosquito Control Program: The Town will participate in the Maryland Department of Agriculture’s Mosquito Control Program this season. The spray season begins at the end of May and is anticipated to end in mid-September. Spraying will take place after dark on Tuesdays and may continue until midnight or later.

- Weatherization Programs: Programs are available to help income eligible households lower their energy bills. - **Yard Waste Mondays:** Yard waste collection is every Monday. Yard waste needs to be at the **curbside by 6:00 a.m.** Residents are responsible for the following items:
  - Yard waste must be placed in paper bags or reusable bins that are clearly marked "Yard Waste"
  - Branches and limbs need to be bundled with rope or string (do not use wire), additionally all branches, limbs, and bundles must be:
    - less than 4 feet long,
    - individual branches less than 3 inches in diameter
    - weigh less than 60 pounds.
  
- **Recycling Collection – important note:** The Recycling Collection Program is provided by Prince George’s County. Items will not be collected if the items to be recycled are placed in any type of plastic bag. Town staff continue to receive reports that recycling items placed for pick-up are in plastic bags. Prince George’s County requires that recycling be placed in a blue tote or in a reusable collection container that is clearly marked “RECYCLING” or with an “X.” **NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY KIND ARE TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RECYCLING CONTAINER** (i.e., plastic grocery bags, plastic wrappers on soda or water containers). 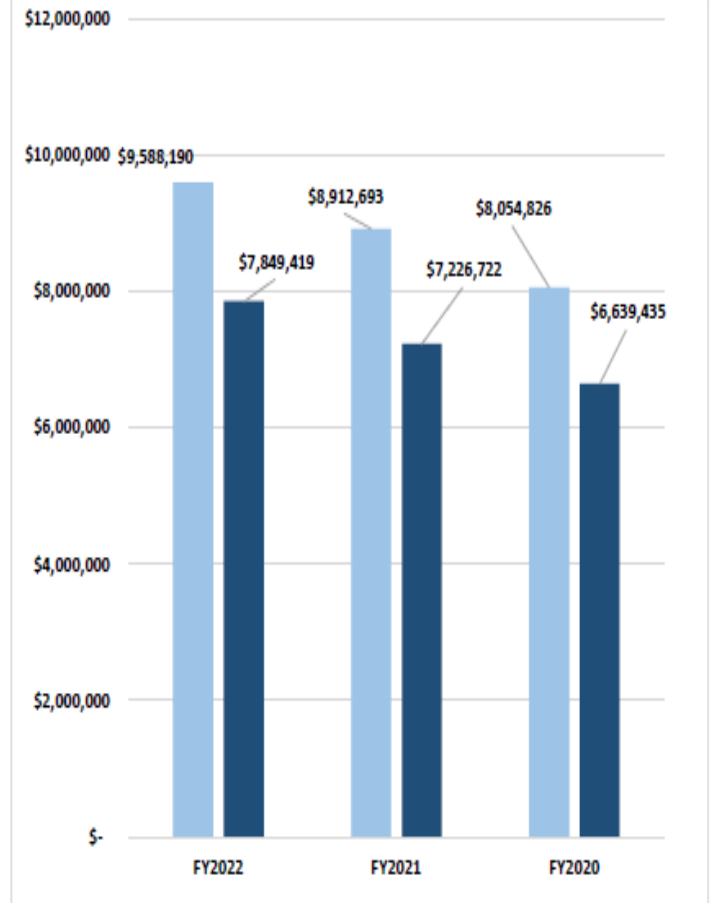

5. "Overgrown Weeds" include grass or weeds more than 10 inches in height.
6. "Safety" includes, but not limited to; damaged/missing electrical outlets, covers, light fixtures, carbon monoxide and /or smoke detectors, lack of escape windows in bedrooms, missing address numbers, major structural damage, and unsafe buildings.
7. "Sanitation" includes, but not limited to; insect/rodent infestation, mildew/mold on surfaces, uncleanliness, and storage of hazardous waste.

