It's Time for the 2020 Census

What is the Census?

The census is a count of every person who lives in the United States and its territories. It happens every 10 years. In early 2020, you will be asked to count everyone who lives in your home as of April 1. Responding to the 2020 Census is a chance to shape your future.

Why should I participate?

Residents should complete the census because it is safe, easy, and important.

- <u>Safe:</u> Your personal information is confidential, including citizenship and other sensitive data, by law. Disclosure of personal data is subject to fine or imprisonment.
- <u>Easy:</u> You can complete the census online, by phone, or by mail. You can respond in 13 different languages via phone or online.
- <u>Important:</u> Data from the census provides the basis for annually distributing more than \$675 billion in federal funds which helps fund our roads, schools, hospitals, Medicaid, and many other programs.

How can I complete the Census?

In early 2020, every household in America will receive a notice to complete the census online, by phone, or by mail. Kiosks will be available at Town Hall for residents to complete their 2020 Census forms online. Town Hall will be a 2020 Census hub from March 23rd and March 27th.

When will I receive an invitation?

Residents will receive an invitation to go online to complete the census questionnaire between March 12th and 20th. Reminder letters will be sent out between March 16th and 24th. Residents who have not responded will receive a reminder postcard between March 26th and April 3rd.

How long will it take?

Completing the census should take no more than 10 minutes.

How secure is my information?

Your responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure, and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics. They cannot be used against you by any government agency or court in any way—not by the FBI, not by the CIA, not by the DHS, and not by ICE.

Fair Summary of Legislation

ORDINANCE 2020-OR-02

This is to give notice that the Riverdale Park Town Council has introduced and intends to take action on Ordinance 2020-OR-02.

Ordinance 2020-OR-02 would authorize and approve the Town's purchase of certain property owned by Charles Morris at 5000 Queensbury Road under certain terms and conditions.

ORDINANCE 2020-OR-03

This is to give notice that the Riverdale Park Town Council has introduced and intends to take action on Ordinance 2020-OR-03.

Ordinance 2020-OR-03 would regulate the location and operation of food trucks and food truck hubs in the Town of Riverdale Park; require a certain permit and permit fee to operate a food truck hub; provide penalties for violations; provide for certain appeals; provide that the provisions of this Ordinance are severable; and generally relate to the operation of food trucks and food truck hubs in the Town of Riverdale Park.

ORDINANCE 2020-OR-04

This is to give notice that the Riverdale Park Town Council has introduced and intends to take action on Ordinance 2020-OR-04.

Ordinance 2020-OR-04 would regulate through permit requirements, performance criteria and violations and penalties the placing, keeping and maintaining donation bins in the Town of Riverdale Park.

Ordinances 2020-OR-02, 2020-OR-03, and 2020-OR-04 are available for inspection by the public at Town Hall during normal business hours, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

As is usual this time of year, the days are getting longer and the weather is (in fits and starts) getting warmer. March weather is always unpredictable, but we do know that spring arrives this month...along with daylight savings time.

2020 Census

Starting March 12 through March 20, households will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail. Take your pick on how to respond, but it is essential that you do respond. The information collected during the Census determines how many representatives Maryland has in the US House of Representatives (and electors in presidential elections); the amount of federal money available for schools and grants to the Town; and funding for food stamps and children's health insurance. I know that many people are worried about their information being misused, but there are severe penalties for census staff who release information about individuals, individual households, or individual businesses (fines of up to \$250,000 and up to five years jail time), and I haven't found any record that these laws have ever been violated. In addition, all census staff with access to information about individuals have taken a lifetime oath to protect the confidential and private information entrusted to them. Riverdale Park has several difficultto-count populations, including students, immigrants, non-English speakers, the very young, and the very old. This means we need to encourage all of our friends and neighbors to accurately answer the nine questions for each person living in the household, which should take around ten minutes for a typical household.

Each person missed is estimated to cost the Town/County/State a total of more than \$20,000 over the next ten years, so make sure to count every person (from the age of 1 second to 130 years) where they live (and if there's any uncertainty about that, put them on the form for where they are staying on April 1, 2020). The town will be providing computers and an internet connection at Town Hall (5008 Queensbury) for anyone who needs them, and we will be holding events in coordination with the County to encourage all residents to participate and be counted. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Town Hall or me

- we want to have the most accurate count we can!

