Fair Summary of Legislation

Notice of Adoption of Charter Amendment Resolution 2021-CR-01 Absentee Voting

This is to give notice that on February 22, 2021, the Riverdale Park Town Council adopted Charter Amendment Resolution 2021-CR-01 ("the Resolution"). The title to the Resolution is as follows:

A RESOLUTION concerning

CHARTER AMENDMENT - ABSENTEE VOTING

FOR the purpose of amending the Charter of the Town of Riverdale Park to remove from the Charter certain obsolete references to provisions of State law relating to absentee voting; to provide for the Town Council to establish procedures for absentee voting in municipal elections; and generally to relate to absentee voting in municipal elections in the Town of Riverdale Park.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments Charter of the Town of Riverdale Park (January 2008 Revision) ARTICLE V, Nominations and Elections § 509

Charter Amendment Resolution 2021-CR-01 is available for inspection by the public at Town Hall, by request to *community_input@riverdaleparkmd.gov*, or by calling 301-927-6381. The amendment to the Charter will become effective on April 13, 2021, subject to the provisions of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland regarding the right of the qualified voters of the Town to petition the proposed amendment to referendum.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

There have been some glorious days in March, and as I write this the first few trees have put out some blossoms. Spring, and hope for a post-pandemic future soon, are both in the air.

COVID-19

It's hard to believe that we have been in this crisis for a year, and at the same time it's also hard to believe it has *only* been a year – it feels like much longer to me. We have learned so much about the coronavirus over the last year, and have individually and collectively poured immense resources into combatting it. The most recent tool, the three approved vaccines, are being administered at a rapid rate. With a little luck, and with everyone getting the vaccine as soon as they are eligible, we can get ahead of the new strains of the virus and put this awful pandemic behind us.

COVID-19: Vaccines

As I predicted in March, the Johnson & Johnson vaccine was approved, and overall supply of all vaccines has improved... though demand still exceeds the supply, and expansion of the eligibility list to include people in

phase "1C" didn't happen in Prince George's County until mid-March. (Phase 1C includes those 65-74 years of age, those receiving treatment in the hospital for a specific list of conditions, essential workers at high risk of exposure, religious leaders, and health/human services workers not covered in earlier phases. And everyone in Phases 1A and 1B are still prioritized to receive the vaccine!) I've heard predictions that the supply will increase sharply in April, and by late April supply may exceed demand. Please, please; when you are able to get the vaccine, do it as quickly as you can. Don't wait to see - the vaccines are safe and effective (there have been exactly zero deaths caused by the vaccine, and the rate of severe allergic reaction - the most serious side-effect, but easily treated by a doctor – is *less than five* cases of for every million shots administered for Moderna and Pfizer, and ever lower for the Johnson & Johnson vaccine). The virus, on the other hand, is very dangerous and is currently killing ten people per million population every week in Prince George's County.

As I said last month, I was vaccinated shortly after writing my February Town Crier article and received my second dose shortly after writing the March article. I experienced chills, aching muscles and joints, and headache for around a day after the second shot and have been fine since then! I was actually glad I felt a bit sick because that let me know that the vaccine had activated my immune system!

The sooner those of us who *can be* vaccinated actually *get* vaccinated, the sooner we get the virus under control, and can get back to a life where we see friends and family, travel, socialize, and work without fear. Put your name on the waiting lists today and get the shot or shots as soon as you can when you are eligible. Remember that immunity to the virus takes 10 days after the first shot, and the highest level of immunity is about a month after the single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine, and a few weeks after the second dose for the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines, so it is important to continue to exercise caution even after you get your shot! That said, the fraction of COVID-19 tests that are positive on March 17th in Prince George's County is 4.7%, which is the lowest it's been since last September.

COVID-19: Variants

As I reported last month, the good news about the vaccines (and dropping cases, due to both seasonal reductions as spring approaches and to rapidly increasing vaccinations) is balanced by bad news that

there are many new variants of the coronavirus, and at least some of them appear to be much easier to transmit. That means that behavior that was safe before (for example, standing six-feet away from someone for 15 minutes or less) may no longer be safe when the new variants become common. You may need to be further apart, spend less time, or wear a better mask. The more-contagious variant most common in Maryland right now is called B.1.1.7, first observed in the United Kingdom. This variant is around 50% more contagious than current strains - almost all of the COVID-19 cases in parts of Europe are now this variety, and almost two hundred cases have already been observed in Maryland, up from a few dozen last month (diagnosis is complicated, so we don't know exactly how prevalent the B.1.1.7 variant is in Maryland). Very recent news about the P.1 variant, which is widespread in Brazil, indicates that it is extremely infectious, perhaps twice as infectious as the "B.1" that has been most common in the United States.

There is still good news though, which is (1) the currently-approved vaccines, including the recentlyapproved vaccine from Johnson & Johnson, are effective against these variants. The vaccines are not as effective against these new variants as against the early-to-mid 2020 variants, but there are still 0 (zero!) cases of serious illness or death from any variant for people who have completed the vaccination protocol (including a few weeks after the second dose). And, in South Africa, where vaccines are in much shorter supply than here, cases from the B.1.351 variant have been brought under control by (you might guess the answer) masks, social distancing, avoiding gatherings and poorlyventilated public places, and hand washing. Continue to take these actions (and be even more careful!), get vaccinated as soon as you can (while waiting your turn!), and together we will get COVID-19 under control!

