Fair Summary of Legislation

FAIR SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE 2021-OR-09

This is to give notice that the Riverdale Park Town Council has introduced and intends to take action on Ordinance 2021-OR-09.

Ordinance 2021-OR-09 would add new Section O-6 to the Town of Riverdale Park Personnel Manual; require certain Town employees to obtain vaccination against certain diseases as a condition of employment and fitness for duty, with certain exceptions; and generally, relate to revisions to the Town Personnel Manual.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

Finally, the cool weather has arrived as autumn sweeps through town. At the farmer's market the tomatoes are disappearing, but crisp, tart apples are taking their place. It's hard to believe that 2021 is nearly gone.

Apologies and Thanks to the RVFD

I must apologize for neglecting to mention the Riverdale Volunteer Fire Department in my report last month. The Ward 1 special election was held at the firehouse, with the volunteers were our gracious hosts for the day. I'm sure it disrupted their routine, but they were friendly and helpful. Many thanks to all of the members who helped the election run smoothly by opening their space for everyone running or participating in the election.

COVID-19 – Pandemic

Every morning, around 8:30, I receive in my email a report of the status of the pandemic – daily and averaged diagnoses, deaths, and vaccination rates for Prince George's County, DC, neighboring counties, and the state. Many days recently we have had no deaths in the county, but sometimes there are several, and I know there is pain, suffering, and sadness from each of those deaths.

Except for an unusual spike in cases on October 10 (I assume because of delayed reporting), the numbers have been steadily decreasing since the middle of September (I'm writing this a few days past October 15). With any luck the trend will continue, and the case rate will drop below 10 cases per 100,000 population per day, a number that those who study epidemics say is an important milestone, where we can start to relax...a little. Still only 75 % of those eligible to be vaccinated are fully vaccinated. Still our case rate is ten times the number of cases that we had in late June. And still people are dying. We have a long way to go, and the more careful we all are, the sooner we will be done with this pandemic. Being careful, of course, means the same things as always: wearing masks, maintaining distance, washing hands, and most importantly getting vaccinated, including getting the recently-approved booster shot, for those who qualify to receive it.

One person who recently died of COVID was Colin Powell. He was fully vaccinated, but his immune system was compromised, and he had not received his booster (he had an appointment to receive it when he became ill). As I read the article about his final days, I thought about the fact that someone had transmitted the virus to Secretary Powell, someone probably much younger and healthier, and most likely unvaccinated. That person may have thought that they didn't need to get the vaccine, and there's a good chance that they didn't need it, but, Secretary Powell did need them to get it. Had that person, whoever it is, gotten vaccinated a few months earlier, Secretary Powell would still be alive today. I read an estimate that 3 % of the US population has a moderately to severely compromised immune system, which means there are a few hundred in Riverdale Park, and at least 30,000 in the county. Those 30,000 people are counting on the young and healthy to get vaccinated, so the people with compromised immune systems (and children under 12) have a better chance to survive.

Assistance for Veterans

My neighbor Robert White is always interested in helping veterans get all of the benefits to which they are entitled, both from the federal government and the state. If you are a veteran and would like his assistance, please contact him Monday thru Thursday between 9am and 6pm at 240-898-4011. He can assist with VA claims and is a wealth of knowledge about all benefits available to veterans.

Congratulations and Farewell to Chief Morris

It is with gratitude, mixed with a little sadness, that I give Police Chief David Morris congratulations and best wishes on his retirement, which will happen in November. Chief Morris started with the town shortly after I was first elected, and he has always had a sharp focus on excellent policing and on providing his officers and civilian staff with the resources, training, and support they need to do their jobs well. His focus on continuous improvement, and his insistence on hiring only the best officers, have helped to create the professional force that keep us all safe. As he said when he announced his retirement to the Council, policing requires extreme sacrifice for both the officers and their families, and Chief Morris has earned his retirement, and the ability to relax and spend time with his family. Chief, you are always welcome in Riverdale Park. I'll make the time to talk over a cup of coffee or two any time you want to drop by!

Collection Reminders



Residential Trash

Place residential trash in durable, leak-proof bags before placing it in containers. Close lid tightly to keep rainwater out to reduce spillage. Clean trash can regularly. Place trash can curbside by 6:00 a.m. on

Mondays and Thursdays or the night before collection.

Yard Waste

Do NOT mix yard waste with household trash. Place yard waste in paper bags or in reusable bins marked as yard waste. Bundle branches and limbs with rope or string (do not use wire). Bundles



must be less than 4 feet long and less than 3 inches in diameter, and weigh less than 60 pounds. Place yard waste curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Mondays or the night before collection.