Purple Line Construction

I typically only get a few weeks (at best) of advance notice on Purple Line activities, so it is best to sign up for announcements directly from https://www.purplelinemd.com/construction/. There is nothing new (continued construction including temporary lane closures all along the path of the project through town), but I wanted to remind everyone that bridge ramp construction will make enough progress in the next month that turns across Kenilworth into/out of Quesada and Quintana will no longer be allowed. The Town Council will need to remove the one-way restriction on 54th between Quintana and Quesada to allow drivers to enter and exit the neighborhood via the shopping center parking lot. Centennial Celebration

As I've mentioned before, the Town will be having its 100th birthday on June 14. Plans are still evolving, but we will have the main part of the celebration on Saturday, June 13. At this time we have 2020 calendars celebrating the history of the town (available at Town Hall for \$10), some of the music for the event has been scheduled including the Wild Anacostia's and Chopteeth Afrofunk Big Band (both have members with Riverdale Park connections!), and I believe that Denizen's Brewery will be brewing a special Centennial beer as part of our celebration. Keep reading the Town Crier, follow the town and town council members on social media to keep up to date on what will happen – and contact Council Member Aaron Faulx if you want to contribute ideas, time, and energy to making the event happen!

Bits and Pieces

As is often true, there's a lot more going on than I can put in an article, so here we go (contact me if you want more information). The **Town email lists** were down for a few weeks, but are back up (TownTalk is, at least for the moment, on a different server – groups.io under the

name RPTownTalk - than Town Announce). The Maryland Legislature is in session, with at least a few bills that may impact the town in play – one that would change the structure of liquor licenses; another that will fund the Sustainable Maryland program that certifies our Green Team; and I imagine more than one bill to lay the financial foundations for implementing the Kirwan plan for improving public education. We are aware of stormwater issues at the Waggertail Dog Park and are in discussions with Parks and Planning on how to improve that situation. Our Green Team is working on **recertification**, with the application package due in July; anyone interested in helping out should contact our Green Team lead Lora Katz (contact me or Town Hall to get in touch with her). Last but not least, I'd like to thank everyone for sending me to the Maryland Mayor's Association meeting in early February - I learned a lot at the meeting and build important relationships with other mayors from around the state.

Centennial Update:

It's been a pretty hectic last couple of weeks on the Council side but it's one of those times where I really appreciate and enjoy the responsibility of getting to represent the Town. Things are starting to come together for our Centennial and I'm really excited about the events and activities that we are going to achieve as a town over the next year. Denizen's Brewing Company has agreed to make a small batch of a Centennial beer to help us commemorate this momentous occasion. Town Center Market has also agreed to host an event after the conclusion of our celebrations at 8pm on Saturday, June 13th. We hope to be able to close the portion of Queensbury the sits between TCM and Mable Munch Park in order to help celebrate their new outside patio as well as our Centennial. However, the final decision making on that will be made by the RPPD and the Fire Department.

Historic House and Garden Tour:

The Historic House and Garden walking tour will occur this year on Saturday, May 16th. Make sure to mark that date in your Riverdale Park Centennial Calendar. If you haven't purchased one yet they are still available at Town Hall. The Centennial Historical Subcommittee met on Thursday, February 20th to start discussions and planning for the Historic House and Garden Tour. We have so many beautiful homes to showcase in Riverdale Park! The work of Doug McElrath and his students at the University of Maryland has helped enshrine these homes and bring their history to light. We need to start making this an annual event in order to celebrate our history and their work.

Riverdale Park Green Team:

The Riverdale Park Green Team participated in Sustainable Maryland's Route 1 Summit at the Colmar Manor Community Center on Thursday, February 13th. The Town was represented by Lora Katz, Alex Hirtle, Sarah Batto, Mara Faulx, and me. Please join me in saying thank you to these residents for participating on behalf of the Town and helping us maintain and grow our commitment to sustainability and the environment. At the Summit, 15 local municipalities discussed what their towns are doing to highlight their commitment to environmental sustainability. It was quite inspiring to see all of these communities' efforts and the pride that they carry from their homes to events like these. Our

own Lora Katz was the first to speak and she highlighted what we are doing as a town but also where we need to go. We are grateful for her Herculean efforts pertaining to sustainability and environmental awareness in Riverdale Park and thankful that she's on our team! We need to continue to grow that team, however. If you are interested in joining our Green team, please reach out to me and I'll make sure that you get on our email list.

Green Team Continued:

These are just a random collection of my thoughts that I had while listening to the other communities discuss what they were attempting to do.

- √ I'd like to see some more dog waste stations throughout the town. I've noticed an abundance of dog waste in the community while walking our dog around the area which is both unsanitary and unsightly. Please take care of our shared spaces and pick up after you dog.
- ✓ Many local communities are arranging stations for the drop off of compost or even compost pick up. I don't think that picking up compost for residents is attainable yet, but I do want to try and arrange compost drop off location(s) in the town.
- ✓ Sustainable Maryland is creating a new designation, Bee City USA. I would like to utilize the space we are creating on the Field of Dreams location to promote pollinator gardens and achieve that designation.
- ✓ With our desire to plant 100 trees in the town for our Centennial, I also want to pursue the designation of Tree City USA.
- ✓ Greenbelt discussed "How to zero waste an event" as one of their initiatives. I would love to try and take steps in that direction for all town event's in the future.
- ✓ I can't wait until we start work on building our first community garden on the site of the old Boys and Girls club.