Town Budget

It's that time of year — the draft Town budget will be released around the same time as this edition of the Town Crier (though it may be delayed as we try to understand the recently-enacted American Rescue Plan and the impact it will have on our budget). We will have hearings in April and welcome input from residents on budget priorities. Check the calendar for a schedule of meetings!

Elections

As I said last month, town elections are now on the nottoo-far horizon (Election Day is set for May 3, with petitions and financial disclosure forms due on April 8 at 5:00 p.m. - If you want to run, packets can be downloaded from the Town's website or picked up at Town Hall). The town will announce who will be on the ballot shortly after the April 8 deadline on the town's website, social media outlets, and (after a few days) printed signs in each Ward.

An "emergency repair" is defined as a situation that is lifethreatening or one that prohibits someone from living in decent, safe, and sanitary conditions or is needed for the safe and continual operation of a business. In compliance with the Charter of the Town of Riverdale Park, Maryland, an election will be held on Monday, May 3, 2021, to elect the Mayor and Council.

Voting will take place on Monday, May 3, 2021 at Riverdale Park Town Hall (5008 Queensbury Road) Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Residents may also vote by mail (or ballot dropbox) by requesting an Absentee Ballot.

Absentee ballot applications are available at www.riverdaleparkmd.gov, by e-mail request to TownElection@riverdaleparkmd.gov, or by calling 301-927-6381 (ext. 505). Absentee ballot applications must be received by Friday, April 23, 2021.

Candidates for office must file a Petition for Elective Office and a Financial Disclosure Statement with the

Election Judges no later than **5:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 8, 2021**, to have their names placed on the official ballot.

Petitions for Elective Office and Financial Disclosure Statements are available on the Town's website, www.riverdaleparkmd.gov, by e-mail request to TownElection@riverdaleparkmd.gov or by calling 301-927-6381 (ext. 505). There is a \$25.00 filing fee for all candidates.

All residents sixteen years of age or older, who have resided in the Town of Riverdale Park for 45 days or more preceding Monday, May 3, 2021 (March 19, 2021 to May 2, 2021), will be entitled to vote.

Register to Vote in 2021 Town Election

HOW DO I REGISTER TO VOTE?

Town residents may register to vote in one of the following ways:

- If you are a U.S. citizen, a Maryland resident, and at least 16 years old; you may register to vote by using the State of Maryland Voter Registration Application found on the Town's website www.riverdaleparkmd.gov; OR
- 2. If you have, or will have, the Town of Riverdale Park as your primary residence, for at least forty-five (45) days immediately prior to May 3, 2021 (March 19, 2021 to May 2, 2021); are at least 16 years old; do not claim the right to vote elsewhere in the United States; and have not been found by a court to be unable to communicate a desire to vote; register to vote by using the Town of Riverdale Park Supplemental Voter Registry Voter Registration Form found on the Town's website www.riverdaleparkmd.gov.

WHAT FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION AND PROOF OF RESIDENCE WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL VOTER REGISTRY?

 An identification card issued by a federal, state, or local government entity of the United States or any foreign country or school provided that the identification document contains the applicant's name and date of birth; AND 2. A document that establishes your current residence in the Town of Riverdale Park if not already established by (1.) above. Examples include a copy of house or apartment lease, utility bill, paycheck, bank statement, school record, or other document that shows your legal name and current address in the Town of Riverdale Park.

CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE ON THE DAY OF ELECTION? Yes, anyone may register to vote on the day of the election. If you do not have sufficient proof of age and residency, you will need to complete an affidavit in order to vote.

Collection Reminders

Residential Trash

Residential trash should be placed in durable, leak proof bags <u>before</u> it is placed in cans. Be sure that the can's lid is tightly closed to keep rainwater out-this will help to reduce spillage. Excess trash should be placed beside your container.

Trash cans should be curbside by **6:00 a.m.** on **Mondays and Thursdays** or the night before collection.

Yard Waste

Do NOT mix yard waste with household trash. Yard waste must be placed in paper bags or in reusable bins marked as yard waste.



Branches and limbs need to be bundled with rope or string (do not use wire), additionally all branches, limbs, and bundles must be:

- weigh less than 60 pounds

Bulk Trash

Bulk trash collection is **by appointment only** on **Wednesdays**. Residents must schedule their collection by 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday by calling 301-773-2069 or by completing a Request Service form online at *www.batestrucking.com*. The Request Service form can be found on Customer Center tab at the top right corner of the Bates website.

Please note that bulk trash collection is limited to three (3) items per week.

Scheduling Process for Vaccine Appointments in Prince George's County

Anyone who lives or works in Prince George's County that wishes to receive the COVID-19 vaccine must fill out the County Health Department's pre-registration form:

https://bit.ly/PGCVaccineForm

When you are eligible to receive a vaccine based on the County's phased distribution plan AND appointments are available based on vaccine supply, the Health Department will send a link via email with instructions on how to schedule an appointment.

When the County enters future phases of vaccine distribution, individuals that have pre-registered will receive a notification that they are eligible, and as appointments become available, will begin to receive links to schedule appointments.





- Bring a form of photo identification to your appointment.
- If you are eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine because of your job, make sure you bring proof of employment with you to your appointment.



 If you have insurance, please bring your insurance card with you to your appointment.



 Current COVID-19 vaccines require two doses. Make sure you schedule your appointment for a second dose right after your appointment for the first dose, and make sure you keep that appointment.
