NOTICE OF A PROPOSED REAL PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Riverdale Park proposes to increase real property taxes.

1. If the Town of Riverdale Park maintains the current tax rate of \$0.6540 per \$100 of assessment, real property tax revenues will increase by 4.8% resulting in \$249,425 of new real property tax revenues.

2. For the tax year beginning July 1, 2023, the estimated real property assessable base will increase by 4.8% from \$795,433,176 to \$833,571,585.

3. In order to fully offset the effect of increasing assessments, the real property tax rate should be reduced to \$0.6241, the constant yield tax rate.

4. The Town is considering not reducing its real property tax rate enough to fully offset increasing assessments. The Town proposes to adopt a real property tax rate of \$0.6540 per \$100 of assessment. This tax rate is 4.8% higher than the constant yield tax rate and will generate \$249,425 in additional property tax revenues.



This Ordinance would abandon a certain alley in the Town of Riverdale Park as a public road and authorize its closure; authorize the alley to be removed from the Town's public roads inventory; and generally, relate to the abandonment and closing of a certain alley as a public road.

The alley referred to in the Ordinance is known as the 54th Place Alley, is 30' wide and extends 258.50 feet south from Riverdale Road to a dead-end at its terminus. Since 1956 the Town has treated and used the alley as a public alley and has included the alley on its public roads inventory. If the alley is abandoned and closed as a public road, the Town intends to replace the paved road with an open vegetated area for use as a pocket park by the general public. The conversion of this property from a paved road to a vegetated pocket park will contribute to the fulfillment of the Town's desire to reduce impervious surfaces in the Town, eliminate the need, cost and expense of maintaining and repaving the alley in the future, and provide additional open recreational space for Town residents.

Mayor Thompson's Message—May 2023

As I write this report in the middle of April, my windows are open and I can hear the frogs singing in my neighbor's yard. The trees are bright green and lush with new leaves, the temperature is perfect, and I am happy it is spring. Because it is a busy time of year this report will be a bit shorter.



Elections: It is likely that the elections, which are scheduled for Monday, May 1 from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm, will be over by the time you see the printed version of this report. Based on those who submitted an application to be on the ballot and are unopposed – including me – it's likely there will be a lot of returning members. The new council will be sworn

into office on June 5. I'd like to express my most sincere thanks to Hala Mayers and Thomas Sadiq, who are not running for reelection, for serving on the council – it is important and at times difficult work, and I saw how hard both of you worked to represent your constituents and improve the town as a whole. I'd also like to thank the members of the Board of Elections and town staff, who have worked hard to make this election happen!

State Legislation: There's some good news and some bad news out of the legislature. The bad news is that the bill introduced by Senator Alonzo Washington to double stormwater funding was adopted by both the Senate and House of Delegates, but the Senate ran out of time before adopting amendments from the House so the bill was not passed. On the good news side, the bill that would have reduced school zones to be only 0.1 mile did not pass. And I was informed by Senator Washington's office that he had secured \$150,000 for a stormwater project in Riverdale Park, which is great news. I'd like to thank Senator Washington for his advocacy on behalf of the many residents of Riverdale Park who are impacted by stormwater.

COVID-19: The COVID-19 news is not so rosy as it was in March. While the XBB.1.5 variant that was dominant in our area then is still dominant, there is a new variant that has been seen in 17 states so far: XBB.1.16, which has a nickname of "Arcturus." It was first seen in India and has recently been identified as a variant under monitoring by the World Health Organization and US CDC. It appears to be more infectious than XBB.1.5 and has a symptom that has not been seen in other variants – conjunctivitis or pink eye. As with all versions of this virus, it's best to avoid infection, and given the season I would recommend doing that by opening your windows and socializing outdoors! As always, wearing a mask helps reduce the chance of infection, and there is encouraging news that being up-to-date on vaccinations halves the likelihood of long COVID. Stay safe and healthy!