Recycling

As a reminder, NO PLASTIC BAGS ARE PERMITTED. Curbside recycling is provided by Prince George's County Department of the Environment. Please call 311 or 301-883-



4748, if you have any questions or concerns about this service. Place recycling bins curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Wednesdays.



Bulk Trash

Collection is by appointment only on Thursdays. Schedule collection by 12:00 p.m. on Wednesdays by calling 240-604-6077 or online at

www.jedatruckinginc.com/book-online. Please note that bulk trash collection is limited to three (3) items per week. Set out bulk trash scheduled for pickup by 6 a.m. on Thursday.

Report a Concern

To report a concern, call 301-927-6381 or submit a request online. The Trash Concerns app can be used to order a new trash container, report missed



collections and report any other trash-related concerns. Visit www.riverdaleparkmd.gov and click on the Trash Concerns icon.

Disposing of Bamboo

Bamboo should be placed in a trash container or tied together in bundles no longer than 4 feet long and 12 inches across. Bamboo may also be dropped off at the Public Works building on Bulk Trash Drop off Saturday



but is limited to a maximum of 15 bundles (4 feet by 12 inches) on a given drop off day.

Bulk Trash Drop off Saturday the Public Works facility takes place on the 3rd Saturday of every month from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The Public Works facility is located at 5012 Queensbury Road.

Leaf Collection

Residents are encouraged to bag their leaves and/or mulch them during lawn mowing instead of pushing them into the streets. It is extremely important to keep storm drains clear of leaves to allow the system optimal performance during a rain event.

To support leaf bagging, Public Works staff distributed ten (10) leaf bags to each single-family residence in Town. FREE leaf bags will also be available for pick up on the third Saturday of the month (9 a.m. to 2 p.m.) at the bulk trash drop off at the Public Works building until mid-January. Identification confirming residency is required.

Bagged leaves should be set out curbside by 6 a.m. on Mondays for collection by the Town's hauler. If residents choose to mulch their leaves or will otherwise not use the leaf bags, they are encouraged to give them to a neighbor.

Emergency Repairs Grant Available

The Town is soliciting grant applications from homeowners and businessowners. This grant program is designed to assist with emergency repairs in homes and businesses that would otherwise not be addressed.

Successful applicants can be reimbursed for up to \$2,000 after work has been completed and paid for. An "emergency repair" is defined as a situation that is life-threatening or one that prohibits someone from living in decent, safe, and sanitary conditions or is needed for the safe and continual operation of a business. Prince George's County COVID-19 Vaccination Information

COVID-19 vaccines are free for all residents who live and work in Prince George's County regardless of insurance coverage or immigration status.

Information provided during pre-registration will NOT be used by the federal, state or local government for any civil or criminal prosecution or enforcement, including, but not limited to, immigration enforcement. Your information will be private and protected. Providers and vaccination sites collect certain information from individuals receiving the vaccine to monitor how many people are receiving the vaccine and to ensure dose matching and appropriate timing for the second dose.

Complete the COVID-19 Pre-Registration Form to get on the vaccination wait-list. As appointments become available, individuals who complete and submit a preregistration form and are eligible will receive an email from the Health Department with a link and instructions on how to make a vaccine appointment. COVID-19 vaccines are offered by appointment only. You only need to pre-register once.

The County is currently vaccinating individuals 16 and older who live or work in the County. You will receive an email with your appointment details from the Health Department or one of our vaccination partners as appointments become available. When you go to your appointment, please make sure that you bring your ID and/or proof of employment documentation. If you need to reschedule your appointment or you have already received your vaccination and want to cancel, you can email the Health Department at *COVIDVax@co.pg.md.us*

The Health Department is also collaborating with hospitals, pharmacies, and other partners throughout the county to provide vaccinations to eligible residents from our pre-registration list. You may hear from one of them with appointment opportunities as well. We encourage you to explore all available resources.

In addition, the State of Maryland's vaccination sites are open to individuals 16 and older statewide. To access these sites, you must pre-register with the State (separate from the County Health Department's pre-registration system) by visiting covidvax.maryland.gov, or calling 1-855-634-6829. You can also text "MDREADY" to 898-211, and you will receive text notifications on your smartphone regarding updates about Six Flags and the State's other mass vaccination sites.

Maryland Homeowner Assistance Fund
