Mayor's Report

Mayor Alan K. Thompson

The air may be cooler and the nights longer, but we still have two months of hurricane season!

Flood preparedness

After watching the recent hurricanes batter Texas, Florida, and Georgia, I've been thinking a lot about the Town's readiness for storms like those that might hit us in the months and years ahead. I'll be adding this as a project to my to-do list (and hoping that the Public Safety committee will be interested), with at least a few steps clear: review the current FEMA flood maps (revised last year for at least most of the Town), possibly discuss with our congressional representatives having FEMA generate extreme event flood maps (beyond the 500-year flood maps they generate now), make sure we have plans in place to have the town running and residents safe under any of these circumstances.

Movie Night on the Riversdale Mansion Lawn

I had a great evening with my family, Council Member Faulx's family, and around a hundred other people at the recent showing of Moana on the mansion grounds in September. While there were a few technical difficulties with the show, the weather was great and everyone there seemed to be having a great time. I'd like to thank Council Member Faulx for thinking up this idea (or borrowing it from some other town) and working with staff to make it happen. I hear that there will be more movies to come, with a Halloween movie being the next one....check the calendar for details!

Ipala Teachers

I was pleased at the September Council Meeting to honor the teachers who traveled to (and taught in) our sister city, Ipala, Guatemala. At the reception before the meeting I saw a huge number of photos of the teachers (including our own Vernon Archer, former mayor!) in front of classrooms filled with smiling children in Ipala.

A few of the teachers spoke at our meeting, and said how the travel and visit would help them understand and connect with their students here in Prince George's County. It's great to hear about the fruits of this important program, and I look forward to more activities with our sister city in the months ahead.

Riverdale Park Station

Some of the new businesses in the Riverdale Park Station development are open this month! Xfinity had a grand opening on September 26th, and Mod Pizza, Gold's Gym, and District Taco seem on track for opening either this month or in November. I haven't heard a date, but Burton's Restaurant is being built, too! I'm looking forward to having some great new shopping opportunities in town!

The temporary trolley trail through the development was originally scheduled to be open by now, but the active construction zone has prevented that, in consideration for the safety of the trail's users. As I said in July and September, the latest reports are that a *temporary* trail will open in late summer, with the permanent trail installed when interfering construction is complete. I am working with our partners in both the M-NCPPC and the county to open it as quickly as possible, and am really looking forward to using it myself. The opening, at this point, depends on construction being complete for the town homes and businesses on the north side of the site (and it looks like they're getting close!).

Bridge Construction

Construction of the bridge connecting the Cafritz development to Rivertech Court is now well underway, although the completion date has slipped into the fourth quarter of 2017. The girders and decks for the main span are in place already, and the predicted construction completion is early in November. The opening date (probably a few weeks later) will be determined by the county. Readers of the TownAnnounce mailing list receive weekly updates on the status of the entire Cafritz

Purple Line

At the September meeting the Council acted on naming the Purple Line stations in town, recommending “Riverdale Park North – UMD” for the station at the corner of River Road and Haig Court, and “Riverdale Park – Kenilworth” for the station at the intersection of East-West Highway and Kenilworth Avenue. We do not have final say in these decisions, but wanted to be sure that everyone riding the Purple Line knows what town they're in!

We also made recommendations on which proposed art work we thought would work best at both stations. While the recommendations were complicated (we thought the proposals could improve with minor changes, and we gave second choices for one of the stations) we recommended the project labeled “Artist 3” for the Riverdale Park – Kenilworth” station (look at <http://purplelinemd.com/artintransit/riverdale-park-station/>). For the “Riverdale Park North – UMD” station we recommended the project labeled “Artist 4” at <http://purplelinemd.com/artintransit/m-square-station/>

Leaking Trash Trucks

I discussed leaking trash trucks in my September report, and I'm happy to report that Bates Trucking (the company that picks up our trash) seems to be doing better (though we haven't gotten to perfection yet). Please help them out by keeping water and other fluids out of your trash cans, as required by the town code. Some of the recent spillages were caused purely by trash cans with putrid water in the bottom (Bates responded to the reports and cleaned up the mess, but did report the cause of the problem to the town).

Discovery District Working Group

On September 7 Town Manager Lestitian and I met with College Park Mayor Patrick Wojahn,

County Council Member Dannielle Glaros, Carlo Collella from the University of Maryland, College Park, and about *twenty* other stakeholders in the Discovery District (formerly known as “M Square”) to create a working group to coordinate activities in the District. We will meet again in a few months to discuss how to communicate activities to people who work or live in (or near) the Discovery District (which has pretty flexible borders).

There's even more than this going on, so please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or concerns about what's going on in town. If you leave me a voice mail message please be sure to tell me what times of day I can call back – I do a lot of my work as Mayor on weekends and evenings, and want to be sure I don't disturb you when I call back (I'll reply to e-mail at all sorts of odd hours!). Enjoy the beautiful October weather (and fresh apples) this month, and I'll be back in November!

Trash Toters – IMPORTANT NOTICES

- **Repair/Replacement** – Residents should call the Department of Public Works at 301-864-1803 for the repair or replacement of damaged trash toters, i.e., broken lids, missing wheels, cracked toters, etc. When repairs or replacements are needed, a list will be provided to Bates Trucking each Friday, with the expectation for deliveries to occur during the following week.
- **Maintenance of your toter** – Residents are responsible for maintaining the cleanliness of their toter. Regular cleaning of the interior of the toter is necessary for health reasons, both for the resident and the collectors of your trash. Leaving trash or garbage in the bottom of the toter invites vermin and promotes disease. Your collectors are not responsible for the interior cleanliness of your container. Please respect your collectors by keeping your toters clean.

Recycling – All recycling issues are handled by Prince George's County. All questions, reports of missed collections, or requests for recycling toters should be reported directly to them by dialing 311 or 301-952-7630.

Yard Waste - Yard waste includes branches, shrubs and trees and is collected on Wednesdays. Grass clippings, small tree branches or shrubs must be in paper bags or in a container clearly marked YARD WASTE. All items *should be at curbside no later than 7:00 a.m. on Wednesdays*. To assure that your items will be collected, bundle branches and tie with rope or string (do not use wire). Items must be less than 4 feet long, not more than 4 inches in diameter and weigh less than 60 pounds. These items are collected by Bates Trash and Trucking Company.

Fall Tree Planting - We are entering our fall tree planting season. Residents who wish to have a tree planted in of front or near their property are asked to contact the Department of Public Works at 301-864-1803. Requests must be received by October 16, 2017.
