Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

Spring continues to be fantastic (yet so unpredictable, as spring is). I expected the cicadas in early May, but it was a bit cold so they were delayed – but they ARE spectacular. And loud. And crunchy.

COVID-19

Almost everything having to do with COVID is getting better, and in many cases much, much better. Restrictions have been largely lifted by Governor Hogan and County Executive Alsobrooks and our County Council has also responded, with attention to the differences between the situation in our county and in the state. All of this has been driven by changing advice from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or "the CDC." We must be careful to pay attention to the details in the CDC's advice as it will be important to ensure that our actions keep the dangers from the virus low while balancing that danger against the dangers of continued isolation. First, though, the current situation:

COVID-19: Cases

As I write this in the middle of May, diagnoses are down (relative to mid-April) by a factor of more than three, from 1400/day to 400/day. Hospitalizations are not down as much but are still dramatically lower — by a factor of two. ICU cases are down by less than a factor of two, which means that there are still a lot of seriously-ill people. Positivity, the fraction of tests that come back positive for COVID-19 infection, is also down by a factor of two, from 4.5 % in mid-April to 2.2 % now. While increasing vaccination rates have contributed to the incredible drop in cases, the seasonal nature of respiratory illnesses is also a factor.

COVID-19: New CDC Guidance

As I mentioned above, the CDC issued guidance on May 13 stating that *fully-vaccinated* individuals no longer needed to wear masks in most normal circumstances. As the White House tweeted, "We've gotten this far. Whether you choose to get vaccinated or wear a mask, please protect yourself until we get to the finish line." Remember that you are <u>not</u> fully vaccinated until *two weeks after* your last shot, for two-shot vaccines (Moderna or Pfizer), or the one shot for one-shot vaccines (J&J).

There are some important details to consider as you determine how to follow this advice: (1) if you have a condition that makes you more likely to get very sick if

you are infected (as I do), ask your health-care provider whether you should continue to wear a mask/isolate/... and, (2) masks are still necessary in health-care settings, correctional facilities, or homeless shelters.

The first item, taking advice from your health-care provider, seems straightforward and echoes a comment made by Governor Hogan as he lifted the restrictions. He noted that there are many reasons why people will continue to wear masks; please assume someone is doing it for a good reason (as I myself will, at least in the most-hazardous situations, until infection rates drop).

The second item, that the advice does not apply in circumstances where COVID infection is likely, reflects the fact that there is a residual risk of infection even for fully-vaccinated people. Where the risk is high you should still take precautions. Dr. Caitlin Rivers, an epidemiologist and infectious disease modeling expert at Johns Hopkins School of Public Health, stated recently that it would have been better to tie the new policy to incidence and diagnosis rates. She suggested a rate of five diagnoses/day per 100,000 population — 45 diagnoses a day in Prince George's County. We are at nearly twice that level when I am writing this article in mid-May. The good news is that we were at six times that level last month, so our county may well have hit the target level by the time you read this article. I hope that County officials, whose guidance we follow, are considering this as they move forward.

COVID-19: Vaccines

The vaccine supply is good, with walk-in vaccines widely available. We are working to bring vaccine clinics to the Riverdale Park Town Hall for residents who have had a difficult time getting to other sites.

As I write this article, 41% of all people in Maryland have received their final shot (and will thus be fully vaccinated when you read this in early June). Given the number of residents who have received their first vaccine, the 41% should rise to over 50% by the time you read this. (These numbers are lower than what you may have been seeing because I am including children currently ineligible for the vaccine (under 12 years of age) in my percentages.)

I recently read a statement by an infectious-disease specialist, who said that COVID-19 is expected to be circulating indefinitely – it will not be stamped out as MERS and SARS were by complete elimination of cases. He went on to say that this means that <u>unless you are</u> <u>vaccinated</u>, you will at some point in time come down <u>with COVID-19</u>. Please consider that as you decide whether to get the vaccine – you must weigh the *very small* risks from receiving the vaccines (discussed in my previous articles) against the virtual certainty that you will get COVID at some point in the future and become seriously ill.