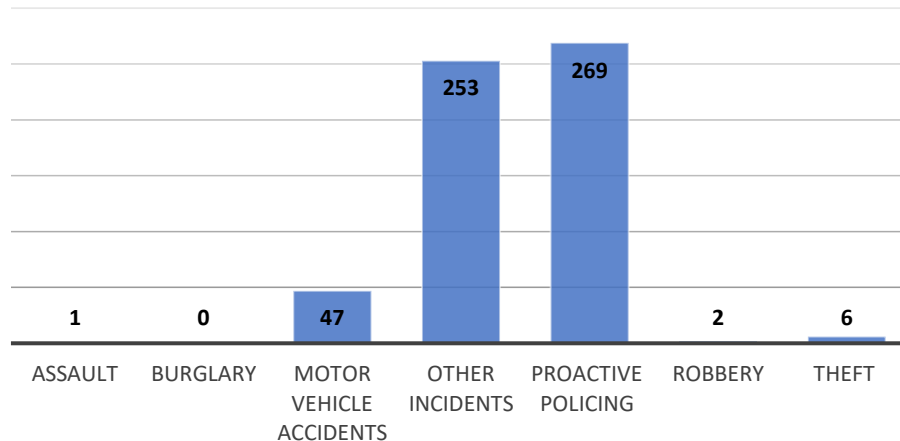

## Public Safety

### 578 Calls for Police Service 07/07/2022 to 07/20/2022



Calls for Service defined: A call for service is any activity performed by a sworn police officer in the performance of their assigned duties. Calls for service covers both proactive activities such as area checks and traffic enforcement, as well as a portion of field investigative reports, traffic accidents, and response to various incidents. Calls received for dispatch are also included in the calls for service total.

Staff are working to enhance reporting capabilities to more accurately differentiate between proactive police actions and responding to dispatched incidents. The above chart illustrates that at a minimum, 269 or 47 percent of calls for service were proactive actions on the part of the Town's police officers.

Proactive Policing includes traffic safety, business and residential checks, field interviews, and quality of life issues.

Other Incident includes disorderly complaints, fights, suspicious subjects/vehicles, parking complaints, traffic complaints, and assisting individuals.

#### Highlighted reports:

- Officers responded to a business in the 6600 block of Baltimore Avenue for a check on the welfare. Responding officers encountered an individual who appeared to be in distress and experiencing a mental health crisis. Due to the individual's actions and for their safety they were transported to the hospital for an emergency psychological evaluation.
- Officers responded to a business in the 5600 block of Riverdale Road for a contact shooting. The investigation revealed to groups of teenagers were involved in a dispute which escalated, and gunshots were exchanged. Two victims suffered gunshot wounds and were transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. Through an investigation one suspect has been



identified and charged with attempted murder, the second has been identified and charges are pending. The investigation is ongoing and additional arrests are expected.

- Officers responded to the 5700 block of Riverdale Road for a trespassing complaint. Responding officers located an individual who was previously banned from the property. The individual was removed from the property and issued a criminal citation for trespassing.
- Officers responded to a business in the 6200 block of Baltimore Avenue for an assault. The investigation revealed a security guard for the business was breaking up a fight when he was struck by the suspect. Responding officers placed the suspect under arrest for 2<sup>nd</sup> degree assault.
- Officers responded to a business in the 5500 block of Kenilworth Avenue for a vandalism. The investigation revealed an employee was involved in a dispute with an unknown suspect. The suspect became irate and poured water on the credit card machine. The investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a business in the 5700 block of Riverdale Road for individuals drinking alcohol in the parking lot. Responding officers located the individuals and citations were issued for consuming alcohol in public.
- Officers responded to the intersection of Kenilworth Avenue and Campus Drive for a disabled vehicle. Responding officers conducted a records check which revealed the vehicle was reported stolen. The driver was placed under arrest for motor vehicle theft.
- Officers responded to the 5400 block of 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue for a vandalism. The investigation revealed the suspect approached the victim's vehicle asking for money, when the victim refused the suspect broke the rear window of the vehicle. Responding officers located and placed the suspect under arrest for malicious destruction of property.
- Officers conducted a traffic stop in the 5600 block of 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue. A records check revealed the driver to have an active arrest warrant for failure to appear for driving without a license. The individual was placed under arrest and transported to the Department of Corrections.
- Officers responded to an accident with injuries in the 5800 block of Riverdale Road. Both drivers sustained minor injuries and one driver, who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol, failed field sobriety tests and was subsequently arrested for DUI.
- Officers were flagged down in the 5400 block of Powhattan for a vehicle that had been parked at the location for a long time. A check of the vehicle's registration revealed that it had been stolen in VA. The vehicle was recovered, and the owner notified.
- Officers responded to a commercial armed robbery in the 6300 block of Baltimore Avenue. The investigation revealed that two suspects entered the business, both armed with handguns, and demanded money from the register. The victim complied and the suspects made good their escape. The investigation is ongoing.

- Officers responded to the 5400 block of Kenilworth Avenue for a strong-arm robbery. The investigation revealed that the victim was forcibly robbed of his cash and sustained injuries to his face/head. Responding officers later located the suspect and placed him under arrest for robbery.