Riverdale Park Business Association:

Riverdale Park Business Association (RPBA) President Mike Herman invited me to speak to the group on Wednesday, February 12th on the upcoming Centennial and started a dialogue on how they can activate for the events. I was grateful to be invited and look forward to more conversations with RPBA in the future. There is still a lot of planning that needs to occur so stay tuned!

Riverdale Park Farmer's Market:

This past May, Jim Coleman and I discussed increasing the Town's commitment to supporting supplemental nutritional assistance. It is an issue that impacts both of us. As an educator, some of my favorite times are being around my students when they are eating. Their needs are being met. They are happy. They are fulfilled. We live in a time period where roughly 1/5 students suffer from food insecurity. They don't know when their next meal is going to occur. This is a statistic that I find to be crushing. Jim mentioned to me that he would like to see the Town increase its commitment by 10% to 20%. This would be an increase of \$300-\$600 dollars. In the face of a national political discussion where the WIC Farmers Market Nutrition Program has been recommended to be unfunded, I think that we can do better in Riverdale Park. Although I don't expect that the House will allow for these cuts to occur, I will be recommending to Town Council that we find the budget space to allocate these additional funds to our Farm Market. While I want to see food, insecurity solved across the country, Riverdale Park is a place where we can achieve this. Ward 2 resident Chris Fike has proposed to me multiple times that we need to be developing a no cost pantry and host food drives in order to help provide for those less fortunate that live amongst us. Let's utilize our 100th birthday celebration to make sure that none are left behind in Riverdale Park.

March is Ethics Awareness Month

Since 2017 the Town has recognized March as Ethics Awareness Month. This is an annual recognition that Ethics is central to our work as a municipal corporation. Each March the staff team rededicates its decision-making and daily work to ethical principles required by our professions. As part of this effort, every member of

the Town staff team participates in Ethics Training that includes discussions on common ethical questions and situations.



Texting and phone use are leading causes of distracted driving. The law in Maryland prohibits the use of a handheld phone while driving. This includes

the writing, sending or reading of a text or electronic message. Avoid a fine and park the phone before you drive.

All distractions endanger drivers, passengers and pedestrians. Most distractions involve cognitive and sensory distraction. When you make a call on a hand-held phone you are not only holding and looking at the phone, you are also dialing, listening and thinking about the conversation.

Driver distractions include:

- Texting
- Using a cell phone or smartphone
- Eating and drinking
- Talking to passengers
- Grooming
- Reading, including maps
- Using a navigation system
- Watching a video
- Adjusting a radio, CD player, or MP3 player

Remember distractions are:

- Visual looking at something other than the road
- Auditory hearing something not related to driving
- Manual manipulating something other than the wheel
- Cognitive thinking about something other than driving

Snow Information

Snow and Ice Removal

As we enter the snow season, please note that Public Works crews will be plowing and salting Town streets and parking lots to clear snow and ice. As in the past, we will treat our streets in the following method:

Primary Streets - i.e., Riverdale Road, Taylor Road, Lafayette Avenue, Queensbury Road, etc.

Residential Streets – i.e., Oliver Street, Madison Street, Rittenhouse Street, 47th Avenue, Somerset Road, Sora Lane, etc.



Please note: our major roadways, (Rt. 201, Rt. 1, Rt. 410, Good Luck Road), will be treated by the State and County.

Residents will be responsible for doing their part by keeping the walkway in front of their property cleaned of snow and ice after each event.

What Residents Can Do?

- Whenever possible, move parked cars off the street so that snowplows can remove the snow from the street from curb to curb.
- If off-street parking is not available, park on the even side of the street (violators will be subject to having their vehicles impounded and fined \$250 - 64-10(b)(c)).
- Be patient during any snow emergency as crews work around the clock to clear the streets.
- Clear sidewalks in front of residence and refrain from depositing snow back on to the roadway (this can potentially cause an accident).

Snow Emergency Conditions

Snow emergency conditions shall be considered in effect within the Town of Riverdale Park whenever a snow emergency is declared in effect in Prince George's County by the Prince George's County Executive, the Maryland State Highway Administration, or the Maryland State Police.

Laws that apply:

- During any period in which a snow emergency condition exists and a snow emergency is in effect, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any part of any street designated as a snow emergency street, provided that signs have been erected on that street giving notice that such street is a designated snow emergency street.
- During any period in which a snow emergency condition is in effect, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on the <u>odd-numbered side of any public street</u> in the Town of Riverdale Park regardless of whether such street has been designated a snow emergency street. Streets with parking restricted on one side are exempt from this section.
- Any vehicle parked in violation of the snow emergency provisions of the section may be removed and impounded by or under the direction of any duly authorized police officer.
- The owner of said vehicle, in addition to any towing or impound fee, shall be liable for a fine of \$250.