COVID-19: Variants

The news on variants is also good – there are new ones that have emerged (one or two from the terrible waves of disease in India right now) but all of them are still controlled by the vaccines, and none appear to be more than around 50 % more likely to cause serious disease than the commonly-circulating variants.

As I said last month, continue to follow (or exceed!) CDC recommendations for preventing transmission, get vaccinated as soon as you can, and together we will get COVID-19 under control!

Town Budget

The Town Budget was discussed at length at the Work Session on April 26, and very briefly at the May 3 Legislative Session. I expect that it will have been adopted by the time you read this article.

Trash Pickup

As I mentioned last month, on April 17 the Town Council voted to terminate the contract with the existing vendor and switch to a new vendor. The Town had been working with the old vendor for a year and a half to resolve issues that included the vendor refusing to pick up trash from around 30 homes in the Riverdale Park Station section of Town, among other issues (the Town was picking up trash from these homes, which limited other activities of the Department of Public Works). We hope to have a smooth transition to the new vendor as we are winding down the old contract, which will happen no later than August 21.

Elections

Town elections were on May 3, and I would like to thank the each and every one of the 244 voters who participated (including 43 by absentee ballot). We will have a new council member from Ward 5 - challenger Karen Mejia received more votes than incumbent Colleen Richardson. We will also have a new council member from Ward 4, where Thomas Sadiq will fill the seat held by outgoing council member Chris Henry, who decided to not run after 14 years in the position. Congratulations to our new members, condolences to Council Member Richardson, and a big thank you to Chris Henry for his many years of service to the community! I and all members of the new Council will be sworn-in to our offices on June 7.

Mosquito Control Program



The Town will once again participate in the Maryland Department of Agriculture's Mosquito Control Program. Spray season began at the end of May and is anticipated to end in mid-September.

Spraying will take place after dark on **Tuesdays** and may continue until midnight or later. Spraying will commence as soon as it is dark. As a <u>precaution</u>, it is advised that residents stay inside their homes and close their windows while the spray truck is in the vicinity, bring in any pets, and remain in the home for 20-30 minutes after the spray truck has passed by. If there are people outside when the truck passes by, no spray will be released, and the truck will not make another pass down that street.

The spray schedule will rotate every 3 weeks meaning that Riverdale Park may not be sprayed each week. The frequency of spraying will be determined by surveillance data collected and complaints received. In order to determine if your community will be sprayed on its scheduled spray night, please contact 301-422-5080 between 2-4 p.m. that day. Any unscheduled sprayings will be announced on the Maryland Department of Agriculture's webpage www.mda.maryland.gov or on Twitter @MdAgMosquito and @MdAgDept.

For more information regarding the Department of Agriculture's Mosquito Control Program, visit http://mda.maryland.gov/plantspests/Pages/mosquito_control.aspx. As a reminder, to reduce the presence of mosquitos, residents must keep their property free of mosquitos breeding containers, stagnant water, bird baths, wading pools, pet watering dishes, tin cans, old tires, clogged gutters or flowerpots. Other water holding containers should be stored upside down.

To file a complaint about mosquitos, contact the Maryland Department of Agriculture at 301-422-5080 or file a complaint online via the MDA website (listed above).

Neighborhood Services

If you have concerns regarding a property in your neighborhood, please contact Neighborhood Services. One of the primary duties of the Neighborhood Services team is to educate residents about the Town's community standards. In most cases residents simply do not know that they are not meeting the Town's community standards as defined in the Town Code. In some cases, another community partner such as Prince George's County, may be needed to address your concerns. Emergency Repairs Grant Available

The Town is soliciting grant applications from homeowners and businessowners. This grant program is designed to assist with emergency repairs in homes and businesses that would otherwise not be addressed.

