Riverdale Park Receives Prestigious Sustainable Maryland Certified Award

The Environmental Finance Center at the University of Maryland announced that the Town of Riverdale Park was one of 16 Maryland municipalities honored at the Sustainable Maryland Awards Ceremony at the 2023 Maryland Municipal League's annual Fall Conference. Sustainable Maryland is an initiative that is designed to support Maryland's 157 municipalities as



they look for cost-effective and strategic ways to protect their natural assets and revitalize their communities. Sustainable Maryland is a certification program for municipalities in Maryland that want to go green, save money, and take steps to sustain their quality of life over the long term.

Highlights of Riverdale Park's Accomplishments Include:

♥ The Town of Riverdale Park established a Farmers Market Dollars program to assist residents impacted by economic stressors and continues to fund the program each year; the Town dispersed \$248,043 to address food insecurity through the Farmers Market Dollars Program in FY2023 and has budgeted \$100,000 for FY2024.

♥ The Town of Riverdale Park started planning and has budgeted, to design and create two linear parks on underutilized Town-owned property. This is an innovative approach to preserve green space on public land, improve pedestrian connectivity to the existing street grid, and increase community access to parks.

VISION AND COMMITMENT

The Town Council is working on a variety of Vision and Commitment statements, which we on the Council use to remind ourselves of long-term goals, and the town staff use when proposing policies (including the priorities in the budget) to us. We have already discussed, but not completed, statements on Housing and Neighborhoods, and Sustainability, and just started discussion of Business and Economic Development and Infrastructure. I encourage everyone in town to review these statements and provide feedback to your representatives (including me!) as we work through them in the months ahead.

SUSTAINABLE MARYLAND RECOGNITION

I am delighted to report that the Town of Riverdale Park has received Silver Certification from Sustainable Maryland. The Town Council, staff, members of the Green Team, and town residents work collaboratively to identify and implement projects and programs to make the Town more sustainable. I was particularly pleased to see our efforts in Watershed Stewardship were recognized, as that has been a priority of the Town in recent years. The fact that we were recognized with the highest level of certification demonstrates Riverdale Park's commitment to continually improving sustainability.

COVID-19

The COVID-19 situation looking better now than it has for several months. While the "influenza-like-illness" indicator was high in Washington DC for the last few weeks, it has dropped, as have hospitalizations and test positivity in our region. While things are good now, we don't know what the future holds so don't let down your guard TOO much. If you haven't gotten the latest vaccine (approved in September) I recommend it....and think about getting a flu vaccine (and RSV if you are 60 or older).

Utility Scam Awareness Month



As the holidays approach, Pepco offers tips to help residents identify scammers attempting to steal money and personal information. Pepco generally sees increased reports of attempted scams during the holiday season, when targeted victims' stress and activity levels are high. The ruse: trick customers into: providing personal and/or financial information, and making false payments under the pretense of keeping their service active. Scammers are also attempting to swindle those still facing pandemic-related economic challenges, by pressuring families and businesses struggling with pastdue balances.

Pepco has some tips to help identify scams:

Pepco will never come to customer's home or business to:

- Request immediate payment, especially with a prepaid cash card or cryptocurrency.
- Ask for a Pepco account number, or other personal info, such as a driver's license number.
- Disconnect service without previous written warning. If a person comes to your home/ business to disconnect service, call Pepco to discuss your account status.

Pepco will never call a customer to ask for:

- An account number.
- Personal information, such a Social Security number or bank information.
- A direct payment with a prepaid cash card.

To identify an actual Pepco employee, know:

- All field employees wear a uniform with the Pepco logo, including shirt and safety vest.
- Pepco employees visibly display a company ID badge with the logo and employee's name.

Small Business Saturday

Small Business Saturday is a national shopping day that takes place on the Saturday after Thanksgiving. In 2023, Small Business Saturday is on November 25. It is day to celebrate and support small businesses and all they do for our communities. This year, we know that our small businesses need our support now more than ever as they navigate, retool and pivot from the effects of the coronavirus pandemic. Live music will be provided to complement our campaign to #SHOPLOCAL and #SHOPTRP.

Emergency Repairs Grant Available

The Town is soliciting grant applications from homeowners and businessowners for the Emergency Repair Grant Program. This grant program is designed to assist with emergency repairs in homes and businesses that would otherwise not be addressed. An "emergency repair" is defined as a situation that is life-threatening or one that prohibits someone from living in decent, safe, and sanitary conditions or is needed for the safe and continual operation of a business. Successful applicants can be reimbursed for up to \$2,000 after work has been completed and paid for or \$5,000 if the applicant can demonstrate the emergency repair is due to a natural disaster. Applicants that have a household income of no greater than 50% of the Area Median Income can have the matching requirement waived. Grants require a 1:2 match for the first one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and a 1:1 match thereafter. Municipal Government Works Month

UNICIPAL OVERNMENT WORKS

Since 1993, Maryland's cities and towns have celebrated Municipal Government Works (MGW) Month each November, to promote citizens' interest in and understanding of governments serving communities. To elevate municipal government awareness, Mayor Thompson will issue a proclamation on November 6, 2023 naming November as MGW Month. Participating in MGW Month enables municipalities to:

- Actively showcase their government/how it works.
- Foster goodwill by educating youth about the impact of local government.
- Fulfill two requirements for the MD Municipal League (MML) Banner City/Town program.
- Maximize MML membership by taking part in League programs and activities.



