Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

I'm continuing to enjoy the beautiful fall weather and eating a small mountain of delicious apples. That being said, it's almost impossible to find ripe local tomatoes now, and I can feel winter approaching. This month is the beginning of the holiday season, and I hope that everyone enjoys them.

Recent Armed Robbery

On October 14 there was an armed robbery in town. Fortunately, no one was injured, but it could have turned out much worse. Because there is an active investigation as I write this, I don't want to provide any details about the robbery, but I would like to address some issues that it has raised.

I'll start with the reports that I've heard that there have been similar incidents over the years (some quite a while ago, others within the last two years), and many of those incidents were not reported to the police. The police department cannot combat crime if they don't know about it, so if you the victim of a crime, PLEASE contact the police as quickly as possible. I understand that people who are having immigration issues are reluctant to contact the police, but our department is very careful to protect the identity of victims and will neither request immigration status nor share information with federal immigration authorities, particularly for victims of crime. The Town has worked for many years to help *all* residents feel comfortable reporting crimes to the police – please share this information with your friends and neighbors who are immigrants.

The second is that the victim believed they were being followed shortly before the robbery occurred. If you are in a situation like this, contact the police immediately. Several years ago, I was followed late one night when I was out for a walk. There was no question that I was being followed, and that attack was likely. I loudly contacted the police over my cell phone, which caused the people following me to turn around and run. If you are in your vehicle and believe you are being followed, call the police and drive to the police station at 5004 Queensbury Road. Criminals don't want to be caught and are unlikely to commit a crime right in front of the police station. It would help to have the police number - 301-927-4343 - programmed into your phone, and to learn how to get to the police station if you don't already know.

COVID-19

I hope that you are reading this early in November, because it seems likely that we will have another wave of COVID-19 starting in mid-to-late November, and it would be good for residents to be prepared for it. The Town is preparing for this wave by stocking up on N95 masks and is making plans to distribute them to residents in late October or early November.

As I mentioned last month, there are a *lot* of different variants of the virus circulating, and it is unclear whether we will have a single-variant wave or whether multiple variants (each with different severity of symptoms and transmissibility) will be involved. The most likely variants to drive the wave have mutations that mean your immune response (from pre-September vaccinations and/or pre-June illness) will be less effective at combatting the virus; this is also true for many of the antiviral drugs on the market. If you have not received the latest bivalent booster (approved by the FDA on August 31, 2022) you should do so as soon as possible. This updated booster trains your immune system to target the BA.4 and BA.5 variants that circulated this summer, and the booster is your best bet for staying healthy should you be exposed or infected.

On top of the unfortunately imperfect protection of the vaccines, there are the same old (but still-effective!) strategies: masks, good ventilation, and sterilization/filtering of air. These strategies will reduce your chances of infection, and it appears that they also reduce the severity of the infection should that happen. As always, you can't catch it if you aren't exposed, so those most at risk for severe disease should isolate from others as much as possible. While there's an emerging consensus that most transmission of recent variants is through the air, it also never hurts to wash your hands!

Stay safe!

Development - Apartments

We are continuing to communicate with the developers for the two proposed apartment buildings (on the west side of Town, near Town Center) that I mentioned in my report last month. Based on recent conversations with the developers, the next phase of discussions will be with the Legacy Mixed-Use Town Center (LMUTC) Local Design Review Committee. The LMUTC meetings are usually on the first Wednesday of the month at 7:30 pm, but there may be more frequent or rescheduled meetings if needed. All LMUTC meetings are announced in advance on the Town's website, social

media channels (Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter), and the TownAnnounce email list.

Redistricting

By the time you read this, the Redistricting Committee will have met twice since my report in last month's Town Crier, though one of these meetings hasn't yet happened as I write this report. Right now, there are three draft maps (one relatively similar to the current wards, and two that are quite different than the current map). You can find the latest versions of all three maps on the Town's website (riverdaleparkmd.gov). I anticipate that the Redistricting Committee will finalize at least two maps (for recommendation to the Town Council) at their November 16 meeting, but it's possible that there will be another meeting in December. The Committee has been very focused on generating maps that meet all legal requirements and, to the extent possible, gather residents with similar concerns in wards. The Town Council will choose the final map and is allowed to make adjustments to the Committeerecommended map before adoption.

