Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

It is now October, and locally-grown apples both sweet and tart are at the farmers' market, the leaves are turning, and the days are getting shorter at an alarming rate....

Ward 6 Council Representative

As I reported last month, Ward 6 Council Representative Alejandro Silva had to resign. The Town Council declared a vacancy in the position at the September 10th legislative meeting, and I hope to appoint a qualified Ward 6 resident at the October 1st legislative session.

Riverdale Park Day

In addition to cool weather and apples, October traditionally brings us Riverdale Park Day, a day of celebration for our Town. This year it will be on October 6th, 2018, though we will shift the date to June in 2019 in anticipation of the Town's centennial in 2020. I look forward to seeing you on October 6th, and having my once-a-year funnel cake! Please look for details about the time and location in other stories in the Town Crier, or on the town web site.

New Town Website

Town staff have been hard at work for much of the last year on upgrading our website. This involved selecting a vendor to provide hosting and a content management system, learning to use the new content management system, migrating information from the old town web site, and adding new information. In early September, it all came together and the new web site – http://www.riverdaleparkmd.gov – went live! The site has a beautiful modern look, an efficient navigation system, a fast search engine, and (a personal favorite of mine) a page where anyone can report a concern about town government. I hope that the site is a useful to all of you; I find the new format very usable and engaging! I'd also like to express my thanks for the extra effort town staff put into designing and implementing the new site – I know there were a lot of late nights!

Director, Public Projects and Services and Assistant Chief of Police

The positions of Director, Public Projects and Services (formerly Director of Public Works), and Assistant Chief of Police were nationally advertised following the retirement of staff previously serving in those positions during June. Each position has received dozens of applications, and the candidates are being carefully reviewed. I'm hopeful that both positions will be filled soon!

Purple Line Construction

I typically only get a few weeks of advance notice on Purple Line activities, so it is best to sign up for announcements directly from https://www.purplelinemd.com/construction/. That being said, construction will continue to ramp up where East-West highway crosses underneath the Baltimore Washington Parkway (the current bridge will be replaced as part of the project). Now that the bird-nesting season has ended, utility relocation and tree removal (including, sadly, along River Road) will also be ramping up. Field of Dreams

I am very happy to announce that some semblance of a schedule has been introduced in accordance with idea collection and development of the park in Ward 2 on the site of the former Field of Dreams Park. It is my belief that in the next month that the Town will be sending out some form of survey on in order to gather community input on the eventual design of the park. Please look forward to the mail and the Town's new website for further opportunities to contribute to the development of this shared space that we all can enjoy. The Town Manager has also indicated that he hopes to have a chalkboard installed at the park as another means of gathering community input on design ideas and usage of the space. In November, we will be looking to host a "Visioning Workshop" in order to bring together some of the community collaboration and further discuss design. We hope to have a landscape concept plan and narrative ready for the community by December with Town Staff hopefully reviewing a final deliverable plan by January.

Town Hall Improvements

At our September meeting, Town Manager Lestitian introduced a plan for renovations for the Town Hall and Police Department that in my view are drastically needed. If you have ever been in the space after a heavy rainfall you realize what our town staff and police department deal with on a daily basis. The plans call for a new roof and interior improvements that will greatly benefit staff, council, and the Town. I am of the belief that the quality of the town staff that we have drastically improves the functioning of Riverdale Park. In that same vein, I would argue that talent acquisition and maintaining a quality staff are amongst the Town's most important jobs. That is why this renovation is so important for the Town. It is an investment in town staff and Riverdale Park that we should support wholeheartedly. It will he drastically improve the Town's ability to host on-site meetings

while simultaneously improving the work environment of town staff that is so essential to the function of our town.

Public Works

Columbus Day Trash Collection

Trash collection <u>will not</u> be impacted by the Columbus Day holiday on Monday, October 8, 2018.

Saturday Bulk Trash Drop-Off

The fall/winter schedule for drop-off of bulk trash is: October 20, November 17 and December 15. Town residents may deliver residential bulk trash items to the Department

of Public Works from 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.

Mosquito Control Program

The Maryland Department of Agriculture's Mosquito Control Program ended on September 18, 2018. Questions or concerns about mosquitoes can be directed to the Maryland Department of Agriculture at by calling 301-422-5080.

Trash Tote Repair/Replacement

To coordinate the replacement of damaged trash totes, residents should call the Department of Public Works at 301-864-1803. The Town's contracted trash service provider will replace the damaged totes. Please note that a replacement tote will not be delivered if the damaged one is not there for pick-up. Replacements will take place on Thursdays.

Leaf Collection

Leaf collection begins in early Fall and runs through January 15, 2019.

To make the leaf collection process work as efficiently as possible, residents are encouraged to:

- Put leaves in paper bags or containers clearly marked as "Yard Waste" and place them at the curb on Wednesdays as part of regular yard waste collection.
- Be sure to remove tree limbs, rocks, and other debris from leaves to be collected.
 They can damage the equipment and cause delays.
- Do not put bagged leaves out during regular trash collection or mix them with household trash.

Police Department

One of the most common crimes reported to law enforcement is the theft of valuables from vehicles. In an ongoing effort to prevent these types of thefts, the Riverdale Park Police Department offers the following important safety tips:

Always lock your doors and roll up your

- windows when your vehicle is unattended;
- Remove personal valuables from your vehicle;
- When parking in public places, shopping centers, etc., conceal valuables or place them in the trunk;
- Park in well-lit areas;
- Install an audible alarm system and a visible anti-theft device;
- Always be aware of your surroundings and other people around you;
- Use common sense.

Theft from vehicles is a crime of opportunity, and it is preventable. Locking your vehicle with valuables in full view is not a deterrent to a thief. Help the Police Department help you by taking the necessary precautions. Don't become a victim!

Walk Safely

- 1. Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
- 2. Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices down and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- 4. Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to

- the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

Trick or Treat with an Adult

 Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

Keep Costumes Both Creative and Safe

- 1. Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- 4. When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

Drive Extra Safely on Halloween

- Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- 3. Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.
- 4. Eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- 5. Drive slowly, anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic and turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.
- 6. Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. so be especially alert for kids during those hours.