Mosquitos: It's that time of year – start implementing a mosquito control program before they get bad. We will again be using our Biogent GAT Traps – they worked quite well for us last summer! Other helpful strategies include: emptying standing water from pots, gutters, drains, and yard furniture and cover the ends of above-ground drainpipes with nylon stockings. Using mosquito dunks in birdbaths, small ponds, below ground drains or where standing water cannot be removed. Dunks are available at local hardware stores in granular form or in doughnut shapes, and are specifically designed to prevent larvae from hatching without endangering pets and wildlife.

National Mental Health Awareness Month

Mental health is how we think about life or issues, feel about ourselves/others, and how we handle

change, stress, and other things that happen to us. With good mental health, you feel good about yourself, relaxed with other people, and handle tasks and problems easily. Taking care of your mental health is just as important as taking care of your



body. If you have a broken bone, you go to a doctor; if you have a mental health problem, you should seek treatment. Mental illness covers a wide variety of disorders, e.g.: anxiety, bipolar disorder, borderline personality disorder, depression, schizophrenia, substance use and other self-harm. If you're worried about your mental health, start by talking to friends, family, a spiritual counselor, or your physician about concerns. Your doctor can explain what you are experiencing and make referrals for mental health treatment. Visit health.maryland.gov to search mental health services by zip code. In Maryland, most health insurance plans cover some mental health treatment. If you or a loved one is experiencing a mental health crisis, suicidal thoughts, or another related concern, call 211 and press 1, or text MD to 741741.

In addition, Starting in 2022, "988" became the threedigit, nationwide phone number for connecting to the Suicide and Crisis Lifeline, formerly the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. By calling or texting 988, you'll speak directly with mental health professionals. Veterans may press "1" after dialing 988, to access the Veterans Crisis Lifeline, which serves our nation's service members, veterans, National Guard and Reserve members, and those who support them. For texts, continue to text the Veterans Crisis Lifeline short code: 838255. There is hope. The 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline is a national network of more than 200 crisis centers that help thousands of people overcome crisis situations every day. These centers are supported by local and state sources as well as the Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The 988 Lifeline provides 24/7, confidential support to people in suicidal crisis or mental health distress.

Same Day Voter Registration

On May 1, 2023

How do I register to vote?

Residents may register to vote in one of the following ways on Election Day:



If you are a U.S. citizen, a Maryland resident, and at least 16 years old; you may register to vote by using the State of Maryland Voter Registration Application found on the Town's website www.riverdaleparkmd.gov; OR

If you have, or will have, the Town of Riverdale Park as your primary residence, for at least fortyfive (45) days immediately prior to May 1, 2023 (March 17, 2023 to April 30, 2023); are at least 16 years old; do not claim the right to vote elsewhere in the United States; and have not been found by a court to be unable to communicate a desire to vote; register to vote by using the Town of **Riverdale Park Supplemental Voter Registry Voter** Registration Form found on the Town's website www.riverdaleparkmd.gov.

What forms of identification and proof of residence will be accepted for the supplemental voter registry?

An identification card issued by a federal, state, or local government entity of the United States or any foreign country or school provided that the identification document contains the applicant's name and date of birth; AND

A document that establishes your current resi-VOTE dence in the Town of Riverdale Park if not already established by (1.) above. Examples include a copy of house or apartment lease, utility bill, paycheck, bank statement, school record, or other document that shows your legal name and current address in the Town of Riverdale Park.

Preparing for Election Day on May 1st

Prior to Election Day:

- If you moved recently, be sure to update your voter registration with the Prince George's County Board of Elections (County/State voters) 301-341-7300 or the Town Clerk (TRP Supplemental Voter Registry voters) 301-927-6381, extension 505.
- Review the list of candidates that is available on the Town's website or on the Election Notices posted in each ward and throughout Town.
- If you requested an Absentee (Mail-in) Ballot, be sure to return it as soon as possible. Absentee (Mail -in) Ballots can be returned by mail or by depositing them in the Ballot Drop Box at Town Hall. Absentee (Mail-in) Ballots must be received by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, May 1, 2023.