Collection Reminders

Residential Trash: Place residential trash in durable, leak-proof bags before placing it in containers. Close lid tightly to keep rainwater out to reduce spillage. Clean trash can regularly. Place trash can curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Mondays and Thursdays or the night before collection.

Yard Waste: Do NOT mix yard waste with household trash. Place yard waste in paper bags or in reusable bins marked as yard waste. Bundle branches and limbs with rope or string (do not use wire). Bundles must be less than 4 feet long and less than 3 inches in diameter and weigh less than 60 pounds. Place yard waste curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Mondays or the night before collection.

Recycling: As a reminder, NO PLASTIC BAGS ARE PERMITTED. Curbside recycling is provided by Prince George's County Department of the Environment. Please call 311 or 301-883-4748, if you have any questions or concerns about this service. Place recycling bins curbside by 6:00 a.m. on Wednesdays.

Bulk Trash: Collection is by appointment only on Thursdays. Schedule collection by 12:00 p.m. on Wednesdays by calling 240-604-6077 or online at www.jedatruckinginc.com/book-online. Please note that bulk trash collection is limited to three (3) items per week. Set out bulk trash scheduled for pickup by 6 a.m. on Thursday.

Leaf Collection: Residents are encouraged to bag their leaves and/or mulch them during lawn mowing. It is

extremely important to keep storm drains clear of leaves to allow the system optimal performance during a rain event. To support leaf bagging, Public Works staff has distributed ten (10) leaf bags to each single-family residence in Town. FREE leaf bags will also be available for pick up on the



third Saturday of the month (9 a.m. to 2 p.m.) at the bulk trash drop off at the Public Works building until mid-January. Identification confirming residency is required.

Report a Concern: To report a concern, call 301-927-6381 or submit a request online. The Trash Concerns app can be used to order a new trash container, report missed collections and report any other trash-related concerns. Visit www.riverdaleparkmd.gov and click on the Trash Concerns icon.

How to Prepare HVAC System for Fall

Here are some guidelines to prevent HVAC problems this fall, reduce electricity costs and help your system last longer:

- Clean and replace air filters for an easy, inexpensive way to preventatively—maintain your HVAC. When you have a dirty air filter, allergens and other pollutants get trapped, reducing the system's efficiency. Follow the suggested replacement schedule, generally every month, and definitely when seasons change.
- Clean and seal air ducts to prevent drafts and energy waste. Many homes have leaky air ducts that cause a home to not cool or get hot enough. You may want to invest in ductwork sealing.
- Clean the outdoor compressor unit to remove debris that accumulates in/around the external unit and impedes airflow. Get rid of any leaves, sticks or trash that get stuck in the grill or under the unit. You can also hose down the cover and compressor coils (after turning off the power to the unit) to remove dust, pollen and dirt.
- Change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors ideally twice a year, in spring and fall. Knowing these lifesaving detectors are working properly will give you peace of mind.

A Season for Sharing in Fire Safety

Each year fires occurring in the United States during the holiday season will claim the lives of over 400 people, injure 1,650 more, and cause over \$990 million in damage and will account for 40% of all fires during this time period of October thru January.

The Prince George's County Fire/EMS Department wishes to remind everyone that by following some of these simple life-saving steps you can ensure a safe and happy holiday season.

<u>Holiday Decorations:</u> All decorations should be nonflammable or flame-retardant and placed away from heat vents.

<u>Wrapping Paper</u>: Never Put Wrapping Paper in a Fireplace. It can result in a very large fire, throwing off dangerous sparks and embers and may result in a chimney fire.

<u>Artificial Christmas Trees:</u> If you are using a metallic or artificial tree, make sure it is flame retardant.

Candle Care: Avoid Using Lit Candles, If you do use them, make sure they are in stable holders and place them where they cannot be easily knocked down. Never leave the house with candles burning. Never Put Lit Candles on a Tree. Do not go near a Christmas tree with an open flame - candles, lighters or matches.

Holiday Lights: Maintain Your Holiday Lights Inspect holiday lights each year for frayed wires, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinking or wear before putting them up. Use only lighting listed by an approved testing laboratory.

Do Not Overload Electrical Outlets: Do not link more than three light strands, unless the directions indicate it is safe. Connect strings of lights to an extension cord before plugging the cord into the outlet. Make sure to periodically check the wires - they should not be warm to the touch. *Do Not Leave Holiday Lights on Unattended*. **Preventing Christmas Tree Fire Hazards:** Special fire safety precautions need to be taken when keeping a live tree in the house. A burning tree can rapidly fill a room with fire and deadly gases.

Selecting a Tree for the Holiday: Needles on fresh trees should be green and hard to pull back from the branches, and the needle should not break if the tree has been freshly cut. The trunk should be sticky to the touch. Old trees can be identified by bouncing the tree trunk on the ground. If many needles fall off, the tree has been cut too long, has probably dried out, and is a fire hazard.

Caring for Your Tree: Do not place your tree close to a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. The heat will dry out the tree, causing it to be more easily ignited by heat, flame or sparks. Be careful not to drop or flick cigarette ashes near a tree. Do not put your live tree up too early or leave it up for longer than two weeks. We recommend that you water the tree 3 times a day and keep the tree stand filled with water.

Disposing of Your Tree: Never put tree branches or needles in a fireplace or wood burning stove. When the tree becomes dry, discard it promptly. The best way to dispose of your tree is by taking it to a recycling center or having it hauled away by a community pick-up service.
