Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

Even though the weather stayed warm through the middle of October, with November here we are feeling winter on its way. And we can already see the holiday season starting at the end of the month.

Veterans Day

The Town's annual observance of Veterans Day will be at the Veterans' Monument (in the 6300 block of Lafayette, near the MARC train station) at 11 am on November 11. These ceremonies typically last 15-20 minutes, and are a great way to show appreciation to those who served. Come honor those who served; I hope we have a big turnout this year!

Riverdale Park Station

Construction at Riverdale Park Station is moving forward! Gold's Gym came to the M-U-TC committee in early October with new sign designs, and is expecting to open early in 2018. While I haven't confirmed it, I heard that the model townhouse on Woodberry Street was sold – these properties are very much in demand!

Trolley Trail

There was quite a bit of confusion early in October when someone (we don't know who) decided to move the barricades and "open" the temporary trolley trail through Riverdale Park Station. Unfortunately, construction was not complete (there was still a section that needed paving) so the barricades had to be put back in place. I hope that the trail is open as you are reading this article, but it may be another week or two. Please respect the open/closed status of the trail for your safety and those who might follow you through the removed barricades. Please also trust that those of us in town government are working closely with the developer to open the trail as soon as we can. We want it to be open too!

Bridge Construction

I'm sad to report that the opening date for the bridge connecting the Cafritz development to Rivertech Court has been pushed into "the first quarter of 2018" for reasons I don't know (and I don't know when in the first quarter it might happen). I hope to have more information by the time the December Crier is in press. Purple Line

Construction details for the Purple Line are becoming available, but as those of you who have watched the construction of the bridge and Riverdale Park Station know, that these schedules can slip. Current estimates are that the segments of the Purple Line in Riverdale Park will start construction in Fall of 2018, with some segments (River Road and Kenilworth) completed in summer 2021, and others (East-West highway underneath the Baltimore-Washington Parkway) completed in Summer 2022.

College Park Academy

I was pleased to attend the ribbon-cutting ceremony at the College Park Academy on October 3. Despite its name, it is located in Riverdale Park off River Road, and this public charter school is implementing (in collaboration with staff from a number of departments at the University of Maryland) innovative computerbased learning techniques for middle and high school students. The school operated for several years in Hyattsville near the University of Maryland, and classes started at the new facility on Rivertech Court here in Riverdale Park in September. Admission is through a lottery process, but students from Riverdale Park (and other nearby areas) are more likely to get in than students outside the "catchment" area (the geographic area receiving preferential enrollment).

There's even more happening, but I'm out of space! Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or concerns about what's going on in town. If you leave me a voice mail message please be sure to tell me what times of day I can call back – I do a lot of my work as Mayor on weekends and evenings, and want to be sure I don't disturb you when I call back (I'll reply to e-mail at all sorts of odd hours!). Enjoy the Thanksgiving Holiday, and I'll be back here in December!

Upcoming Activities

Miscellaneous

Recently the fence to the portion of the Trolley Trail giving access to Riverdale Station was removed. Unfortunately, this portion of the Trolley Trail has not opened at this time. The temporary paving is expected to be complete by the end of October. Once that is complete a temporary path connecting the trail from College Park to Riverdale Park via Whole Foods Market will open.

Hyattsville CDC is seeking sponsorships for this year's Public Arts Initiative. The current exhibits will be removed and new exhibits will be placed in Beale Circle, Riverdale Community Park, Riverside Neighborhood Park, by the Trolley Trail (at Oliver Street) and at the corner of Madison Street, and Rhode Island Avenue. Hyattsville CDC would like to fundraise to receive support from area business owners and stakeholders so that they can obtain exhibit signs placed next to each site.

There will be a county workgroup focused on the County's capital bikeshare program. If there are any avid bikers who would be interested in providing his/her input as to this program, please contact me or the Town Manager expressing your interest.

Public Works

Saturday Drop Off

The drop-off of bulk trash is scheduled for the third Saturday of each month from 9:00 a.m. to

2:00 p.m. The next Saturday bulk trash drop-off dates are: November 18 and December 16.

Pumpkin and Straw Disposal

Residents who want to dispose of old pumpkins and straw that was used for Halloween or the harvest season, can put those items in with their recycling until November 30th.

Holiday Trash Collection

Regular trash collection, will NOT be affected by the Veteran's Day holiday on Friday, November 10th. However, regular trash will NOT be collected on Thursday, November 23, 2017, in observance of Thanksgiving. The next trash collection day will be on Monday, November 27, 2017.

Trash Toter Repair/Replacement

Residents should call the Department of Public Works (301-864-1803), for the repair or replacement of damaged trash toters, i.e., broken lids, missing wheels, cracked toters, etc. When repairs or replacements are needed, they will usually occur by Friday of each week, unless the request is made on Thursday or Friday. Those will be delivered during the following week.

Leaf Collection Reminders

To make the leaf collection process work as efficiently as possible, residents are encouraged to:

- Rake leaves to the curb. Pile leaves away from cars and storm drains.
 The leaf vacuum cannot reach around cars.
- Remove tree limbs, rocks, and other debris from leaves to be collected. They can damage the equipment and cause delays.
- Please put bagged leaves out on Wednesdays with yard waste. Be sure to use paper bags. Do not put them out with regular trash.

Town Receives Prestigious Sustainable Maryland Certified Award