Successful applicants can be reimbursed for up to \$2,000 after work has been completed and paid for. An "emergency repair" is defined as a situation that is lifethreatening or one that prohibits someone from living in decent, safe, and sanitary conditions or is needed for the safe and continual operation of a business. Collection Reminders

Residential Trash

Residential trash should be placed in durable, leak proof bags <u>before</u> it is placed in cans. Be sure that the can's lid is tightly closed to keep rainwater out- this will help to reduce spillage. Excess trash should be placed beside your container.

Trash cans should be curbside by **6:00 a.m.** on **Mondays and Thursdays** or the night before collection.

Yard Waste

Do NOT mix yard waste with household trash. Yard waste must be placed in paper bags or in reusable bins marked as yard waste.



Branches and limbs need to

be bundled with rope or string (do not use wire), additionally all branches, limbs, and bundles must be:

- o less than 4 feet long,
- \circ less than 3 inches in diameter
- \circ weigh less than 60 pounds

Yard Waste should be curbside by **6:00 a.m**. on **Mondays** or the night before collection.

Bulk Trash

Bulk trash collection is **by appointment only** on **Wednesdays**. Residents must schedule their collection by 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday by calling 301-773-2069 or by completing a Request Service form online at *www.batestrucking.com*. The Request Service form can be found on Customer Center tab at the top right corner of the Bates website.

Please note that bulk trash collection is limited to three (3) items per week.

Recycling

Recycling bins should be curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Wednesdays. As a reminder, NO PLASTIC BAGS PERMITTED.

Curbside recycling is provided by Prince George's County Department of the Environment. Please call 311 or 301-883-4748, if you have any questions or concerns.

COVID-19 tests are available in Prince George's County. The Health Department is administering tests **BY APPOINTMENT ONLY**. Call **301-883-6627**. Our nurses evaluate you over the phone, and if you get an appointment, you will be assessed once again when you arrive. It may take a few days to get results. If you get tested and your symptoms get worse, DO NOT wait for your test results, SEEK MEDICAL CARE RIGHT AWAY.

This hotline is also for residents who have general COVID-19 questions or concerns. The hotline is open 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily to receive updated information about the coronavirus disease. ***Please contact 911 for medical emergencies only**.

Prince George's County COVID-19 Vaccination Information

COVID-19 vaccines are free for all residents who live and work in Prince George's County regardless of insurance coverage or immigration status.

Information provided during pre-registration will NOT be used by the federal, state or local government for any civil or criminal prosecution or enforcement, including, but not limited to, immigration enforcement. Your information will be private and protected. Providers and vaccination sites collect certain information from individuals receiving the vaccine to monitor how many people are receiving the vaccine and to ensure dose matching and appropriate timing for the second dose.

Complete the COVID-19 Pre-Registration Form to get on the vaccination wait-list. As appointments become available, individuals who complete and submit a preregistration form and are eligible will receive an email from the Health Department with a link and instructions on how to make a vaccine appointment. COVID-19 vaccines are offered by appointment only. You only need to pre-register once.

The County is currently vaccinating individuals 16 and older who live or work in the County. You will receive an email with your appointment details from the Health Department or one of our vaccination partners as appointments become available. When you go to your appointment, please make sure that you bring your ID and/or proof of employment documentation. If you need to reschedule your appointment or you have already received your vaccination and want to cancel, you can email the Health Department at *COVIDVax@co.pg.md.us*

The Health Department is also collaborating with hospitals, pharmacies, and other partners throughout the county to provide vaccinations to eligible residents from our pre-registration list. You may hear from one of them with appointment opportunities as well. We encourage you to explore all available resources.

In addition, the State of Maryland's vaccination sites are open to individuals 16 and older statewide. To access these sites, you must pre-register with the State (separate from the County Health Department's preregistration system) by visiting *covidvax.maryland.gov*, or calling 1-855-634-6829. You can also text "MDREADY" to 898-211, and you will receive text notifications on your smartphone regarding updates about Six Flags and the State's other mass vaccination sites.