Leaf Collection

Residents are encouraged to bag their leaves and/or mulch them during lawn mowing. It is extremely important to keep storm drains clear of leaves to allow the system optimal performance during a rain event.

To support leaf bagging, Public Works staff will distribute ten (10) leaf bags to each single-family residence in Town. FREE leaf bags will also be available for pick up on the third Saturday of the month (9 a.m.

to 2 p.m.) at the bulk trash drop off at the Public Works building until mid-January. Identification confirming residency is required.

Bagged leaves should be set out curbside by 6 a.m. on Mondays for collection by the Town's hauler. If residents choose to mulch their leaves or will otherwise not use the leaf bags, they are encouraged to give them to a neighbor.

Collection Reminders



Residential Trash

Place residential trash in durable, leak-proof bags before placing it in containers. Close lid tightly to keep rainwater out to reduce spillage. Clean trash can regularly. Place trash can curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Mondays and Thursdays or

the night before collection.

Yard Waste

Do NOT mix yard waste with household trash. Place yard waste in paper bags or in reusable bins marked as yard waste. Bundle



branches and limbs with rope or string (do not use wire). Bundles must be less than 4 feet long and less than 3 inches in diameter, and weigh less than 60 pounds. Place yard waste curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Mondays or the night before collection.

Recycling

As a reminder, NO PLASTIC BAGS ARE PERMITTED. Curbside recycling is provided by Prince George's County Department of the Environment. Please call 311 or 301-



883-4748, if you have any questions or concerns about this service. Place recycling bins curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Wednesdays.



Bulk Trash

Collection is by appointment only on Thursdays. Schedule collection by 12:00 p.m. on Wednesdays by calling 240-604-6077 or online at

www.jedatruckinginc.com/book-online. Please note that bulk trash collection is limited to three (3) items per week. Set out bulk trash scheduled for pickup by 6 a.m. on Thursday.

Report a Concern

To report a concern, call 301-927-6381 or submit a request online. The Trash Concerns app can be used to order a new trash container,





report missed collections and report any other trash-related concerns. Visit www.riverdaleparkmd.gov and click on the Trash Concerns icon.

Disposing of Bamboo

Bamboo should be placed in a trash container or tied together in bundles no longer than 4 feet long and 12 inches across. Bamboo may also be dropped off at the Public Works building on Bulk Trash Drop off

Saturday but is limited to a maximum of 15 bundles (4 feet by 12 inches) on a given drop off day.

Bulk Trash Drop off Saturday the Public Works facility takes place on the 3rd Saturday of every month from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The Public Works facility is located at 5012 Queensbury Road.

Emergency Housing Assistance

On March 7, 2022, Town Council approved the creation of the Emergency Housing Assistance (EHA) program and on March 28, 2022, approved funding for program in response to the exponential need for housing assistance due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The EHA program provides rent, mortgage and utility assistance to eligible residents facing or that faced a financial hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Town has partnered with Sowing Empowerment & Economic Development, Inc. (SEED), a HUD-certified counseling agency to administer the program on behalf of the Town.

Tenants and homeowners may apply for their delinquent rental or mortgage payments that began April 1, 2020, for up to 12 months of back rent. The monthly amount of assistance is based on the actual rent or mortgage value less all late fees, interest, and other costs associated with the applicant's default. Residents are able to apply for utility assistance singularly or combined with rent or mortgage assistance. Utility assistance includes gas, electricity, water/sewer. A Social Security number or birth certificate is NOT required to apply. All Town residents that are in need, had a financial setback and defaulted on rent, mortgage or utility payments are encouraged