On Election Day:

- Plan to arrive at the polls (Town Hall) after 7:00 a.m. and before 8:00 p.m.
- If you plan to register to vote on Election Day, be sure to bring the required documentation. Voter registration forms are available on the Town's website or in the document holder at Town Hall, if you would like to complete the voter registration form prior to Election Day.

Information regarding Write-in campaigns

Town Code § 29-13 (b) states: "...in the event no candidate files for an office, such office may be filled by a write-in vote for a person qualified to hold the office if elected, provided that there are at least as many valid votes for such write-in candidate as the number of qualified petition signatures necessary if the candidate had filed a petition for that office. If no such number of votes are cast, the office is declared vacant, and the vacancy shall be filled in the manner prescribed for that office by the Town Charter."

This means that a write-in candidate for a council seat must receive a minimum of 15 write-in votes and a majority of the votes cast for that Ward. For the Mayor's race, a write-in candidate must receive a minimum of 25 write-in votes and a majority of the votes cast for Mayor.

Town Code § 29-11 states: "...Any qualified person elected to a town office by write-in vote shall pay the same fee as if they had filed a petition."

Neighborhood Services

If you have concerns regarding a property in your neighborhood, please contact Neighborhood Services. One of the primary duties of the Neighborhood Services team is to educate residents about the Town's community standards. In most cases residents simply do not know that they are not meeting the Town's community standards as defined in the Town Code. In some cases, another community partner such as Prince George's County, may be needed to address your concerns. Information about the Town's community standards can be found on the Town's website, www.riverdaleparkmd.gov, under Town Code and TRP's Vision and Commitment Statements.

Streetlight outages can be quickly and easily reported through the PEPCO website at https:// pepco.streetlightoutages.com/ or by calling 1-800-735-2258. The online streetlight outage reporting tool is available 24/7.

Emergency Repairs Grant Available

The Town is soliciting grant applications from homeowners and businessowners for the Emergency Repair Grant Program. This grant program is designed to assist with emergency repairs in homes and businesses that would otherwise not be addressed. An "emergency repair" is defined as a situation that is life-threatening or one that prohibits someone from living in decent, safe, and sanitary conditions or is needed for the safe and continual operation of a business.

Successful applicants can be reimbursed for up to \$2,000 after work has been completed and paid for or \$5,000 if the applicant can demonstrate the emergency repair is due to a natural disaster. Applicants that have a household income of no greater than 50% of the Area Median Income can have the matching requirement waived. Grants require a 1:2 match for the first one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and a 1:1 match thereafter. Grants are subject to funding availability

Prince George's County Rain Check Rebate

Chesapeake Bay Trust is partnering with PG County on its Rain Check Rebate Program. The program offers rebate incentives to homeowners, businesses and others, to improve stormwater runoff quality (reducing pollutions and improving local stream and river health).

7 stormwater options eligible for rebate: rain barrels, cisterns, rain gardens, urban tree canopies, pavement removal, permeable pavement, and green roofs.

Eligibility: An applicant must be the property owner or a nonprofit organization with an agreement to complete a project on public property. Applicants are not eligible for this program if the project is part of the permit-approval requirements for new building construction or renovations.

For nonprofits working with owners, to install Rain Check Rebate practices on residential property, go to cbtrust.org/rain-check-for-nonprofit-organizations.

Maximum rebate amounts: Each practice supported by the program has a rebate allowance based on the project type and size. A project must meet the criteria and minimum size requirements to qualify for a rebate. The total maximum rebate amount for the lifetime of the property is \$6,000 for residential properties and \$20,000 for commercial, industrial and institutional properties. An applicant may complete multiple projects until the maximum rebate amount is met.
